# NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on March 29-30, 2016, May 2, 2016 and May 10, 2016, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Gary Goeller. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

# IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$2,000 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website <a href="http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety">http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety</a> meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

#### IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-542.

# IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

# PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

# I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

# II. BACKGROUND

- 4. JJGK Trucking LLC. (JJGK Trucking) operates under USDOT number 1707771.
- 5. JJGK Trucking has eight tractor/trailers and operates in intrastate commerce.
- 6. JJGK Trucking is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls commodities dry bulk, construction, rock, sand and dirt.

# III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on May 10, 2016, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Gary Goeller conducted a compliance review of the operations of JJGK Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Goeller identified three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On January 29, 2016, JJGK Trucking required or permitted its driver, Salvador Chaves-Ojeda, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 1998 Kenworth, VIN ending in 783522, GVWR 48,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report, dated January 29, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, JJGK Trucking had not obtained a pre-employment alcohol/controlled substance

Ojeda was hired on January 29, 2016, and the test was not obtained until February 22, 2016. JJGK Trucking's failure to require its drivers to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances test and to obtain a negative test result prior to requiring or permitting him to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

b. On February 8, 2016, JJGK Trucking required or permitted its driver, Adrian Lopez, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Kenworth, VIN ending in 845917, GVWR > 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Wichita, Kansas to Independence, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by JJGK Trucking's load log, dated February 8, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, JJGK Trucking failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The special investigator found three violations of this type. JJGK Trucking's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

c. During the transportation described in paragraph b., above, JJGK Trucking failed to require its driver Adrian Lopez to make a record of duty status showing the start time, end time and total number of hours worked for the day. The special investigator found 150 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its drivers to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period, or in the alternative to maintain and retain time records described in 49 C.F.R. 395.1(e) under the short haul exemption, using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a and authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine in the amount of \$1,000.

# IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find JJGK Trucking committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,000 for three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that JJGK Trucking be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that JJGK Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

# V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over JJGK Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds JJGK Trucking committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

# THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. JJGK Trucking LLC., of Wichita, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$2,000 civil penalty for three (3) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. JJGK Trucking is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, JJGK Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.
- C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of

this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of JJGK Trucking's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$2,000 civil penalty against JJGK Trucking, and ordering JJGK Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.
- F. Failure to pay the \$2,000 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of JJGK Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without further

notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

- 4. Copies of the regulations, forms, interpretations, and manuals are available from a variety of sources. Check the FMCSA website for a current list of suppliers, www.fmcsa.dot.gov/safety-security/eta/index.htm
- 2. A copy of your carrier profile can be obtained at no cost from the FMCSA Portal (https://portal.fnicca.dot.gc.v/login)
- 3. Conduct periodic internal reviews of your driver qualification, hours of service control, maintenance, socident analysis/reporting, training, and other safety systems to ensure continued compliance with the FMCSR
- 4. Obtain a copy of each criver's driving record and review it annually
- Review the circumstances under which a CDL is required. CDL and drug testing rules apply to both interstate and intrastate commerce.
- 6. Ensure that all drivers are fully and properly qualified before operating in intra or interstate commerce. Maintain a complete file as required for each driver, documenting the qualification process.
- 7- Require all drivers to prepare complete and accurate records of duty status for each day, and to submit them within a timely fashion or to tollow your company policy. Maintain all duty status records on title, with all supporting documents, for at least 6 months.
- 8. If you want some drivers to use the 100 air-mile radius exemption, make sore that the drivers great air forms of the exemption, including being released from duty no more than 12 nours from when they report for duty. Logs must be prepared if a driver does not meet the 12 hour requirement.
- 9. Review with your drivers periodically the procedures for doing pre-trip and past-tup inspections. review their "fit-for-duty" status before starting a job, and that drivers who are ill to the extent that their ability and/or alertness is impaired are prohibited from working on safety-sensitive assignments.

 Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows Hours-of-Service (HOS) violations.

Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.
- NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS).
