This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on July 13, 2016, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Wade Patterson. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

#### IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$350 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

#### IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-542.

## **IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:**

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

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## **PENALTY ORDER**

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

#### I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

#### II. BACKGROUND

- 4. James T. Newell, Jr., d/b/a Jim Newell Trucking (Jim Newell Trucking) obtained private and common operating authority from the Commission on June 15, 2015, and operates under KSMCID number 157951 and USDOT number 348566. The carrier owns one truck and one trailer and employs one CDL driver.
- James Newell attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on June 9, 2015, on behalf of Jim Newell Trucking.
- 6. Jim Newell Trucking is a private and common motor carrier which primarily hauls grain, feed, hay, farm supplies, construction and scrap metal.

#### III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on July 13, 2016, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Wade Patterson conducted a compliance review of the operations of Jim Newell Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Patterson identified two (2) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On April 21, 2016, Jim Newell Trucking required or permitted its driver, James T. Newell, Jr., to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Kenworth tractor, VIN ending in 847487, GVWR 48,000

lbs., with a 2016 Mac End dump trailer, VIN ending in 34007, GVWR 50,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Mercer, Missouri to Louisburg, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated April 21, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Jim Newell Trucking failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a)(c)(1), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, driver James T. Newell, Jr. failed to take at least a 30 minute break after driving for eight hours. *See* Driver's Daily Log, Attachment "B". Jim Newell Trucking's failure to provide "rest breaks" to its driver if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeper-berth period of at least 30 minutes is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and as implemented by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

#### IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Jim Newell Trucking committed two (2) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers,

including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$350 for two (2) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that Jim Newell Trucking be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety\_meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that Jim Newell Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

## V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Jim Newell Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Jim Newell Trucking committed two (2) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

#### THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. James T. Newell, Jr., d/b/a Jim Newell Trucking, of Baldwin City, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$350 civil penalty for two (2) violations of Kansas law governing the

regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

- B. Jim Newell Trucking is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, Jim Newell Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Jim Newell Trucking's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$350 civil penalty against Jim Newell Trucking, and ordering Jim Newell Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.
- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or

less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.

F. Failure to pay the \$350 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Jim Newell Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

- Contact industry associations to get resources and ideas on safety improvement practices from other carriers in the industry.


