PREHEARING OFFICER ORDER SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. The Commission has designated Samuel Feather, Deputy General Counsel, to act as Prehearing Officer in this proceeding. Having reviewed the files and records, and being duly advised, the Prehearing Officer makes the following findings:

- 1. On May 15, 2015, Stephen and Karen Gradwohl filed a Formal Complaint with the Commission against Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L) regarding a dispute as to who operates an underground electric line that powers the Complainant's building.
- 2. On June 11, 2015, KCP&L filed its Answer and Motion to Dismiss, with an errata being filed on June 12, 2015 containing an attachment omitted from the June 11, 2015 filing. KCP&L denies responsibility for marking the line in question.²
- 3. On September 28, 2015, Staff filed its Report and Recommendation (R&R). Staff recommended the Commission find that KCP&L, for purposes of utility locating, is the operator of underground electric conductors that are upstream of its metering equipment.³ Staff further recommends the Commission find KCP&L did not provide accurate locates of the tolerance zone

for the electric service in question as required under the Kansas Underground Utility Damage

Prevention Act.⁴

- 4. On November 19, 2015, KCP&L filed its Response to Staff's Report and Recommendation. KCP&L denied that it had inaccurately marked the line in question.⁵
- 5. On December 10, 2015, the Commission Staff filed its Reply to KCP&L's Response to Staff's Report and Recommendation.
 - 6. On December 18, 2015, KCP&L filed its Response to Staff's Reply.
- 7. The parties have informed the Prehearing Officer that they have engaged in settlement negotiations and were unable to reach agreement. Therefore, the Prehearing Officer finds that in order to resolve this proceeding an oral argument and evidentiary hearing is necessary to allow the Commission to adequately understand the unique legal implications raised in the complaint as well as create an evidentiary record from which to make a decision. The following procedural schedule is hereby set forth for the parties:
