**ORDER SETTING PER LINE KUSF SUPPORT AVAILABLE TO COMPETITIVE
ELIGIBLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIERS IN RURAL LOCAL EXCHANGE
CARRIER STUDY AREAS**

NOW, the above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission") for consideration and decision. Having reviewed its files and records and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings:

1. On July 9, 2002, in Docket No. 02-GIMT-161-GIT, the Commission issued an Order directing Commission Staff ("Staff") to calculate and file by April 1st every year thereafter the Kansas Universal Service Fund support available to a competitive Eligible Telecommunications Carrier ("ETC") operating in a rural local exchange carrier's ("RLEC's") study area.

2. On March 7, 2007, in Docket No. 06-GIMT-1289-GIT, the Commission issued an Order reaffirming that a competitive ETC will receive KUSF support on a per-line basis for each eligible line served in an RLEC study area. The Commission stated that the per-line KUSF support will be calculated by dividing the total annual KUSF support payable to an RLEC by that

RLEC's total KUSF support-eligible lines as of September 30 of each year. Determination of the per-line KUSF support in RLEC study areas recognizes the following exceptions:

- Prior to January 1, 2013, the KUSF support available in Gorham's Waldo and Gorham exchanges was based on historical, embedded costs and the KUSF support for the Luray and Paradise exchanges was based on the KUSF high-cost model. Effective January 1, 2013, KUSF support in all of Gorham's exchanges is based on the Company's revenue requirement;
- the per-line KUSF support available for lines in exchanges that Rural Telephone Service Company, Inc. ("Rural") purchased from the United Telephone Companies of Kansas d/b/a CenturyLink ("CenturyLink") is based on the KUSF high-cost model; and
- the per-line KUSF support available in the study areas of JBN Telephone Company, Inc. ("JBN"), Madison Telephone, LLC ("Madison"), and Pioneer Communications ("Pioneer") is targeted, or disaggregated, to high cost exchanges and zones, pursuant to plans filed by each company in Docket No. 02-RTCT-366-MIS.

3. In Docket No. 13-GIMT-004-GIT, the Commission determined that due to a timing issue with the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC's") intercarrier compensation reforms, RLECs would adjust their intrastate access rates on July 1, 2013; rather than March 1, 2013. Because intrastate access rate adjustments correspond to a change in KUSF support, the per-line KUSF support amount in certain RLEC study areas will change on July 1, 2013.

4. Commission Staff ("Staff") submitted a Report and Recommendation with Attachment I on March 11, 2013, attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference. Based on the July 1, 2013, access rate adjustments and per-line exceptions stated above, Staff calculated the monthly and annual per-line KUSF support amounts available for competitive ETCs operating in RLEC study areas for the periods of March 1, 2013 to June 30, 2013; and July 1,

2013 to February 28, 2014. These amounts are reflected in Attachment I. Attachment I contains the following information:

- a. Page 1 shows the per line KUSF support, effective March 1, 2013, and July 1, 2013, that is available in each RLEC's study area. The per line KUSF support available since March 1, 2011 is also reflected in page 1;
- b. Page 2 contains the KUSF support available for each eligible line in an exchange that Rural purchased from CenturyLink;
- c. Page 3 lists the disaggregated per line KUSF support, by exchange and zone, for eligible lines in JBN, Madison, and Pioneer's study areas, effective March 1, 2013 and July 1, 2013.

5. Staff noted in the Report and Recommendation that an RLEC's support may change during the year as a result of a company-specific audit. Furthermore, the Commission has not yet determined whether an RLEC should be allowed to recover any reduction in its intrastate terminating access revenues from the KUSF. If an RLEC's KUSF support is adjusted, the respective per-line KUSF support will also be adjusted prior to payment to an ETC.

6. Staff recommends that the Commission adopt the monthly and annual KUSF per-line support contained in Attachment I, effective March 1, 2013 and July 1, 2013. Staff further recommends that Attachment I be placed on the Commission's website to ensure the information is readily available to competitive ETCs.

7. The Commission finds Staff's findings and recommendations to be reasonable and hereby adopts the same.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. The monthly and annual per-line KUSF support amounts available to competitive ETCs operating in RLEC study areas as listed in Attachment I for the time periods of March 1, 2013 to June 30, 2013; and July 1, 2013 to February 28, 2014; are approved. These amounts are subject to change depending on subsequent Commission action.

