This is a notice of a penalty assessment against White Knight Drilling LLC (White Knight Drilling) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 18, 2023, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Gregory Askren. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: White Knight Drilling has been assessed a \$3,300 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$3,300, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. White Knight Drilling must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\(^1\)

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$3,300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On September 21, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Gregory Askren, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of White Knight Drilling LLC (White Knight Drilling or Carrier). White Knight Drilling is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 3561701.
- 2. On October 18, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$3,300 to be issued to White Knight Drilling based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SI Gregory Askren identified twelve (12) violation(s), accounting for

seven (7) count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²

- 3. Staff further recommends White Knight Drilling submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.³
- 4. Finally, Staff recommends that White Knight Drilling submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.⁴ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 5. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112g and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 6. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

7. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. White Knight Drilling LLC, of Schoenchen, KS is hereby assessed a \$3,300 civil penalty for twelve (12) violation(s), accounting for seven (7) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- C. White Knight Drilling is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the

Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of White Knight Drilling's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

- E. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁵
- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$3,300 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$3,300 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.
- G. Failure to pay the \$3,300 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of White Knight Drilling's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁶ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

White Knight Drilling Inc is a motor carrier (MC) operating as private carrier, primarily hauling general freight, oil field equipment, machinery and large objects. White Knight Drilling Inc operates under USDOT 3561701. On September 18, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Greg Askren completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of White Knight Drilling Inc. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified twelve (12) violations, accounting for seven (7) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, staff recommends penalty of \$3,300 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On September 18, 2023, Commission Staff SI Greg Askren conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of White Knight Drilling Inc. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 7)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> Requires the MC to establish an alcohol and controlled substances testing program for its CDL drivers that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: On July 23, 2023, White Knight Drilling LLC required or permitted its driver, Dennis Klima, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 1982 Ford, VIN ending in 6511, GVWR 55,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from the Wamego, Kansas to Hays, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by driver Dennis Klima's fatality accident report, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**. At the time of this transport, the MC had not established an alcohol and controlled substance testing program.

<u>Violation:</u> White Knight Drilling LLC failed to implement an alcohol and/or controlled substances testing program on the date the employer begins commercial motor vehicle operations (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

Count Two (2 of 7)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 382.711, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH).

Supporting Documents: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. Additionally attached is MC's DACH search history, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**. The DACH search did not return a carrier named White Knight in Kansas.

<u>Violation:</u> White Knight Drilling LLC failed to register in DACH (Exhibit 1, Page 3). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

Count Three (3 of 7)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 391.45, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must confirm that its driver is medically examined and certified prior to operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintain documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. Mr. Kilma's medical card is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**. The medical expired on April 29, 2023.

<u>Violation:</u> White Knight Drilling LLC was found to be in violation of using a driver not medically examined and certified (**Exhibit 1, Page 3 to 4**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Four (4 of 7)

<u>Juris diction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 391.51(b) (2) and (4), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must maintain a copy of the motor vehicle record (MVR) received from each State in the driver qualification file.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: On July 23, 2023, White Knight Drilling LLC required or permitted its driver, Daniel Fehrenbach, to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8654, GVWR 55,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Hays, Kansas to Schoenchen, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by driver Daniel Fehrenbach's maintenance invoice #128950, attached hereto as **Exhibit 5**. The MC could not produce MVRs for Mr. Fehrenbach.

<u>Violation:</u> White Knight Drilling LLC was found to be in violation of failing to maintain the responses of each state agency to the annual driver record inquiry required by 391.25(a) (**Exhibit 1, Page 4**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Five (5 of 7)

<u>Juris diction:</u> K.S.A. 66-1,112g and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must obtain proper Kansas Corporation Commission authority to operate as a Private MC before conducting intrastate commercial operations.

Supporting Documents: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. Additionally, attached is a copy of the MC's KTRAN profile, attached hereto as **Exhibit** 5. The MC was operating point to point within Kansas in a manner that requires KCC authority. The KTRAN profile states the MC possess no authority from the KCC to operate.

<u>Violation</u>: White Knight Drilling LLC was found to be in violation of having not having KCC Private Motor Carrier Operating Authority (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 5**). One (1) violation was discovered. **Recommendation**: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

Count Six (6 of 7)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 395.8, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall require its driver to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The MC was not able to produce time records for this transport.

