3 I. <u>INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF TESTIMONY</u>

- 4 Q. Please state your name, present position and business address.
- 5 A. My name is Mark Lawlor. I am Director of Development for Clean Line Energy Partners
- 6 LLC ("Clean Line"). Clean Line is the ultimate parent company of Grain Belt Express
- 7 Clean Line LLC ("Grain Belt Express" or "Company"), the Petitioner in this proceeding.
- I am based in Overland Park, Kansas, but my business address is 1001 McKinney, Suite
- 9 700, Houston, TX 77002.
- 10 Q. What are your duties and responsibilities as Director of Development of Clean
- 11 Line?
- 12 A. I am responsible for managing the siting process, permitting efforts, public outreach,
- environmental considerations, and schedule for the development of the Grain Belt
- Express Clean Line transmission project ("Grain Belt Express Project" or "Project"). I
- work to integrate and align the Project's regulatory processes with outreach activities in
- the states in which the transmission project is to be located.
- 17 Q. What is the purpose of your direct testimony?
- 18 A. I am testifying in support of the Grain Belt Express Application for a siting permit.
- Specifically, I will describe the public outreach process, the agency coordination with
- federal, state, and local authorities used by Grain Belt Express to determine the Proposed
- Route for the Project in Kansas. I will describe how we gathered and utilized routing
- input from the local authorities, agencies, non-governmental organizations, and
- 23 individual landowners throughout the study area. Each of the aforementioned topics is

1		covered in detail in the Routing Report sponsored by Company witness, wit. Thin Gaut,
2		attached to his direct testimony as TBG-1. Additionally, I will provide information on
3		Grain Belt Express' plans for negotiating with landowners to obtain the necessary real
4		property rights for the project, including transmission line easements.
5	Q.	In addition to your prepared testimony, are you sponsoring any other exhibits?

15	Q.	Please describe your educational and professional background.
16	A.	I received my undergraduate degrees in Political Science and Environmental Studies
17		from the University of Kansas in 1997 and my Juris Doctor from Washburn University in
18		2000. Immediately prior to joining Clean Line, I was Project Manager for EDP
19		Renewables (previously known as Horizon Wind Energy) and was tasked with
20		developing wind energy projects in Kansas, managing transmission policy in the
21		Southwest Power Pool ("SPP"), and overseeing legislative and regulatory matters in
22		Kansas and the region on behalf of the company. Before joining Horizon Wind Energy, I
23		was a founding partner in a law firm specializing in renewable energy law.

II. THE PUBLIC OUTREACH PROCESS UTILIZED BY GRAIN BELT EXPRESS

4 Q. As part of its route determination activities for the Project, did Grain Belt Express conduct a public outreach process?

A.

Yes. Grain Belt Express approached the route determination process with the premise that an extensive, methodical, multi-level public outreach strategy that is iterative with the route development process is the best way to determine, gain approvals for, and build support for a proposed route for a transmission line, particularly one the length of the Grain Belt Express Project, which will span a total of approximately 750 miles with approximately 370 miles in Kansas. An extensive public outreach process may also support the acquisition of necessary transmission line easements through voluntary, negotiated transactions. Accordingly, from May 2010 through June 2013, the Grain Belt Express team conducted more than 620 in-person meetings across the project area in Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana.

The Grain Belt Express Project has also maintained an active presence with the The public online and through social media. Project website, www.grainbeltexpresscleanline.com, has been actively updated since the beginning of the project in 2010. Among other information, the website contains: a project video that describes the need for the Project and how Grain Belt Express will bring significant economic benefit to Kansas and other states through much-needed transmission expansion for new wind energy projects; an FAO section for all stakeholders to learn greater details about the Project; a section on how local businesses can learn about opportunities to participate in the construction of the Project; and a section for Kansas landowners to learn about meetings, view maps, read studies relating to the Project, view regulatory filings, locate third-party resources and provide route-specific comments.

The Project also maintains a Facebook page where the public can interact with the Project team and get regular updates on recent activities and events. In addition to Facebook, Grain Belt Express distributes a newsletter on a regular basis to hundreds of stakeholders. These newsletters provide information on project milestones, recent events and meetings, as well as upcoming project activities. The newsletter is available to anyone who is interested in receiving a copy.

Q. Please describe the Grain Belt Express Routing Team.

A.

A multidisciplinary Routing Team performed the public outreach and participated in determining the Proposed Route and preparing the Routing Study. Members of the Routing Team have experience in public outreach and communication, transmission line route selection, impact assessment for natural resources, land use assessment and planning, cultural resource identification and assessment, impact mitigation, transmission engineering and design, and construction. The team's objective was to develop and execute an extensive, methodical, multi-level public outreach strategy that utilized input from local authorities, agencies, non-governmental organizations, and individual landowners throughout the study area. The Routing Team then used the information collected from this plan to identify a proposed route that provides a reasonable balance between impacts on local communities and the natural environment, while applying appropriate routing and technical guidelines, as addressed in the Kansas Routing Report.

22 Q. What were the objectives of the public outreach process?

A. The objectives of the public outreach process were:

- determine the Proposed Route. Due to its length, route selection for the Grain Belt Express Project involved considering a complex set of physical features, including homes, businesses, cultural and historical resources, other infrastructure, and environmental factors. Publicly available data sets do not contain all of the desired information and can be beneficially supplemented by methodical outreach to local government officials and agencies, non-governmental organizations with specific expertise and local familiarity, other utilities and businesses, and local landowners (cumulatively referred to as "stakeholders"). The extensive outreach associated with this data collection also provided opportunities to verify the accuracy of the routing data that was gathered.
- To communicate the purpose and need for the Project to government officials,
 non-governmental organizations, and the public.
- To communicate to government officials, non-governmental organizations, and the public other benefits of the Project, such as job creation, additional governmental revenues, landowner payments for easements, and environmental benefits.
- To provide information about, and opportunities for feedback on, the general and technical routing guidelines as described in the Kansas Routing Report (Sections 2.4.1 and 2.4.2). Grain Belt Express sought to convey to stakeholders that the Proposed Route ultimately chosen would be the result of

- To convey Grain Belt Express' respect for private property rights and to provide information about planned construction practices and planned efforts to minimize and mitigate agricultural impacts.
- To provide information about Grain Belt Express' right of way acquisition process.
- 8 Q. Please describe the public outreach process you utilized in Kansas.
- 9 A. The public outreach effort in Kansas can be described in three distinct stages. Stage One
 10 began with the inception of the project through the development of a Potential Route
 11 Network. Stage Two covered the period Potential Route Network through Open House
 12 meetings. Finally, Stage Three covered the period following Open House meetings
 13 through the selection of the Proposed Route.
- 14 Stage One:

- 15 Q. Please describe Stage One of the process.
- 16 Stage One began with the identification of the Resource Area and the point of delivery A. 17 for the Project. The Resource Area was identified in southwestern Kansas after studying the wind resource, location of wind projects under development and compatible land use 18 for large-scale wind energy projects. A broad project Study Area was identified between 19 20 the Resource Area and the point of delivery as described in the Kansas Routing Report, 21 Section 4.1. Stage One began in May of 2010 after the identification of the Resource 22 Area and a proposed delivery point in St. Francois County, Missouri. The Project Study 23 Area at that point included much of Kansas and Missouri. In October 2011, the

Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. ("MISO") provided Grain Belt Express with the System Planning and Analysis results of the interconnection studies which indicated the upgrades required to deliver 3,500 megawatts ("MW") to the St. Francois substation would be economically infeasible. In anticipation of these limitations at the St. Francois substation, the Grain Belt Express team identified the Sullivan substation in Sullivan County, Indiana, as an alternative delivery point for the Project and initiated a feasibility study in August of 2011 with PJM Interconnection, Inc. ("PJM"). After receiving the final study results from MISO in October of 2011, the Grain Belt Express team designated the Sullivan substation as the new delivery point. At that point, the Study Area expanded to include portions of Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana.

Next, the Routing Team led a community outreach program that was designed to educate the public about the purpose and benefits of the Project, inform community leaders and the public about the regulatory process and Project timeline, and gather general comments on the Project and specific information that would support the routing effort.

These meetings included entities such as United States Fish and Wildlife Service, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks and Tourism, Kansas Department of Commerce, The Nature Conservancy, Kansas Chamber of Commerce, local utilities, Kansas legislators, local economic development organizations and chambers of commerce, county commissioners and other county officials. The Routing Team held over 100 of these meetings in Kansas.

The information sought and obtained related to a wide array of topics, encompassing cultural and historical resources, community buildings such as schools and

churches, recreational areas, wildlife habitats, conservation concerns, and existing infrastructure, such as gas pipelines and other transmission lines.

Next, the Routing Team conducted a series of larger group meetings called community leader roundtables ("Roundtables"). The Grain Belt Express Routing Team invited to the Roundtables public officials (including federal, state, county and municipal governmental officials), planning and zoning officials, highway engineers, local environmental and conservation organization representatives, local Farm Bureau managers, extension agents, representatives of other agricultural organizations, local fire and sheriff's departments, utilities, local economic development representatives, and anyone suggested by county officials as having a broad understanding of the local community and geography. A total of 57 Roundtable meetings were held across the four states. Over 740 community representatives attended these Roundtables across the Project Study Area, providing valuable insight for the route development process and commentary on the Project. More than 300 representatives from more than 50 counties attended the 19 Roundtables held in Kansas. Exhibit MOL-1 provides a table of the dates, locations, and number of participants at the Kansas Roundtables. Supplementary meetings where held in Barton, Ottawa and Clay Counties after potential routes were identified in those counties. These supplementary meeting where similar to the Roundtables in their objectives and outcomes.

At each meeting, members of the Routing Team provided an overview of the Project and a description of the routing process. The Routing Team also described the routing criteria used for siting the transmission line. The presentation was followed by a working session where participants provided specific information about their community

to aid the route development process. Community leaders helped identify potential future land use plans, such as the construction of new water storage facilities, communication towers, or new industrial, commercial or residential development. Community leaders also helped to identify the approximate location of existing features such as, historic sites, mining activities, communication towers, airstrips, schools, churches, etc. Data provided by community leaders at the Roundtables were considered in the Routing Team's route development efforts. Community leaders were also asked to propose potential routes in their county that take into consideration the routing criteria.

As described in Section 4 of the Routing Report, the information collected during Stage One of the public outreach process was used to identify and compare Conceptual Routes from the Resource Area to the point of delivery. This information assisted the Routing Team in identifying the northern portion of the Study Area to be the most viable for the Project and led to focused efforts in that portion of the Study Area for development of the Potential Route Network in Kansas.

Stage Two:

A.

Q. What outreach steps were taken in Stage Two of the public outreach process?

During Stage Two, the Potential Route Network was shown to state and local planners and elected officials, conservation-focused non-governmental organizations, and other stakeholders in the northern portion of the Study Area. The Potential Route Network was also presented to federal and state regulatory agencies for additional feedback and comment. Information gathered at these meetings was utilized to inform the Routing Team in further refinement of the Potential Route Network. Grain Belt Express held over

1	47 of these meetings in Kansas, which helped refine the Potential Route Network in
2	advance of the Open House meetings.

A.

The Routing Team then scheduled Open House meetings throughout the counties involved in the Potential Route Network in Kansas.

What steps were taken by Grain Belt Express to publicize the Open House meetings that were held?

Invitations were mailed to all landowners with property within roughly 1.5 miles of the centerline of each Potential Route segment. These landowners were identified by obtaining parcel ownership information from the relevant county Register of Deeds. Invitations were mailed directly to more than 11,200 people with property along the Potential Route Network.

Each invitation included a high-level map of the Potential Route Network, a list of the meeting times and locations, a website address, an RSVP phone number, and an email address to which landowners could send their questions and requests for more information. **Exhibit MOL-2** includes an example of the invitation. The Grain Belt Express team also promoted the Open Houses by contacting the local media and by purchasing ads to run prior to the Open Houses in print publications.

Exhibit MOL-3 provides a list of the newspapers in which these paid advertisements were published along with the dates and locations of the Open Houses.

Exhibit MOL-4 provides a copy of an example advertisement printed in these local newspapers. A total of 14 Open House meetings were held across the state along the Potential Route Network.

Q. Please explain how the Open Houses were conducted.

At the entrance to each Open House, a welcome table was set up, where the names and contact information for the attendees were recorded. Attendees were provided with a project overview brochure and a comment card with a unique identification number in order to link contact information with comments to be collected. Landowners were encouraged to return the comment card either at the Open Houses or later via the U.S. Postal Service or web interface/electronic mail. DVDs containing a project introductory video and construction simulation video were also available for attendees. The arriving attendees were then assigned to a host. Grain Belt Express trained and provided approximately 18 hosts for these Open Houses, all of whom were employees of Clean Line, members of the Routing Team, or other contractors working on the Project. The hosts led attendees through a series of nine poster boards that provided information about the Project. The hosts explained the content of the posters and answered questions asked by the participants. As shown in Exhibit MOL-5, the posters included information about Clean Line's mission, the purpose and need for the Grain Belt Express Project, depictions of potential structure types, a summary list of the routing guidelines, a description of the routing process, a timeline of the development of the Project, and other relevant Project information.

Following the guided tour of the poster boards, the participants were able to examine large-scale maps, with aerial imagery of the Potential Route Network and were provided the opportunity and encouraged to document the location of their houses, places of business, properties of concern, or other sensitive resources on the printed maps. Routing Team members worked with landowners and ensured that each comment or group of comments provided by an attendee was also referenced to the number on the

attendee's individual comment card (by recording it on or next to the attendee's comments on the map).

Computerized Geographic Information System ("GIS") stations were provided for more detailed information than was available on the printed maps. Landowners were able to sit down with a GIS technician and provide input via a GIS workstation. Landowners were able to search for their property by tax roll name, street address, or property description and provide comments. The comments were recorded via small, numbered, circular stickers, each of which corresponded to notes taken in notebooks by the hosts during the Open House. Attendees were asked to provide any information about the areas under consideration, including: the categorization of homes on the maps as occupied or unoccupied; the identification of homes missing from the maps; and the identification of any important features that the Routing Team may not have been able to identify or obtain from route surveys or other data sources, such as community recreational areas, unmarked cemeteries, or any other feature that attendees believed to be significant. The comments were collected by the hosts and reported to a central person at the end of each Open House, combined with data from the comment cards. The comments were then digitized, assembled in a GIS database, and integrated into the routing process, as further described in the Routing Report.

- Q. Were the Open Houses held during Stage Two successful in terms of the number of attendees and the usefulness of the data collected?
- A. Yes, the Open Houses were very successful. More than 2,300 people participated in the
 14 Open Houses in Kansas. Exhibit MOL-6 provides a table of the Open House
 locations and the number of participants at each. Attendance was strong for these

meetings with most ranging from 117 to 226 participants. The one exception was the Open House meeting in Russell on January 31, 2013. On this day, there was a snow storm that we believe had an impact on the invitees' ability to attend. As a result, Grain Belt Express held a second Open House in Russell on March 12, 2013. The combined attendance for these two meetings in Russell was 136, which was typical of other meetings in the area.

These Open Houses were also very helpful in terms of data collection, with thousands of routing comments and more than 2,000 comment cards collected. Comments included information about the status of homes near Potential Routes (whether they were occupied or not), the presence of center pivot irrigators, location of popular recreation areas, details about local airfields, etc. Because of the detail available through the maps used during the Open Houses, the extensive public comments received, and the knowledge of the public regarding their own communities, the data collected at this point were more granular and specific than the data collected at the Roundtables. The information gathered at the Open Houses was used to refine the Potential Route Network, eliminate portions of the network and develop a set of Alternative Routes, as described in Section 4 of the Kansas Routing Report.

- Q. Following the Open Houses, how did the Routing Team manage comments and feedback from the public?
- A. After the Open Houses, all landowners and stakeholders were encouraged to submit general comments or routing-specific comments through the Grain Belt Express website.

 These comments and questions were tracked in a comment management system called "Connect." The Routing Team reviewed each comment and responded in writing or by

phone to individuals posing a specific question. Where a commenter provided route-specific information or input, the comments were used in reviewing and modifying the various route alternatives. In addition, landowners and other stakeholders contacted the Grain Belt Express team by phone or email. Each of the communications was recorded in the same location as online comments in Connect. In total, there were over 2,400 comments collected and stored in Connect. The Routing Team directly responded in writing or by phone to individuals who requested more information or to be contacted by a Routing Team member.

- Q. Please describe the outreach measures taken by Grain Belt Express to seek feedback
 on the Potential Route Network in Stage Three following the Open Houses.
- 12 A. In Stage Three the Routing Team continued to meet with local and state officials as well as the public. Outreach was conducted in each county where the Potential Route 13 Network was located through letters, phone calls, or in-person meetings. Dozens of these 14 meetings were held after the Open Houses and before filing the Proposed Route. 15 Members of the Routing Team met with county commissioners, state officials, individual 16 landowners, state agencies and organizations such as the Kansas Farm Bureau and the 17 Kansas Livestock Association. Specifically, numerous meetings with landowners in 18 Marshall County were held to address specific questions and concerns as well as 19 20 meetings with commissioners in northern Kansas to address issues ranging from property 21 tax revenue to construction mitigation payments for the counties.

1		Also during Stage Three, multiple meetings were held with landowners, county
2		and state officials, and members of the media regarding landowner compensation for the
3		eventual easement agreements for the Project.
4 5		III. GRAIN BELT EXPRESS' APPROACH TO NEGOTIATIONS WITH LANDOWNERS
6 7	Q.	Please describe Grain Belt Express' approach to negotiations with landowners for
8		transmission line easements.
9	A.	Grain Belt Express is committed to conducting transmission line easement negotiations in
10		a manner that is comprehensive in its respect for the private property rights of
11		landowners. Grain Belt Express believes that there are five key elements to a respectful
12		land acquisition approach:
13		• Communicating the overall need for the Project to landowners in the Project
14		area;
15		 Seeking to actively involve landowners in the routing process;
16		• Providing clear information to landowners on the routing criteria used by
17		Grain Belt Express;
18		Demonstrating respect for private property rights and existing land uses; and
19		Offering a fair and comprehensive compensation package for transmission
20		line easements.
21		The primary goals of these policies are to facilitate the respectful and equitable treatment
22		of landowners and to support voluntary transmission line easement acquisition.

- Q. Has Grain Belt Express adopted a Code of Conduct for its land agents in interacting
 with landowners?
- 3 A. Yes. Grain Belt Express believes that establishing a Code of Conduct for our land 4 acquisition agents will help establish a tone of respectful dialogue and may also be 5 supportive of voluntary transmission line easement acquisition. Exhibit MOL-7 is 6 Grain Belt Express' Code of Conduct. It requires (among other things) that all 7 communications with landowners and other persons made by right-of-way agents and 8 subcontractor employees representing Grain Belt Express must be factually correct, made 9 in good faith, respectful and reflective of fair dealing, and respectful of the privacy rights 10 of property owners.
- 11 Q. Please describe Grain Belt Express' proposed compensation package.

Grain Belt Express proposes a payment to the landowner for the transmission right-of-way easement itself, a payment per structure, and additional payments as compensation for issues that may arise, such as crop damages, field repair, temporary (during construction) or permanent impacts to center pivot irrigators that would reduce the effective area of the irrigation equipment or require new equipment, or other landowner-specific issues. The landowner will retain the ability to continue agricultural production on the entirety of the easement except for the relatively small footprint of the structures. Part of the compensation provided for in the transmission line easement is intended to compensate for this impact.

During our public outreach process, landowners expressed a desire to have the option for a recurring annual payment. As a result, Grain Belt Express intends to offer the landowner, at his or her option, either a one-time payment or a recurring annual

payment for the structure payments. If elected by the landowner, the annual structure payment will be made as long as the above-ground transmission structures are present on the property and Grain Belt Express retains an easement.

4 Q. How does Grain Belt Express plan to obtain the necessary easement agreements?

A.

A.

Assuming Grain Belt Express' Line Siting Application is granted, Grain Belt Express will seek to acquire as much of the required right-of-way as possible through voluntarily negotiated transactions. Grain Belt Express will not seek to exercise eminent domain on a parcel unless and until it has exhausted reasonable efforts to acquire transmission line easements through negotiated agreement.

IV. ADDITIONAL OUTREACH AND SUPPORT FOR THE GRAIN BELT PROJECT

Q. In addition to the public outreach described above, did Grain Belt Express conduct any additional outreach?

Yes. Throughout the development of the Project, Grain Belt Express has been working to identify local contractors and suppliers throughout Kansas who have capabilities to participate in the development, construction, and maintenance of the Project. It is the goal of Grain Belt Express to connect with these contractors and suppliers to ensure that they are aware of the Project and will receive notification when certain phases of the Project are put out to bid. In January of 2013, we held local business opportunity meetings in Kansas to inform local businesses about the Project and to provide information about the types of local companies that could assist in the development, construction, and maintenance of the Project. Nearly 150 business representatives involved in surveying, aggregate and concrete, trucking and fueling, and other related activities attended and provided information about their businesses' capabilities. As of

1		the time of this filing, over 200 Kansas businesses have expressed an interest in			
2		performing work on the Project and have provided Grain Belt Express with their			
3		information and capabilities.			
4	Q.	Has there been expressed support for the successful completion of the Grain Belt			
5		Express Clean Line project?			
6	A.	Yes. In addition to the 200-plus letters sent in from individuals, companies and			
7		organizations in Kansas supporting the Company's earlier certification application in			
8		Docket No. 11-GBEE-624-COC, 260 stakeholders have signed an additional 243 support			
9		letters in support of the Project since January of 2012. Exhibit MOL-8 contains the			
10		support letters received as of the time of this filing.			
11	Q.	Does this conclude your prepared direct testimony?



For

Right-of-Way Agents and Subcontractor Employees

This Code of Conduct applies to all communications and interactions with property owners and occupants of property by all right-of-way agents and subcontractor employees representing Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC in the negotiation of right-of-way and the performance of surveying, environmental assessments and the other activities for the Grain Belt Express Clean Line Project on property not owned by Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC.

1. All communications with property owners and occupants must be factually correct and made in good faith.

- a. Do provide maps and documents necessary to keep the landowner properly informed
- b. Do not make false or misleading statements.
- c. Do not purposely or intentionally misrepresent any fact.
- d. If you do not know the answer to a question, do not speculate about the answer. Advise the property owner that you will investigate the question and provide an answer later.
 - e. Follow-up in a timely manner on all commitments to provide additional information.
- f. Do not send written communications suggesting an agreement has been reached when, in fact, an agreement has not been reached.
- g. If information provided is subsequently determined to be incorrect, follow up with the landowner as soon as practical to provide the corrected information.
- h. Do provide the landowner with appropriate contact information should additional contacts be necessary.

2. All Communications and interactions with property owners and occupants of property must be respectful and reflect fair dealing.

- a. When contacting a property owner in person, promptly identify yourself as representing Grain Belt Express Clean Line.
- b. When contacting a property owner by telephone, promptly identify yourself as representing Grain Belt Express Clean Line.
- c. Do not engage in behavior that may be considered harassing, coercive, manipulative, intimidating or causing undue pressure.
- d. All communications by a property owner, whether in person, by telephone or in writing, in which the property owner indicates that he or she does not want to negotiate or does not want to give permission for surveying or other work on his or her property, must be respected and politely accepted without argument. Unless specifically authorized by a Grain Belt Express Clean Line, do not contact the property owner again regarding negotiations or requests for permission.
- e. When asked to leave property, promptly leave and do not return unless specifically authorized by Grain Belt Express Clean Line.

- f. If discussions with the property owner become acrimonious, politely discontinue the discussion and withdraw from the situation.
- g. Obtain unequivocal permission to enter property for purposes of surveying or conducting environmental assessments or other activities. Clearly explain to the property owner the scope of the work to be conducted based on the permission given. Attempt to notify the occupant of the property each time you enter the property based on this permission.
- h. Do not represent that a relative, neighbor and/or friend have signed a document or reached an agreement with Grain Belt Express Clean Line, unless asked.
- i. Do not ask a relative, neighbor and/or friend of a property owner to convince the property owner to take any action.
- j. Do not represent that a relative, neighbor and/or friend supports or opposes the Grain Belt Express Clean Line Project, unless asked.
- k. Do not suggest that any person should be ashamed of or embarrassed by his or her opposition to the Grain Belt Express Clean Line Project or that such opposition is inappropriate.
 - m. Do not suggest that an offer is "take it or leave it."
 - n. Do not threaten to call law enforcement officers or obtain court orders.
 - o. Do not threaten the use of eminent domain.
- 3. All communications and interactions with property owners and occupants of property must respect the privacy of property owners and other persons.
 - a. Discussions with property owners and occupants are to remain confidential.
- b. Do not discuss your negotiations or interactions with other property owners or other persons.
- c. Do not ask relatives, neighbors and/or friends to influence the property owner or any other person.
