ORDER ADOPTING STAFF'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION, OPENING DOCKET, AND SUSPENDING INTRASTATE MOTOR CARRIER OPERATIONS

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and determination. Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION AND BACKGROUND

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,111, 66-1,112g and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F. R 390.5 and as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority, and jurisdiction. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,142b the Commission is granted the authority to prescribe reasonable rules and regulations for the assessment of administrative civil penalties and sanctions for violations of any statute, commission orders or rules and regulations adopted by the commission.

- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130, and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke, or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision, or regulation of the Commission.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129(a)(7), the Commission has adopted motor carrier transportation regulations (K.A.R. 82-4-3f) consistent with the federal motor carrier safety assistance program and other federal requirements concerning transportation of hazardous waste.

II. FINDINGS OF FACTS

- 4. On September 16, 2021, Carrier was issued a penalty assessment of \$300 (Penalty Order) for failing to pay its 2020 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees in docket 22-TRAM-122-PEN.¹
- 5. On November 30, 2021, Commission Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R) regarding Adrian Jones d/b/a A Jones Construction's (Carrier's) failure to comply with the Penalty Order. As part of the R&R, Staff recommended the Commission open a new docket concerning the Carrier's failure to comply with the Penalty Order. Staff further recommends the Commission issue an order suspending Carrier's intrastate motor carrier operating authority. A copy of the R&R is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and incorporated herein by reference.
- 6. As noted in the R&R, Adrian Jones d/b/a A Jones Construction of Kansas City, Kansas (Carrier) is a motor carrier, as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5 and as adopted by

- K.A.R. 82-4-3f, which operates commercial motor vehicle(s) in interstate commerce and operates under USDOT Number 3223603.
- 7. According to Staff's R&R, Carrier was issued a penalty assessment of \$300 for failing to pay its 2020 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees in docket 22-TRAM-122-PEN.²
- 8. Litigation Counsel for Staff mailed a collection letter dated November 4, 2021, notifying Carrier of its unpaid fine and lack of compliance with the above-referenced Penalty Order, giving the Carrier ten (10) days from the date of the collection letter to pay the penalty amount. To date, Commission records indicate Carrier has not complied with requirements of the Penalty Order in that Carrier had thirty (30) days from the date of service to pay the fine of \$300 as well as its 2020 UCR fees, and Transportation Division records indicate the fine and 2020 UCR fees remain unpaid.
- 9. The Commission reviewed Staff's Report and Recommendation submitted in this matter. The Commission adopts the recommendations contained within Staff's R&R and incorporates the aforementioned into this Order by reference. The Commission concludes a new docket should be opened to place the Carrier out-of-service due to its failure to comply with the Commission's Penalty Order.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

10. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Carrier pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b as it is a motor carrier, as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5 and as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.

- 11. The Commission finds a new docket should be opened to place the Carrier out-of-service.
- 12. The Commission finds Carrier received sufficient notice of the Commission's Penalty Order and the requirement to pay the fine within 30 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order.
- 13. The Commission finds Carrier's failure to comply with the requirements of the Penalty Order is intentional and therefore this Commission finds the Carrier should be suspended from all intrastate motor carrier operations other than such motor carrier operations excepted from the Commission's regulation under K.S.A. 66-1,129, until such time as the carrier takes the necessary steps to become compliant.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. The Commission adopts Staff's Report and Recommendation, submitted on November 30, 2021, and included hereto as Attachment "A".
- B. Adrian Jones d/b/a A Jones Construction of Kansas City, Kansas is immediately suspended from all intrastate commercial motor carrier operations other than such motor carrier operations excepted from the Commission's regulation under K.S.A. 66-1,129, until such time as Carrier pays the penalty amount of \$300 and brings its motor carrier operation into compliance with motor carrier safety statutes, rules and regulations by paying its 2020 UCR fees by calling Transportation Staff at 785-271-3145. This Suspension of Intrastate Motor Carrier Operations Order may also attach and apply to the operations of successor entities, including any motor carrier entity or entities established or used to avoid the consequences of any Order to cease operations or suspending operating authority.

C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a

hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific

grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Executive Director, at 1500 S.W.

Arrowhead Road Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of

service of this Order. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, hearings will be held within ten (10)

days upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of

Carrier's right to a hearing, and this Order will become a Final Order.

Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission D.

proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties of \$500

or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.

K.S.A. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

E. Failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in further

sanctions to include, but not limited to, the assessment of civil penalties and/or the

impoundment of commercial motor vehicles found operating in violation of this Order and

any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Adrian Jones d/b/a A Jones Construction (Carrier) is a motor carrier that has self-declared to be an interstate motor carrier on its USDOT profile. Carrier was issued a penalty assessment of \$300 for failure to pay its 2020 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees in docket 22-TRAM-122-PEN (Penalty Order). The Carrier had thirty days after the issuance of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty fine of \$300 as well as the Carrier's 2020 UCR fees. Carrier was mailed a collection letter dated November 4, 2021, notifying Carrier of the unpaid fine and lack of compliance with the penalty order. To date, Staff records indicate Carrier has not paid the fine of \$300 as well as its 2020 UCR fees. Staff recommends a new docket be opened, and an order be issued suspending the Carrier's intrastate motor carrier operating authority for failure to comply with the Penalty Order in 22-TRAM-122-PEN.

BACKGROUND:

Adrian Jones d/b/a A Jones Construction (Carrier) is registered as a motor carrier with the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and operates under USDOT number 3223603. On September 16, 2021, the Commission issued Carrier a Penalty Order that assessed a civil penalty of \$300 for failure to pay the Unified Commercial Registration (UCR) fees for 2020 in docket 22-TRAM-122-PEN. A copy of the Penalty Order is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. Carrier was required to pay the civil penalty and its 2020 UCR fees within 30 days of the issuance of the Penalty Order.

Further, Carrier was sent a collection letter on November 4, 2021, reminding it of the amount due and giving it 10 days from the date of the collection letter to pay. A copy of the collection letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

To date, Commission records indicate that Carrier has not paid complied with the collection letter or the requirements of the Penalty Order.

Therefore, Staff recommends the Commission open a new docket to address the Carrier's failure to comply with the requirements of the Penalty Order, and issue an order suspending Carrier's intrastate motor carrier operation until such time as Carrier pays the penalty of \$300 as well as its 2020 and 2021 UCR fees, at which time Staff will recommend the Commission enter an order of reinstatement of intrastate motor carrier operations.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission open a new docket to address the Carrier's failure to comply with the requirements of the Penalty Order issued in docket 22-TRAM-122-PEN.

Additionally, Staff recommends the Commission issue an order suspending the Carrier's intrastate motor carrier operations until such time as Carrier pays the penalty of \$300 as well as it 2020 UCR fees, at which time Staff will recommend the Commission enter an order of reinstatement of intrastate motor carrier operations.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Carrier must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and must mail a service copy of the request to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or failure to comply with the terms of the Order or, in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the attached Penalty Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions including suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

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PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

- 3. Pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 14504a, the Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Act is a federally mandated commercial motor vehicle registration program administered by individual States for motor carriers self-designating their operations as interstate commerce. Kansas administers the UCR Act pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,139 which requires motor carriers to "register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes." 49 U.S.C. § 14504a(i)(4) expressly authorizes States the ability to issue citations and impose reasonable fines and penalties "pursuant to the applicable laws and regulations of the State on any motor carrier, motor private carrier, freight forwarder, broker, or leasing company for failure to ...pay the fees required."
- 4. UCR fees are set annually by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). The Commission enforces this registration requirement as outlined in the Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix (Penalty Matrix), reviewed each year by July 1 and subsequently approved by the Commission. The Penalty Matrix establishes the structure of penalties for failure to pay the required UCR fees.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 5. On September 3, 2021, Staff submitted a Report and Recommendation (R&R) regarding Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction's (Carrier's) failure to pay its 2020 UCR fees. As part of the R&R, Staff recommended the Commission assess Carrier a penalty in the amount of \$300, to be paid through the Carrier's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) account, and require Carrier to pay its outstanding UCR fees for 2020 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov. A copy of the R&R is attached hereto as **Attachment "A"** and incorporated herein by reference.
- 1. As noted in the R&R, Carrier has operating authority under United States

 Department of Transportation (USDOT) number 3223603. According to Carrier's USDOT

profile, it designates itself as an interstate carrier, with its base as State as Kansas. Carrier owns 1 self-propelled vehicle(s) that meet the definition of the type of vehicle for which Carrier is required to pay annual UCR fees.²

