This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Brickley Enterprises, LLC (Brickley Enterprises) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 7, 8, 10, 2017 and September 21, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Gary Goeller. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Brickley Enterprises has been assessed a \$3,750 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$3,750, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Brickley Enterprises to attend a Commissionsponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Brickley Enterprises must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$3,750 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

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The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Brickley Enterprises, LLC (Brickley Enterprises) has private and common operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 1502813.

5. Mark Wint attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on May 22, 2017, on behalf of Brickley Enterprises.

6. Brickley Enterprises is a private and common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, machinery, large objects, and oil field equipment. It employs eleven (11) CDL drivers.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 7, 8, 10, 2017 and September 21, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Gary Goeller conducted a compliance review of the operations of Brickley Enterprises. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

> a. On June 19, 2017, Brickley Enterprises required or permitted its driver, Quentin Watts, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a

2005 Mack truck, VIN ending in 006587, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from El Dorado, Kansas to Tarkio, Missouri. This trip is evidenced by Mr. Watts' Driver's Daily Log, dated June 19, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Brickley Enterprises failed to have driver Quentin Watts take a pre-employment alcohol/controlled substances test prior to him operating a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle. Mr. Watts was hired on March 1, 2017, and was not pre-employment tested until August 1, 2017, after the abovedescribed transportation. Brickley Enterprises' failure to require its driver to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances test and to obtain a negative test result within 30 days if him/her employment and prior to requiring or permitting him to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

b. On July 17, 2017, Brickley Enterprises required or permitted its driver, Quentin Watts, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2005 Mack truck, VIN ending in 006587, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from El Dorado, Kansas to rural Butler County, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by driver's Time Sheet, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Brickley Enterprises did not require Mr. Watts to complete a Daily Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR) at the end of the trip. The special investigator discovered fifty (50) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to prepare a DVIR in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on each vehicle operated and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

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- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Brickley Enterprises had not paid its Unified Carrier Registration fees for the year of 2017. The carrier has seven (7) vehicles it uses for interstate transportation. Brickley Enterprises' failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce over the highways of this state and to pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set out in 49 C.F.R. 367.30, is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-30a, authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- d. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Brickley Enterprises did not have all of its CDL drivers in a random drug and alcohol testing pool to ensure that each driver subject to random testing has an equal chance of being selected each time selections are made. The carrier had two drivers not in the random testing pool for the 2nd quarter testing draw. Brickley Enterprises' failure to ensure that each driver

selected for random alcohol and controlled substance testing has an equal chance of being selected each time selections are made is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.305(i)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

- e. On July 24, 2017, Brickley Enterprises required or permitted its driver, Dustin Hatfield, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 International Vacuum Tank Truck, VIN ending in 245051, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from El Dorado, Kansas to Eureka, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Mr. Hatfield's Time Sheet, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Brickley Enterprises failed to obtain its driver's motor vehicle record (MVR) within 30 days of employment and maintain a copy of it in its driver's qualification file. The special investigator found five (5) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to obtain MVRs on its drivers within 30 days of employment and maintain the MVRs in the driver qualification files pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51 is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.23(a)(1) and (b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- f. On May 24, 2017, Brickley Enterprises required or permitted its driver, Jesse Thiessen, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2009 International Vacuum Tank Truck, VIN ending in 094630, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from El Dorado, Kansas to

Butler County, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Mr. Thiessen's Time Sheet, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "E" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Brickley Enterprises did not have For Hire authority from the Kansas Corporation Commission. The carrier's commercial operations of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Brickley Enterprises committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,750 for six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Brickley Enterprises be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Brickley Enterprises submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Brickley Enterprises because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds Brickley Enterprises committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Brickley Enterprises, LLC, of El Dorado, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$3,750 civil penalty for six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Brickley Enterprises is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

C. Brickley Enterprises is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.

D. On November 28, 2017, this Penalty Order was mailed to Brickley Enterprises via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105742789. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.

