A:	I am employed part time by Utah Oil to pe	erform ce	rtain record keeping and office work. As
	it pertains to this Docket, I am responsible	for filing	g the U3C's for Utah Oil.
Q:	PLEASE DESCRIBE IN DETAIL YOUR INVOLVEMENT IN THE U3C FILINGS AT		
	ISSUES IN THIS DOCKET?		
A:	In recent years I have been responsible for	filing the	e U3C form for Utah Oil. Prior to seeing
	the testimony given in this Docket I mista	kenly bel	ieved that U3C forms needed to be filed
	before the end of March each year. But no	netheless	, on Saturday March 30, 2024 my father
	Brad Leach called to tell me he had received	d the Mar	ch 28, 2024 Notice of Violation ("NOV")
	indicating that the U3C form had not been	filed and	needed to be filed before April 11, 2024
	in order to avoid a penalty. I apologized to	him and	told him I would drop what I was doing
	and complete the filing immediately. As h	e and I sp	ooke we decided that no one at the KCC
	would receive the filing until Monday Apr	il 1, 2024	anyway, so I could wait until Monday to
	complete the filing rather than doing it over	er the wee	ekend.

On Monday April 1, 2024 after getting off work at my full time job I completed the

U3C form and successfully uploaded it into KOLAR. The screen showed me the date that the U3C form had been created and that there were no errors. Upon seeing this I believed the form was successfully submitted and awaiting review and approval by KCC staff. Later the same evening on April 1, 2024 my father Brad Leach called me to make sure the U3C form had been filed. I told him it had been filed and was in the KCC's hands for review and approval. My father told me he was going to call the KCC to verify that everything was submitted correctly just to be sure. I reminded him that he had done the same thing the year before and that staff told him the form was submitted and staff needed to process it on their end so we should disregard the NOV. My father remembered what had transpired the year before and decided it was unnecessary to call and verify the filing was received. I had absolutely no doubt that what I was telling him was correct and that the form was fully completed and submitted well before the deadline set forth in the NOV.

On May 1, 2024, my father learned that the penalty order in this Docket was going to be issued and immediately called me asking about this U3C filing. When he told me this I honestly wasn't worried at all because I knew for certain the form had been fully complete and submitted. So I assured my father that there must be some mistake on the KCC's end and that there was nothing to be concerned about. After hanging up from that call I immediately logged into KOLAR to verify that it was still showing the U3C form to have been submitted and to see whether I could determine why a penalty was being issued. The U3C form was still showing in the KOLAR system just as it was before so I clicked on it to see if perhaps it would show me something useful and when I opened the form I saw for the first time the submit button on that screen. My heart immediately sank as I realized what had happened. I clicked

"submit" and called my father back to tell him what had happened.

Q:

A:

I felt terrible that I had messed this filling up and caused my father's company to be penalized. No one wants to lose money for something like this, but Utah Oil's perfect record of compliance has always been a point of pride for my father so I knew losing that would matter more to him that the money. When I called my father, I couldn't help but cry as I told him about my mistake and apologized. That same day I drafted and sent the attached email (Exhibit DR-1) to legal staff explaining everything that had transpired, and provided copies of screen shots showing the last date the U3C form had been modified was April 1, 2024 and showing it was uploaded to KOLAR on the same date. Legal staff indicated he had spoken with staff and they were unwilling to provide any relief.

DO YOU HAVE ANY IDEA WHY YOU WERE NOT ABLE TO SEE THE FINAL SUBMIT BUTTON ON KOLAR WHEN THE U3C FORM WAS COMPLETED AND UPLOADED ON APRIL 1, 2024?

When I filled out the excel spreadsheet and loaded it into KOLAR on April 1, 2024 I did this on my Utah Oil laptop at home and I could not see any "submit" button that needed to be clicked. When my dad called me on May 1, 2024 to let me know that a penalty was going to be issued I was at work (at my full time job) and I opened the filing on my work computer that has two jumbo screens, and I was able to see the "submit" button at that time. The difference would be screens, sizes and settings on each of the computers. I do not know for certain if this is what led to the issue, but I do know that when I completed and uploaded the U3C form on April 1, 2024 I thought I had done everything necessary to submit the form through KOLAR and I could not see another "submit" button that needed to be clicked.

