NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on October 27, 2016, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators Wade Patterson and Jared Smith. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$2,550 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. <u>Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation</u> <u>Commission.</u> Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation <u>Commission at 1500 S.W.</u> Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. <u>A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting</u> forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1. 1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Savannah Traders LLC (Savannah Traders) obtained common operating authority from the Commission on April 2, 2015, and operates under KSMCID number 170833 and USDOT number 255147.

 Charles Mulengo attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on March 10, 2015, on behalf of Savannah Traders.

6. Savannah Traders is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, commodities dry bulk, refrigerated foods, paper products, machinery and plastic.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on October 27, 2016, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigators Wade Patterson and Jared Smith conducted a compliance review of the operations of Savannah Traders. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Patterson and Mr. Smith identified seven (7) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

> a. On September 25, 2016, Savannah Traders required or permitted its driver, Getachew Gelgelu, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Kenworth, VIN ending in 865998, GVWR 47,000 lbs., pulling a 2008 Utility (RST) trailer, VIN ending in 335618, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in

interstate commerce from Russellville, Alabama to Kansas City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Bill of Lading, dated September 25, 2016, a copy of which is attached as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Savannah Traders failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

b. On August 2, 2016, Savannah Traders required or permitted its driver, Julius Kyule, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Freightliner, VIN ending in 37463, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2004 Great Dane (VST) trailer, VIN ending in 700910, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Lee's Summit, Missouri to New Orleans, Louisiana. This trip is evidenced by Carrier Load Confirmation, dated August 2, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Julius Kyule drove 7 and ½ hours past the 14th hour since coming on duty. He only took 9 hours off in the sleeper berth before operating again. *See*, Driver's Daily Log, dated August 2, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by

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reference. The special investigators found eight (8) violations of this type. Savannah Trader's failure to require driver to cease his driving at the 14th hour is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(2) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3 and authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

- c. During the transportation described in paragraph b., above, driver Julius Kyule drove 3 hours past the 11th hour since coming on duty. Driver drove a total of 14 hours without having taken the required 10 hours off duty. *See*, Attachment "D". Savannah Traders' failure to require its driver, to take 10 consecutive hours off duty after driving 11 hours is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(i) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3 and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- d. On August 1, 2016, Savannah Traders required or permitted its driver, Julius Kyule, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Freightliner, VIN ending in 37463, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2004 Great Dane (VST) trailer, VIN ending in 700910, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Lee's Summit, Missouri to New Orleans, Louisiana. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated August 1, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "E" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Julius Kyule failed to take a required 30 minute break by driving for ½ hour after more than 8 hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off duty or

sleeper berth period of at least 30 minutes. This driver drove in violation from 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The special investigators found six (6) violations of this type. Savannah Traders' failure to provide "rest breaks" to its drivers if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeper-berth period of at least 30 minutes is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and as implemented by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

e. On September 17, 2016, Savannah Traders required or permitted its driver, John C. Lewis, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2003 Freightliner, VIN ending in 67413, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2013 Great Dane, VIN ending in 226754, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Pryor, Oklahoma to Front Royal, Virginia. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated September 17, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "F" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver John C. Lewis had failed to produce 13 days of records of duty status to its employer. The special investigators found 13 violations of this type. Savannah Traders' failure to require its driver to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a and

authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine in the amount of \$500.

- f. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, the driver was making deliveries while showing off duty on his hours of service record. *See*, Attachment "B" showing the deliveries. *See*, Driver's Record of Duty Status, dated September 25, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "G" and is hereby incorporated by reference. The special investigators found eight (8) violations of this type. Savannah Traders' falsifying records of duty status is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.
- g. On September 22, 2016, Savannah Traders required or permitted its driver, Getachew Gelgelu, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Kenworth, VIN ending in 865998, GVWR 47,000 lbs., pulling a 2008 Utility (RST) trailer, VIN ending in 335618, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Bessemer, Alabama to Ardmore, Tennessee. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report, dated September 22, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "H" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Getachew Gelgelu had not completed a post-trip vehicle inspection report on the commercial motor vehicles operated. Savannah Traders' failure to require each of its drivers to prepare a DVIR in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on each vehicle operated

and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a)(1), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$200.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Savannah Traders committed seven (7) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,550 for seven (7) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that Savannah Traders be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Savannah Traders submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Savannah Traders because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108.

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13. The Commission finds Savannah Traders committed seven (7) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Savannah Traders LLC, of Overland Park, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$2,550 civil penalty for seven (7) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Savannah Traders is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, Savannah Traders is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.

C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. <u>Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of</u> this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. <u>Failure to</u> timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Savannah Traders' right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$2,550 civil penalty against Savannah Traders, and ordering Savannah Traders to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.

F. Failure to pay the \$2,550 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Savannah Traders' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.