<u>Violation:</u> White Knight Drilling LLC Failing to require a driver to prepare a record of duty status using the appropriate method (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 6**). Two (2) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Seven (7 of 7)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 396.17, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the MC pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The MC could not produce an annual inspection for the CMV involved in the fatality accident on July 25, 2023.

<u>Violation</u>: White Knight Drilling LLC was found to be in violation of using a commercial motor vehicle not periodically inspected in accordance with minimum standards (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 6**). Five (5) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find White Knight Drilling Inc committed twelve (12) violations, accounting for seven (7) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,300 for twelve (12) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends White Knight Drilling Inc submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that White Knight Drilling Inc submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

- 3. Maintain roadside inspection reports, moving violation records, training records, the Commercial Driver's License (CDL), the dispatch schedule, bills of lading, and the medical report to help evaluate the performance of all staff involved in qualifying drivers (dispatchers and managers) and the effectiveness of the policies and procedures.

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures:

- 1. Develop procedures to ensure that management is notified of vehicle defects through the use of Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) and other communication channels, such as driver call-in and e-mail from mechanics.
- 2. Develop a policy ensuring that drivers are qualified to complete thorough and timely Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) by the end of the day of the trip and prior to a subsequent assignment.

CDL or CLP holders who certify to non-excepted INTER or INTRA state driving must comply with 383.71(h). When a CLP or CDL holder renews the medical certificate, the CLP or CDL holder must provide the State with an original or copy of each subsequently issued medical examiner's certificate and the State will post a certification update on the driver record. IF THE CLP OR CDL HOLDER DOES NOT PROVIDE THE MEDICAL CERTIFICATE AS REQUIRED, THE DRIVER WILL BE DOWNGRADED TO A REGULAR LICENSE AND THE CLP OR CDL WILL NO LONGER BE VALID. The driver needs to update the information within 12 months of the expiration date or the written and skills test will need to be retaken.

9. Obtain a copy of each driver's driving record and review it.

Obtain a copy of each driver's driving record and review it annually.

10. 10-year driver employment history required.

Ensure that drivers provide a 10-year employment history on their employment application.

11. Maintain all required controlled substance testing records.

Maintain all required alcohol and controlled substance testing records including yearly summaries, quarterly summaries, test information, test results, records of training etc., as required by 49 CFR Parts 40 and 382 of the FMCSR.

12. Require drivers to prepare complete and accurate records.

Require all drivers to prepare complete and accurate records of duty status for each day, and to submit them within 13 days. Maintain all duty status records on file, with all supporting documents, for at least 6 months.

13. Duty status records must be kept on file for 6 months.

Ensure that all documents supporting records of duty status (such as toll, fuel repair and other on-the-road expense receipts, as well as invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, etc.) are kept on file for at least 6 months.

14. Retain supporting documents for 6 months.

Toll receipts and other on-the-road expense receipts, invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, and other "supporting document" must be kept on file for six (6) months. This requirement also applies to records generated by the use of owner-operators. You may keep legible photocopies in lieu of originals.

15. 150-mile exemption terms must be met.

If you want some drivers to use the 150 air-mile radius exemption, make sure that the drivers meet all terms of the exemption, including being released from duty no more than 14 hours from when they report for duty. Logs must be prepared if a driver does not meet the 14 hour requirement.

16. Establish a maintenance records program for all vehicles.

Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed.

17. Drug and Alcohol Testing Company Policy (Educational Materials)

Provide employees with a written controlled substance and alcohol testing policy that complies with all the requirments noted in Part 382.601(b). Also, ensure you maintain a certificate signed by the employee certifiing they have recieved your company drug and alcohol testing policy.

18. Part 40 Violations

Ensure that your drug and alcohol testing program conforms with all applicable parts of Part 40.

19. Random Test Selections

After selection of drivers for random testing, the program coordinator should send confidential correspondence to whoever is informing the selected drivers, noting the selection date, selected names, proper notification procedure, testing location, and when test results need to be completed. Drivers should be reminded that refusal to take the test will be equivalent to a positive result.

20. New Hires

Ensure that applicants for safety-sensitive positions do not have a current controlled-substance and/or alcohol problem by querying them and checking with their previous employers regarding controlled-substance and alcohol violations, related background, conditions and behaviors indicative of controlled-substance and/or alcohol abuse or misuse, and by conducting pre-employment testing as required by regulation and company policy. Create a detailed written record of each inquiry.

Review and evaluate driver applicants gaps in employment, frequent job changes, and incomplete applications. Require applicants to explain reasons for any gaps in their employment record in order to allay suspicion of controlled-substance and/or alcohol abuse or misuse.

21. MCS-150 biennial updates

The DQ file must include: driver's application for employment completed in accordance with 391.21; a copy of the motor vehicle record received from each State within 30 days of the hire date pursuant to 391.23(a)(1); certificate of the driver's road test issued to the driver [391.31(e)] or a copy of the CDL license [391.33]; copy of the annual motor vehicle record received from each State agency [391.25(a)]; note relating to the annual review of the driver's driving record [391.25(c)(2)]; list or certificate relating to violations of motor vehicle laws and ordinances of the annual review of the driver's driving record [391.27]; copy of the medical examiner's certificate [391.43(g)]; a note relating to the verification of medical examiner listing on the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners [391.23(m)]; and a Skill Performance Evaluation Certificate if applicable [391.49].

23. DQ retained 3 yrs after termination

Per 391.51(c), Except as provided in paragraph (d) of this section, each driver's qualification file shall be retained for as long as a driver is employed by that motor carrier and for three years thereafter.


24. MC verify Nal Registry

25. Reasonable Suspicion Training

Ensure that all persons designated to supervise CDL drivers receive at least 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and receive at least an additional 60 minutes of training on controlled substance use.



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INCIDENT SYNOPSIS

On Tuesday, July 25, 2023, at approximately 1858 hours, I, Trooper Andrew Mai along with Master Trooper Donavon Zamecnik of the Kansas Highway Patrol were notified of a single vehicle roll over. Based on evidence available on scene, the truck (V1) appeared to have blown a front left tire causing the truck to go off the roadway to the south and into a field. After entering the field, the truck rolled. No seatbelt appeared to be used causing the driver to be ejected. The truck was traveling westbound on US 24 Highway near mile post 250.

OBSERVATIONS

As I arrived on scene, I could see a white truck, on its wheels in a field to the south of US 24 Highway. EMS and Cloud County Sheriff's Office was already on scene. EMS was working on loading the driver and performing CPR. The cab of the truck had severe damage with the front of the cab being opened. Oil and equipment were scattered across the field.

ROADWAY

US 24 Highway near mile post 250 is a straight roadway on a downward slope. It is a two-lane highway with one east bound lane and one west bound lane. US 24 Highway near the collision location has a dashed center line and has white edge lines.

ROADWAY CONDITIONS

At the area of the collision, it is an asphalt roadway with no noticeable defects.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

At the time of the collision, the temperature was 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, wind was 8 mph out of the South Southwest, and the Barometer was 29.81. Humidity was 33.22 and the roadway was dry. The weather was sunny and clear.

SIGHT DISTANCE

At the time of occurrence, there were no line-of-sight issues for US 24 Highway that would have played a role for D1.

VEHICLES

Vehicle 1 is a white 1982 Ford (VIN: 1FDYU90W6CVA26511) straight truck with 3 axles. V1 has a Kansas registration plate of "7307". V1 had major damage to the cab with the roof being caved in on the passenger side. The driver's side of the cab was pushed in as well. The windshield of V1 was missing and the opening for the windshield appeared to be opened more than normal. V1 appeared to be an oil drilling truck with a boom. The boom was laying on the ground to the west of the truck. Other equipment and tools from the truck were spread out across the ground. The front left tire appeared to be shredded and the front right tire appeared to be blown out as a result of the collision.

DRIVER AND OCCUPANTS

Driver 1, Dennis Klima, DOB: 09/09/1951, had been ejected from V1. EMS began life saving measures and then transported Klima to North Central Kansas Medical Center in Concordia, KS. Klima was pronounced dead at the Hospital at 1950 hours by Dr. Dorothy Breault.

24 HOUR HISTORY

I was able to contact Klima's wife Rhonda Klima. Rhonda stated Klima was working in Wamego, Kansas on Monday and stayed the night there. She stated he usually got up around 0530 to 0600 hours. Rhonda stated she knew Klima was working on "Tube and Packing" for the day. At approximately 1530 hours, Rhonda called Klima, and he asked her if he could call her on his way home since he was busy. Rhonda stated she did not hear back from him. She stated she received a call from Jason Hull stating Klima was in a crash and told her "It doesn't look good". Rhonda (spouse) stated Klima was a diabetic but took care of himself and has never had issues during the day. Rhonda told me Klima was coming from Paxico, Kansas and going to Hays, Kansas.

ON SCENE ACTIONS

As I arrived on scene, I heard a female identified as Sonya Harris state she witnessed the collision. I asked her to fill out a witness statement. I then asked the Cloud County Deputies to get statements from Klima's coworkers who were traveling behind V1 at the time of the collision. Master Trooper Zamecnik and I observed EMS conducting life saving measures. We walked the tire trail from V1 and followed it to US 24 Highway near mile post 250. There we saw where the tire appeared to be falling apart and where it appeared to blow out. I took photographs of the scene. I collected the witness statements and was able to get a phone number for the owner of the company. Dispatch was able to get a Next of Kin for Klima and Kansas Troopers notified her. Renegade Towing was dispatched to our location to collect V1. CHART was contacted to diagram the scene.

PHYSICAL EVIDENCE

Physical evidence on scene was a large area of tire debris on the roadway. Small pieces of tire debris were located near the mile post 250 sign of US 24 Highway. As we walked west, we located an area where it appeared the front driver's side tire had blown out. There was a larger area of debris in the roadway along with wheel marks leading across the east bound lane and onto the south shoulder. Tire marks continued southwest into the ditch and into a field just south of US 24 Highway. Once in the field, large gouges were located on the ground where it appears V1 started to roll. V1 came to a stop on its wheels and was surrounded by a large debris field. An area of blood was located near V1, and witnesses stated that was where Klima was

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laying when they arrived.

WITNESS STATEMENTS

A written statement was provided by Sonya Harris. She stated "The driver drove off the road. I'm not sure if he was still conscious, but it appeared like he might be due to it appearing like he was trying to keep the truck from flipping. The truck then went completely off the road and flipped. After that there was too much dust to see anything. (Call 911). I parked west of the accident and was headed down to where Dennis and his truck were located when his friends / employees were pulling Dennis (who appeared had been thrown from the truck) away from the wreckage and out of the fuel that was on the ground. Dennis was on his back and unresponsive. He was breathing and had a heartbeat. Due to the blood filling his mouth and nostrils he was rocked on his left side. His breathing and heart rate started to slow rapidly. Blood continued to flow but appeared to slow. The medic team was very professional. They all worked well together. The officers were all helpful and professional. One of his friends said that he heard Dennis's glucose / diabetic monitor go off before the accident. I requested that his medication was found, and that Dennis be given his insulin. Insulin was administered."

Another written statement was provided by Travis Chism. Chism stated "was following Dennis in the pickup from Wamego, KS when we came over the hill. Seen Dennis go left of center kinda corrected the semi when he kept going down thru the ditch into the field caught air then rolled maybe twice was thrown from truck. We followed up to him huely called 911 while we tried to work with Dennis."

Kyson Scott provided a written statement as well. He stated "Driving in front of us on highway saw him go towards left side of road. He drove down in field then rolled it. Me and Travis pulled him from the diesel fluid. Then we held him trying to see if he would still breathe."

Later, we spoke with Rhonda. She stated Klima regularly shut off his monitor due to it going off when he was sweaty. She stated he had disconnected his monitor at 1630 hours and told us everything was normal on it at the time of disconnection.

CONCLUSION

V1 was westbound on US 24 Highway near mile post 250 in Cloud County, Kansas when a front left tire blew out on V1. This caused V1 to cross the center line and enter the south ditch. After entering into the ditch, V1 traveled up a hill and entered the field where it rolled and ejected the driver.
