#### NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Trinity Oilfield Services, Inc. (Trinity Oilfield) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on December 13, 2019, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Verna Jackson. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2020 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on July 16, 2019. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** Trinity Oilfield has been assessed a \$1,000 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,000, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Trinity Oilfield to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <a href="http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm">http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm</a>. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

**IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing.** A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Trinity Oilfield must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-542.

**IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:** Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,000 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

## **PENALTY ORDER**

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

## I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 2018 Supp. 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f., doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

## II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Trinity Oilfield Services, Inc. (Trinity Oilfield) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 1811771.
- 5. Mike Hammersmith attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on November 5, 2018, on behalf of Trinity Oilfield.
- 6. Trinity Oilfield is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls oil field equipment.

## III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on December 13, 2019, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Verna Jackson conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of Trinity Oilfield. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On November 21, 2019, Trinity Oilfield required or permitted its driver, Jacob Philbern, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a

1978 Cooper, VIN ending in 050, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Seward, Kansas to Ellinwood, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by an Intrastate Move statement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Trinity Oilfield did not have Kansas Corporation Commission common motor carrier authority to operate point-to-point in the state of Kansas. The carrier's commercial operations of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

b. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, Trinity Oilfield used a driver not having a valid commercial driver's license to operate the commercial motor vehicle. The carrier's operations using a driver without a CDL is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 392.2, authorized by K.S.A. 8-2,125. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

## IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Trinity Oilfield committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,000 for two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Trinity Oilfield be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that Trinity Oilfield submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

## V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Trinity Oilfield because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 13. The Commission finds Trinity Oilfield committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

## THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Trinity Oilfield Services, Inc., of Hutchinson, KS is hereby assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.


- B. Trinity Oilfield is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order.
- D. Trinity Oilfield is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Trinity Oilfield's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,000 civil penalty against Trinity Oilfield, and ordering a representative from Trinity Oilfield to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,000 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,000 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.
- H. Failure to pay the \$1,000 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Trinity Oilfield's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

## **Process Breakdown and Remedies**

## **BASIC: Unsafe Driving**

**Process Breakdown: Monitoring and Tracking** 

Trinity Oilfield Services Inc allowed a driver to operate their CDL CMV without being in possession of a valid operator's license. The driver's operator's license was suspended in September. The motor carrier should not have allowed a disqualified driver in the operation of a CDL CMV. Carrier needs to educate their drivers on the rules of requiring the operator to maintain a valid license.

## **Specific Recommended Remedies**

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking:

1. Review and retain each driver's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) at least annually to ensure compliance with company policies, Federal regulations, and State and local laws and ordinances related to safe driving. If a driver seems to have license-related problems, the MVR should be reviewed more often. Random MVR checks in addition to annual checks are also effective. File the MVR in each driver's driver qualification file after review.