- 2. According to Staff's R&R, multiple attempts were made to contact Carrier regarding its 2020 UCR fees. The National Registration System (NRS), which is maintained by the UCR Board, sent solicitation notices every 15 days beginning February 18, 2020. Additionally, on July 28, 2020, a letter was sent to Carrier through its KTRAN account.³
- 3. Litigation Counsel for Staff mailed a letter dated August 9, 2020, to Carrier informing it that it needed to pay its 2020 UCR fees within ten days. Staff advised in the letter that nonpayment of UCR fees could result in civil assessments, with a penalty of \$300 for each instance of non-compliance.⁴ To date, Commission records indicate that the Carrier has not paid its 2020 UCR fees.
- 4. Based on Carrier's failure to register its commercial motor vehicle(s) for registration year 2020 and pay the appropriate UCR fees as established in 49 C.F.R. 367, there is sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the Carrier is in violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 in conjunction with K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and that a fine in the amount of \$300 is warranted. Additionally, Carrier is still obligated to pay its 2020 UCR fees through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 5. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Carrier pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5, as adopted by K.A. R. 82-4-3f.
- 6. The Commission finds Carrier committed one violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the 2020 UCR fees outlined in 49 C.F.R. Part 367.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction of Shawnee Kansas is hereby assessed a \$300 civil penalty for one violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the 2020 UCR fees outlined in 49 C.F.R. Part 367.
- B. Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction shall pay its outstanding 2020 UCR fees through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Carrier's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

D. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances

in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties

less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁵

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$300 as well as

payment of the 2020 UCR fees is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order.

Payment of \$300 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation

Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have a KTRAN

account to pay the penalty through KTRAN. Payment of the 2020 UCR fees may be made through

the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

F. Failure to pay the \$300 civil penalty and the outstanding 2020 UCR fees within

thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, 6 may result in suspension of

Carrier's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission

may impose further sanctions to include, but not be limited to, additional monetary sanctions, the

issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other

remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

Motor Carrier Penalty Order for Failure to Pay 2020 UCR Fees

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction (Carrier) is a carrier that has self-declared to be an interstate motor carrier on its USDOT profile. Interstate motor carriers are required to pay annual Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. Staff has attempted, without success, to contact Carrier regarding its 2020 UCR fees. The National Registration System (NRS), which is maintained by the UCR Board, sent solicitation notices every 15 days beginning February 18, 2020 to any unregistered motor carriers. Also, a letter was mailed to the Carrier on August 9, 2021 by Litigation Counsel for Staff. To date, Carrier's profile lists its UCR fees for 2020 as unpaid. Staff recommends Carrier be assessed a penalty for failure to complete its federal registration as required by K.S.A. 66-1,139, as outlined in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. Additionally Staff recommends the Carrier be required to pay the unpaid 2020 UCR fees.

BACKGROUND:

Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction operates under USDOT number 3223603, domiciled in Kansas at 10304 W 62nd St Apt C8, Shawnee, Kansas. Staff Special Investigator (SI) Verna Jackson has been tasked with ensuring Kansas motor carriers conducting interstate operations have properly paid their UCR fees for the calendar year 2020. Based on SI Jackson's review of Carrier's USDOT profile, ADRIAN JONES is self-declared to be conducting interstate operations. On its most recent USDOT Profile update, the carrier lists 1 vehicle(s). However, its UCR fees for 2020 remain unpaid. A copy of the Carrier's most recent USDOT Profile update is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

A letter was sent to Carrier through its KTRAN account on July 28, 2020. A copy of this letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 2. A letter mailed on August 9, 2021, was sent by Litigation Counsel for Staff also reminding Carrier that its 2020 UCR fees were outstanding, and warning

that nonpayment would result in the issuance of a penalty order. A copy of this letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

Therefore, Staff recommends Carrier be assessed a civil penalty for failure to pay 2020 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as required. This is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to "register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes," namely 49 USC 14504a. Additionally, Staff requests the Commission require the Carrier to pay its UCR fees for 2020 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

K.S.A. 66-1,139 requires "all interstate regulated public motor carriers of property, of household goods, or of passengers who operate a motor vehicle in Kansas shall register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes" unless otherwise exempted. The UCR Act, pursuant to 49 USC 14504a, establishes the registration requirements for motor carriers operating in interstate commerce.