B. Attachment I shall be placed on the Commission's website.





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Pursuant to Commission Orders, Staff calculated the monthly and annual Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) support available to competitive Eligible Telecommunications Carriers (ETC) operating in rural local exchange carrier (LEC) study areas. The per line KUSF support amounts, effective March 1, 2013, are contained in Attachment I. Effective July 1, 2013, the KUSF support for the rural LECs will be adjusted to reflect changes in their intrastate originating access rates and revenues.¹ Staff, therefore, has also included the per line KUSF support, effective July 1, 2013, in Attachment I.

Staff recommends that the Commission adopt the March 1 and July 1, 2013, KUSF per line support amounts shown in Attachment I. Staff further recommends that Attachment I be placed on the Commission's website to ensure this KUSF information is readily available to competitive ETCs.

BACKGROUND:

On July 9, 2002, the Commission issued an Order in Docket No. 02-GIMT-161-GIT and directed Staff to calculate the KUSF support available to a competitive ETC operating in a rural LEC's study area.² Staff was directed to file this information no later than April 1st of each year.³

In a March 7, 2007, Order in Docket No. 06-GIMT-1289-GIT, the Commission reaffirmed that a competitive ETC will receive KUSF support on a per-line basis for each eligible line served in a rural LEC study area.⁴ The Commission stated that the per line KUSF support will be calculated by dividing the total annual KUSF support payable to a rural LEC by that rural LEC's total KUSF support-eligible lines as of September 30 of each year. Determination of the per-line KUSF support in rural LEC areas recognizes the following exceptions:

- Prior to January 1, 2013, the KUSF support available in Gorham's Waldo and Gorham exchanges was based on historical, embedded costs and the KUSF support for the Luray and Paradise exchanges was based on the KUSF high-cost model. Effective January 1, 2013, KUSF support in all of Gorham's exchanges is based on the Company's revenue requirement.⁵
- the per line KUSF support available for lines in exchanges that Rural Telephone Service Company, Inc. (Rural) purchased from the United Telephone Companies of Kansas d/b/a CenturyLink (CenturyLink)⁶ is based on the KUSF high-cost model; and
- the per line KUSF support available in the study areas of JBN Telephone Company, Inc. (JBN), Madison Telephone, LLC (Madison), and Pioneer Communications (Pioneer) is

targeted, or disaggregated, to high cost exchanges and zones, pursuant to plans filed by each company in Docket No. 02-RTCT-366-MIS.⁷

The Commission, in Docket 13-004, addressed the requirement in K.S.A. 66-2005(c) that the rural LECs are to adjust their intrastate access rates to parity with interstate access rates in odd-numbered years, effective March 1st. Due to the Federal Communications Commission's intercarrier compensation reforms, the Commission determined that the rural LECs would adjust their intrastate access rates on July 1, 2013;⁸ not March 1st. The Commission further determined that due to the FCC's reforms of intrastate terminating access rates, it would address the recovery of lost intrastate terminating access revenue from the KUSF in Docket 12-GIMT-170-GIT. With regard to intrastate originating access revenue changes, the Commission determined that a rural LEC's KUSF support would be adjusted to reflect the related intrastate originating access revenue change. With the exception of Pioneer Communications, the rural LECs that receive KUSF support will experience an increase in intrastate originating revenues and a corresponding reduction in their KUSF support.

ANALYSIS:

Based on the Orders discussed above, the March 1, 2013, and July 1, 2013, KUSF support available for an eligible line served by a competitive ETC in a rural LEC's study area was determined on a monthly and annual basis, as reflected in Attachment I. This Attachment consists of four pages:

1. Page 1 shows the per line KUSF support, effective March 1 and July 1, 2013, that is available in each rural LEC's study area. The per line KUSF support available since March 1, 2011, is also reflected in page 1;
2. Page 2 contains the KUSF support available for each eligible line in an exchange that Rural purchased from CenturyLink;
3. Page 3 lists the disaggregated per line KUSF support, by exchange and zone, for eligible lines in JBN, Madison, and Pioneer's study areas, effective March 1, 2013 and effective July 1, 2013.

A rural LEC's KUSF support may change during the year as a result of a company-specific audit. Furthermore, the Commission has not yet determined whether a rural LEC should be allowed to recover any reduction in its intrastate terminating access revenue from the KUSF. If a rural LEC's KUSF support is adjusted, the respective per line KUSF support will also be adjusted prior to payment to an ETC.