E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Brickley Enterprises's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$3,750 civil penalty against Brickley Enterprises, and ordering a representative from Brickley Enterprises to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil

penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$3,750 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$3,750 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$3,750 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Brickley Enterprises' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.

NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

For all Investigations that did not result in a Cooperative Safety Plan:

The KCC requires that you prepare a corrective action letter, addressing the measures taken to correct the violations identified within this report. Submit this letter within 30 days cutlining the carrier's updated changes to their policies and procedures regarding all listed violations. Explain in detail how, as a carrier representative, you will rectify these deficiencies and prevent their reoccurrence going forward. Include any supporting documentation and evidence as indicated in the recommendations above, (example: vehicle inspections performed, proof of drug and alcohol testing in place, etc.) necessary to prove that corrective action has been taken. - Require all drivers to prepare a written inspection report for each day a vehicle is operated. Ensure that each report is signed by the driver, certified, and reviewed if defects are reported.
- 9. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES AND ALCOHOL BASIC PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Policies and Procedures. DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Brickley Enterprises LLC failed to have adiquate policy and procedures to ensure compliance with the controlled substance and alcohol testing program, or to have a valid controlled substance and alcohol testing policy on file or reasonable suspicion training for supervisors.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

 Develop a written company policy incorporating by reference all regulations regarding controlled substances and alcohol use, testing, training, and records retention for all employees.

 Develop a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all citations for moving violations to carrier management within 24 hours.

• Establish a process to ensure that drivers who are randomly tested can be immediately removed if they are found to be positive and that they do not return to safety-sensitive duties until they have complied with the "return-to-duty" process.

• Establish written policies and procedures that promote, verify, and enforce adherence to all controlled-substance and alcohol rules and regulations. Procedures should be tailored to company operations and should provide specific checks and guidelines for interacting with a consortium, if applicable.

Establish a process to ensure that test results are properly safeguarded from unauthorized disclosure to
prospective employers without specific written consent and from disclosure under any circumstances to insurance
companies and other nonqualified parties, in accordance with regulations.

Develop a policy to ensure that all alcohol testing is conducted immediately before or after the period that
employees are performing a safety-sensitive function. Drivers can be tested on their day off only for controlled
substances. Once notified of their selection, drivers must proceed immediately to the testing facility. If a driver
refuses to go, this should be considered as equivalent to a positive result.

• Consider developing a driver selection protocol that uses valid random-number-generator software on a monthly basis to select, by driver identification number, 5 to 8 percent of drivers for controlled-substance testing and 2 to 5 percent for alcohol testing. This will ensure selection of 25 percent of drivers for controlled-substances testing and 10 percent for alcohol testing per year, given fluctuations in the driver workforce over the course of the year.

Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers
 comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written

warnings, suspansions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows controlled-substance and alcohol violations.

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Brickley Enterprises LLC failed to have a driver policy or enforce a driver policy to complete post trip inspection (DVIR) driver vehicle inspection report for all intra state trips and when required on inter state trips.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

 Develop a system of preventive maintenance for compliant, safe, and efficient fleet operations, including a schedule for periodic maintenance, inspection, and recordkeeping. This system should be attuned to manufacturer recommendations, the carrier's own experience, and regulatory requirements.

 Develop a procedure ensuring that vehicle defects that impact safety and/or safety compliance are reported, repaired, and certified before the vehicle is operated.

 Develop procedures to ansure that management is notified of vehicle defects through the use of Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) and other communication channels, such as driver call-in and e-mail from mechanics.

• Develop a policy ensuring that drivers are qualified to complete thorough and timely Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) by the end of the day of the trip and prior to a subsequent assignment.

Establish a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all roadside inspections to carrier management within 24 hours.

 Develop policies and procedures requiring drivers to immediately notify appropriate management of any roadside vehicle Out-of-Service (OOS) order.

 Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows vehicle maintenance violations. Seek Out Resources:
