Dear Mr. Stucky:

In reply to the Notice published by Marshall Oil LLC in the Eureka Herald on 14 February, 2018, I am writing to ask that the KCC deny the application filed by Marshall Oil LLC to commence the disposal of saltwater into the Douglas formation at the **Teter-Spencer Lease and well No. 2A** 4950 FSL 4290 FEL; located in the NW/4 of the Sec.22 Twp.23S R 9E, Greenwood County, Kansas, with a maximum operating pressure of 1000 psig, and a maximum injection rate of 1500 bbls per day.

As a 5th generation citizen and life-long resident of Kansas, who makes regular travels to enjoy the Teter Rock area, I am concerned that the disposing of saltwater by injection into this well in the Douglas formation may cause waste and or pollution of the immediate vicinity through leakage or spillage, and, subsequently, violate correlative rights regarding these precious and fragile natural resources in the area to include local rangeland waterways, rangeland grasses on which both cattle and wild horses herds depend and the pristineness of this part of the Flint Hills in which historic Teterville and Teter Rock are located.

By its own mission statement, the Kansas Corporation Commission is charged to *protect correlative rights and environmental resources (of Kansas) ... in part by preventing waste and by enforcing regulations that provide guidelines of producing resources efficiently.*

In the spirit of using that charge to protect these precious and fragile the natural resources of the state of Kansas, I respectfully ask the Kansas Corporation Commission to deny the application filed Marshall Oil LLC to commence the disposal of saltwater into the Douglas formation **Teter-Spencer Lease and well No. 2A** 4950 FSL 4290 FEL; located in the NW/4 of the Sec.22 Twp.23S R 9E, Greenwood County, Kansas, with a maximum operating pressure of 1000 psig, and a maximum injection rate of 1500 bbls per day.
