This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Dane Shockey for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on March 10, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator(s) Gary Goeller. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Dane Shockey has been assessed a \$1,750 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. A check must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the ninety (90) days from the date of the attached Order and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the attached Order. Transportation Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Dane Shockey must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and must mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,750 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

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PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Dane Shockey (Dane Shockey) operates as a private motor carrier and exempt from Commission authority. Dane Shockey operates under USDOT number 1309157.
- 5. Dane Shockey is a sole proprietor and owns one CLD-required commercial motor vehicle.
- 6. Dane Shockey is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls building materials, construction and decorative rock/compost.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on March 10, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator(s) Gary Goeller conducted a compliance review of the operations of Dane Shockey. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Goeller identified five (5) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On January 30, 2017, Dane Shockey required or permitted its driver, Dane Shockey, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1997 Ford truck, VIN ending in 21933, GVWR 56,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSHP04231455,

dated January 30, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Dane Shockey was not enrolled in a controlled substance and/or alcohol random testing program as required for a CDL driver. The carrier's failure to establish an alcohol and/or controlled substances program for its CDL driver that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dane Shockey failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.
- c. On February 28, 2017, Dane Shockey required or permitted its driver, Dane Shockey, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1997 Ford truck, VIN ending in 21933, GVWR 56,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a delivery receipt, dated February 28, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by

reference. At the time of this transportation, Dane Shockey failed to make a record of duty status showing the date worked, start time, end time and the total number of hours worked. The special investigator found 28 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period, and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

- d. During the transportation described in paragraph c., above, Dane Shockey failed to prepare a Daily Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR) on the commercial motor vehicle operated at the completion of the day worked. The special investigator found 14 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to prepare a Daily Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR) in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on the commercial motor vehicle operated and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.
- e. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dane Shockey failed to obtain the commercial motor vehicle inspector's qualifications for inspections. The carrier's failure to retain evidence of the inspector's qualifications to inspect the commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49

C.F.R. 396.19(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Dane Shockey committed five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,750 for five (5) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- Staff further recommends that Dane Shockey be required to attend a Commission-10. sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Transportation Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that Dane Shockey submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Dane Shockey because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Dane Shockey committed five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety

Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Dane Shockey, of Kechi, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$1,750 civil penalty for five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Dane Shockey is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Transportation Staff with written proof of attendance.
- C. Dane Shockey is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. On March 28, 2017, this Penalty Order was mailed via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, No. 7016 1970

0001 0574 1171. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Dane Shockey's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,750 civil penalty against Dane Shockey, and ordering Dane Shockey to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Transportation Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.

- E. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,750 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. A check shall be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission and submitted for payment. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payment shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.
- G. Failure to pay the \$1,750 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions

of this Order, may result in suspension of Dane Shockey's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.





- Copies of the regulations, forms, interpretations, and manuals are available from a variety of sources. Check the FMCSA website for a current list of suppliers. www.fmcsa.dot.gov/safety-security/eta/index.htm
- 2. A copy of your carrier profile can be obtained at no cost from the FMCSA Portal (https://portal.fmcsa.dot.gov/login).
- 3. Ensure that all vehicles are properly marked with your name or trade name and U.S. DOT number. If your vehicles are also periodically operating for other carriers, they must be marked with that carrier's name and U.S. DOT#.
- 4. Conduct periodic internal reviews of your driver qualification, hours of service control, maintenance, accident analysis/reporting, training, and other safety systems to ensure continued compliance with the FMCSR.
- 5. Obtain a copy of each driver's driving record and review it annually.
- 6. Review the circumstances under which a CDL is required. CDL and drug testing rules apply to both interstate and intrastate commerce.
- 7. Ensure that all drivers are fully and properly qualified before operating in interstate commerce. Maintain a complete file as required for each driver, documenting the qualification process.
- 8. Require all drivers to prepare complete and accurate records of duty status for each day, and to submit them within 13 days. Maintain all duty status records on file, with all supporting documents, for at least 6 months.
- **9.** Ensure that all documents supporting records of duty status (such as toll, fuel repair and other on-the-road expense receipts, as well as invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, etc.) are kept on file for at least 6 months.
- 10. Toll receipts and other on-the-road expense receipts, invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, and other "supporting document" must be kept on file for six (6) months. This requirement also applies to records generated by the use of owner-operators. You may keep legible photocopies in lieu of originals.
- 11. If you want some drivers to use the 100 air-mile radius exemption, make sure that the drivers meet all terms of the exemption, including being released from duty no more than 12 hours from when they report for duty. Logs must be prepared if a driver does not meet the 12 hour requirement.
- 12. Require all drivers to prepare a written inspection report for each day a vehicle is operated. Ensure that each report is signed by the driver, certified, and reviewed if defects are reported.
- 13. Review with your drivers periodically the procedures for doing pre-trip and post-trip inspections. Ensure that safety defects reported by drivers on their Vehicle Inspection Reports (VIR) are repaired before the vehicle is re-dispatched. Require drivers to prepare Vehicle Inspection Reports on a daily basis. Keep them on file for 90 days.
- 14. This report contains citations of regulations that are deemed serious in nature and could result in penalties against your company and/or your drivers.

- NOTICE: A pattern and/or repeated violations of the same or related acute or critical regulations (violations of the same Part in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations) will cause the maximum penalties allowed by law to be assessed under Section 222 of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 (MCSIA). A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.
- NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carner Management Information System (MCMIS). Records are available 24 hours a day via Web request. Motor carriers should visit the following website for more information: http://www.psp.fmcsa.dot.gov/Pages/default.aspx


