KANSAS CITY POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S
PETITION FOR CLARIFICATION
OR ALTERNATIVELY, RECONSIDERATION

COMES NOW, Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L"), and pursuant to K.S.A. 66-118b and K.A.R. 82-1-235, petitions the Kansas Corporation Commission ("Commission") for clarification, or alternatively, specific reconsideration of one aspect of its Order Approving Revised Tariff issued in this docket on August 14, 2009 ("August 14 Order").

In support hereof, KCP&L states as follows:

1. On April 23, 2009, KCP&L filed an Application with the Commission for approval of its Low Income Weatherization – Variance tariff ("Schedule LIWV"), and a related modification to KCP&L's Low Income Weatherization tariff ("Schedule LIW").

2. Attached to KCP&L's April 23, 2009 Application as Exhibit B was a redlined copy of KCP&L's Table of Contents, Tariff Schedule TOC-1, Sheet 1, reflecting revisions to KCP&L's Table of Contents of Rates adding the new proposed Schedule LIWV as Sheet Number 6.1. Other modifications to KCP&L's Table of Contents included changes to list tariffs for energy efficiency programs and rates for KCP&L that the Commission had approved since

the last update to the Table of Contents but which were not yet reflected in the Table of Contents, to wit: addition of the Building Operator Certification Program, Energy Audit & Energy Saving Measures Rider, Low Income Affordable New Homes, Cool Homes Program, ENERGY STAR® New Homes, and Energy Efficiency Rider; the deletion of Net Metering.

3. On May 21, 2009, KCP&L filed an amendment to its Application to add two other changes to the existing Schedule LIW. This amendment did not impact the Table of Contents tariff sheet attached to the initial Application.

4. On June 18, 2009, Staff recommended approval of KCP&L's Application. On June 26, 2009, CURB filed its Response, objecting to Staff's recommendation that the Commission approve the Schedule LIWV portion of KCP&L's Application. CURB pointed out federal funds had been released to agencies under the ARRA since the date KCP&L had filed its Application, and therefore, the tariff variance requested by KCP&L intended to accomplish the same goal was no longer necessary. CURB did not object to the clean-up revisions KCP&L had proposed for its LIW tariff and the Table of Contents.

5. On July 9, 2009, KCP&L replied to CURB's Response, stating KCP&L's agreement that the change in circumstances caused by the release of federal funds for purposes of assisting social agencies in preparing for administration of the ARRA makes the tariff variance requested by KCP&L in its Application unnecessary. KCP&L withdrew its request for approval of the Schedule LIWV.

6. Although KCP&L withdrew its request for approval of the Schedule LIWV, the other proposed changes to its Schedule LIW were still necessary. KCP&L attached to its July 9, 2009 Reply:

- **Second Amended Exhibit B** - a redlined copy showing the changes proposed to the Table of Contents tariff sheet;
- **Second Amended Exhibit C** - a clean copy of the Table of Contents tariff sheet with the proposed changes incorporated;
- **Second Amended Exhibit D** - a red-lined copy of Schedule 6, LIW tariff showing the “clean-up” changes proposed; and
- **Second Amended Exhibit E** - a clean copy of Schedule 6, LIW tariff with the proposed changes incorporated.


7. In the Commission’s August 14 Order, the Commission found that “KCP&L’s application to make revisions to its existing Schedule 6, Low Income Weatherization tariff should be approved and made effective the date of this order.” (Page 4 - paragraph 8 and Ordering paragraph A.) The Commission’s Order did not address the revisions proposed to KCP&L’s Table of Contents tariff sheet.

8. KCP&L believes that the omission of addressing KCP&L’s proposed revision to its Table of Contents tariff in the Commission’s August 14 Order was very likely an inadvertent oversight, and if so, hereby requests the Commission issue an order of clarification approving the proposed changes to KCP&L’s Table of Contents tariff sheet as set forth in Seconded Amended Exhibit B and C. If the omission was intentional, then KCP&L hereby respectfully requests the Commission reconsider this aspect of its August 14 Order, and modify the Order so as to include

approval of the proposed changes to KCP&L's Table of Contents tariff sheet, as contained in Second Amended Exhibit B and C of KCP&L's July 9, 2009 Reply.

WHEREFORE, KCPL petitions the Commission for clarification, or alternatively, for specific reconsideration and modification of its August 14, 2009 Order, as set forth above.