The UCR Act is a federally mandated commercial motor vehicle registration program administered by individual states for motor carriers self-designating their operations as interstate or are discovered to be operating in interstate commerce through roadside inspections or an accident. UCR funds are used by states for administration of the UCR program and enforcement of motor carrier safety programs.

UCR fees are collected from all motor carriers or other entities required to obtain an Interstate USDOT number and/or is required to register with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There are six fee categories and the registration fees are based on the number of commercial motor vehicles operated in interstate commerce.

Kansas based motor carriers can register UCR by logging into the NRS portal at www.ucr.gov and paying the UCR fees.

For the purposes of determining UCR fees, a Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) is defined as: a self-propelled vehicle used on the highways in commerce principally to transport passengers or cargo (as defined under 49 U.S.C. Section 31101), if the vehicle:

- (1) Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating or gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater;
- (2) Is designed to transport more than 10 passengers including the driver; or
- (3) Is used in transporting material found by the Secretary of Transportation to be hazardous under 49 U.S.C. Section 5103 and transported in a quantity requiring placarding under regulations prescribed by the Secretary.

The operation of certain non-CMV vehicles still qualify it for UCR fees, but at the lowest UCR fee bracket. For example, for lightweight passenger vehicles that do not meet the above definition of CMV (I less than 10 passengers including the driver), the fleet size for the UCR purposes would be zero and the carrier would register and pay the lowest fee bracket.

In 2021, the UCR fee schedule was established in 49 C.F.R. 367.60 as follows:

The UCR Agreement applies to the following types of interstate operations of passenger and property:

- (1) Motor carrier;
- (2) Motor private carrier of property;
- (3) Freight forwarder;
- (4) Broker;
- (5) Leasing company; and
- (6) CMV registered with IRP plates cannot be excluded from the UCR vehicle count.

UCR Exempt Operations include:

- (1) Wholly intrastate CMV; and
- (2) Private Motor Carriers of Passengers.

If a carrier designates itself as an interstate carrier on its USDOT profile and fails to pay UCR fees within the calendar year that such fees apply, it is in violation of the UCR Agreement as enforced by the state of Kansas and subject to the appropriate fine based on the number of vehicles that should have been registered. Here, Carrier designated itself as an interstate carrier, with 1 vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce.

Each year, the Commission approves a Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, which establishes the fee schedule used by Staff for penalties. With regard to violations of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the fees outlined in 49 CFR 367, the matrix establishes the following fee schedule for standard violations:

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends a penalty of \$300 be assessed against Adrian Jones d/b/a A. Jones Construction in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. This penalty is based on the carrier's USDOT profile, which lists the carrier as an interstate motor carrier. As discussed above, numerous attempts were made to contact the motor carrier and notify it of its obligation to pay the UCR fee. To date the 2020 UCR fee remains unpaid. This is a violation K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to comply with the UCR Act, 49 U.S.C. 14504a, by not paying the applicable UCR fees outlines in 49 C.F.R. 367.

Additionally, Staff requests the Commission require the Carrier to pay its outstanding UCR fees for 2020 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

I am an attorney with the Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC) writing to you regarding your unpaid 2020 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. The KCC is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers - as defined in the Kansas statutes - doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and may do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

Our records indicate your UCR fees for 2020 have not been paid. Payment of this fee is required by Federal and State Regulations for Carriers that transport in commerce between two states (interstate commerce). Farms, ranches, custom harvesters, tow trucks, construction and passenger carriers are **not** exempt from this requirement. Possession of an active USDOT number necessitates your compliance with these regulations. Based on your USDOT profile, you are listed as an active, interstate carrier. Operating a commercial motor vehicle in interstate commerce prior to paying UCR fees is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 367 and K.A.R. 82-4-30a. Payment of your 2020 UCR fees may be made at www.ucr.gov. Nonpayment of UCR fees within fifteen days of the date of this letter will result in Civil Assessments and a Commission-issued Penalty Order, with a penalty of \$300 for each instance of non-compliance.

Our Staff has made attempts to notify you regarding your unpaid 2020 UCR fees. Deliberate avoidance of registering your applicable vehicles for UCR is a violation of the above-stated law and authority.

If you are no longer an active carrier, a written notice must be provided indicating your desire for the inactivation of your USDOT number and the reason for the inactivation request.