1	Q:	IS THIS A SITUATION WHERE IT IS SIMPLY YOUR WORD AGAINST KCC
2		STAFF'S CONCERNING THE DATES WHEN CERTAIN ACTIONS OCCURRED?
3	A:	No not at all. The attached electronic records clearly show that the subject U3C form was
4		created and also last modified on April 1, 2024. In addition, the KOLAR system clearly shows
5		that such form was uploaded to KOLAR on April 1, 2024. I do not believe that KCC staff
6		disputes the time line of events as I have described them. It is my understanding that the issue
7		is simply, as a matter of policy staff doesn't want to negotiate U3C penalties. In the past the
8		Commission has always been very easy to work with and took a problem solving approach
9		when addressing situations rather than imposing very harsh penalties on operators for honest
10		mistakes like this one. So Utah Oil elected to request this hearing in order to find out whether
11		the Commission itself still has an interest in working with good operators to achieve
12		compliance with regulations, or if the Commission itself has departed from that policy as well
13		in favor of imposing large penalties even for simple KOLAR user error.
14	Q:	DENISE KLUG PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING SUMMARY OF THE FIVE STEPS
15		NECESSARY FOR AN OPERATOR TO SUBMIT A U3C FORM IN KOLAR. WHICH

STEPS WERE COMPLETED BY UTAH OIL WITH REGARD TO THE SUBJECT **U3C FILING:**

> When operators choose to submit U3Cs by file upload, they will go to the U3C upload page, which includes detailed instructions explaining the entire process. The first step is to download a .csv template from KOLAR. The template is an Excel file, but saved in the .csv format. The operator may choose to either download a template prefilled with basic information for each injection well in their inventory, or the operator may download a template that contains the file header row only. The second step is to edit the template they have downloaded, being sure to fill each required cell. The third step is to save the edited file to their local computer in the .csv file format. The fourth step is to upload the .csv file to the KOLAR website, at which point KOLAR will

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validate the uploaded file and add messages indicating any errors, warnings, or comments. When the file is successfully uploaded and validated with no errors, the U3C Annual Reports grid in KOLAR will show the Created date for the report; the Submitted date in the grid, however, will still be empty as the U3Cs have not yet been submitted. The final step is to click the Detail link for the successfully validated file to navigate to the Detail page where the operator can view and submit the processed U3Cs to the KCC. After clicking the button to Submit to KCC, the Submitted date for the report will be displayed in the report grid.

I completed steps 1 through 4 on behalf of Utah Oil on April 1, 2024. The grid showed the date I had created it and that there were no errors. I believed the form had been submitted and that the final date would be completed once it was reviewed and approved by KCC staff through the KOLAR system. The "submit" button was not visible on this screen at all and I did not realize that I needed to navigate to another screen to find a "submit" button. On May 1, 2024 when we learned that this penalty was being issued, I tried to open the "detail link" for this form while trying to determine why a penalty was being issued and saw for the first time the "submit" button when that "detail link" opened so I immediately clicked the submit button at that time.

Q: TO CLARIFY DID YOU MAKE THIS MISTAKE ON ALL 40 OF UTAH OIL'S U3C FORMS?

A: No, the way the KOLAR system is set up, all of our U3C filings are submitted on a single form. This is very convenient and I am not complaining about this structure as it would be tedious to submit separate U3C forms for each well. However, it is important to know that it was just one single form that I made this mistake on, i.e. believed I had submitted it and hadn't.

Q: HAVE YOU PREVIOUSLY FILED U3C FORMS WITH THE KCC?

A: Yes I have. While I remember the forms themselves, how to complete them and the general

process I do not remember exactly what each screen shows on KOLAR from year to year when these are filed. I only make these filings for Utah Oil, and it had been a full year since I had completed a U3C filing when this one came due. I thought that staff had to review and approve the filings on their end before they showed as submitted in the KOLAR account. I could clearly see that this form was created and that there were no errors on my KOLAR screen and everything I saw on that screen led me to believe I had successfully filed the form on April 1, 2024 (which was the first business day after receiving the NOV and 10 days before the deadline given in such NOV to make this filing).

- Q: DOES THIS COMPLETE YOUR TESTIMONY TO THE COMMISSION?


