MOTION TO AMEND TERRITORY REQUEST

Comes now Wisper ISP, Inc. (“Wisper”), and moves to amend the territory request contained in its Application for Certificate of Authority filed on January 15, 2019 (“Application”).

In furtherance of this Motion, Wisper states as follows:

1. In paragraph 6 of its Application, Wisper requested local exchange carrier authority in all AT&T and CenturyLink exchanges in Kansas and all rural exchanges that are no longer subject to the protection of the rural exemption guidelines, pursuant to K.S.A. 66-2004(e).

2. In response to inquiries from some rural incumbent local exchange carriers, Wisper agrees to modify the territory for which it has requested certification in Kansas to include only those Kansas territories served by incumbent local exchange companies that do not meet the definition of a rural telephone company, including but not limited to, AT&T Kansas and CenturyLink.
