### IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATIONS OF WESTAR ENERGY, INC. AND KANSAS GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY FOR APPROVAL TO MAKE CERTAIN CHANGES IN THEIR CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC SERVICE

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2	Q:	PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS?
3	A:	John Garretson, 3906 N.W. 16th Street, Topeka, KS 66618
4	Q:	BY WHOM AND IN WHAT CAPACITY ARE YOU EMPLOYED?
5	A:	The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union No. 304 ("Union" or
6		"IBEW Local 304"), Business Manager/Financial Secretary.
7	Q:	PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR BUSINESS EXPERIENCE?
8	A:	I am currently the Business Manager and Financial Secretary for IBEW Local 304. I have
9		been the Business Manager and Financial Secretary since 2014. Prior to being elected as
10		Business Manager and Financial Secretary, I served 11 years as the East End Assistant
11		Business Manager. In that capacity I have been involved in negotiations of successive
12		contracts with Westar Energy. Before becoming the East End Assistant Business Manager, I
13		was on the Executive Board and served as a steward and chief steward for the Union while

employed with Kansas Gas Service as a Journeyman Gas Worker from March 1982 to April
 2004.

# 3 Q: HAVE YOU TESTIFIED BEFORE THIS OR OTHER REGULATORY BODIES 4 IN THE PAST?

A: I have personally provided testimony before this Commission in Docket No. 15-WSEE-115RTS and 16-KCPE-593-ACQ. Additionally, the Union has provided testimony in the past

7 in 03-MDWE-421-ACQ; 06-MKEE-524-ACQ, and 12-WSEE-112-RS.

#### 8 Q: WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY?

9 A: The purpose of my testimony is to convey labor's support for the grid resiliency projects

10 discussed in the Stipulation and Agreement accepted by the Commission in the 115 docket

11 as well as support the rate structure requested by the applicants. Demand rates encourage

12 energy efficiencies and support a balanced generation portfolio. Utility grade solar is best for

13 generation needs for all customers and demand rate supports individual solar while

14 maintaining grid reliability and providing for associated maintenance. The positives of this

15 application have been demonstrated at a national level where we have seen customer savings

16 with the demand rate structure.

17 Q: WHY IS THE UNION'S POSITION SIGNIFICANT IN THIS CASE?

18 A: Generally, when IBEW 304 intervenes in rate cases, it remains neutral with regard to the
application. However, in this case, we are in support of the application for the reasons
20 outlined above.

# Q: WHY IS THE "ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION GRID RESILIENCY" OR "EDGR" PROGRAM IMPORTANT TO IBEW 304?

A: The EDGR program is important because it was designed to address issues related to aging
 infrastructure, to improve the reliability of service to customers, and shorten recovery time

1		when outages inevitably occur. This is important because as aging infrastructure is replaced
2		and upgraded, it becomes safer for the employees and more reliable for the customer.
3		Outages inevitably occur and safety concerns will always exist in this environment.
4		However, having updated systems helps to ensure a safer environment for the employees
5		when they perform work and maintenance on such equipment. We have already begun to
6		see reductions in equipment failures in the field which we believe is attributable to this
7		program.
8	Q:	DO YOU HAVE ANY CONCLUDING COMMENTS?

9 A: Yes. Like I mentioned above, our position in this case is unique in that we are supporting
10 the application as opposed to remaining neutral. We are especially supportive of the EGDR
11 program and believe this program will continue to bring greater results the longer it goes on.
12 Updating aging infrastructure benefits everyone from the customers, to the company and its
13 employees who perform work on that infrastructure. While there will always be safety
14 concerns while performing work in the utility industry, having newer equipment less
15 susceptible to failure means less outages.


