JOINT MOTION FOR PROCEDURAL ORDER

Kansas Power Pool (KPP), Southern Pioneer Electric Company (Southern Pioneer), Mid-Kansas Electric Company, Inc. (Mid-Kansas), and the Staff of the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Staff and Commission, respectively) (collectively referred to as Joint Movants) hereby move the Commission for an Order establishing a procedural schedule in the above-captioned matter. In support of its motion, Joint Movants state the following:

- 1. On February 9, 2018, KPP filed its application seeking Commission approval of a Transmission Rights Only (TRO) certificate of public convenience and necessity. The Application was contingent upon the outcome in Docket No. 17-KPPE-092-COM (17-092 Docket), which involved the same project for which KPP seeks a TRO certificate (Kingman Project).
 - 2. On April 12, 2018, Southern Pioneer filed its Petition for Intervention.¹
- 3. On May 1, 2018, the Commission issued an Order in the 17-092 Docket, thereby approving a joint motion that sought dismissal of the 17-092 Docket yet allowed for certain issues related to the Kingman Project to be litigated in the instant proceeding.
- 4. On May 8, 2018, KPP filed the Direct Testimony of Mr. Larry Holloway, which started the 180-day statutory clock provided in K.S.A. 66-131, which governs certification filings.

- 5. On May 10, 2018, Mid-Kansas filed its Petition for Intervention.²
- 6. Joint Movants worked collaboratively to develop a procedural schedule for this proceeding.
