This is a notice of a penalty assessment against American Diesel LLC (American Diesel) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on October 18, 2023, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators Penny Fryback and Erica Pargas. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: American Diesel has been assessed a \$6,900 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$6,900, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of American Diesel to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. American Diesel must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\frac{1}{2}

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT</u>: Failure to pay the penalty of \$6,900 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

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PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On October 18, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigators (SIs) Penny Fryback and Erica Pargas, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of American Diesel LLC (American Diesel or Carrier). American Diesel is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 3097576.
- 2. On October 25, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$6,900 to be issued to American Diesel based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SIs Penny Fryback and Erica Pargas identified forty-one (41) violation(s),

accounting for six (6) count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²

- 3. Additionally, Staff recommends that American Diesel be required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 4. Staff further recommends American Diesel submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴
- 5. Finally, Staff recommends that American Diesel submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.⁵ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 6. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in

Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 8. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. American Diesel LLC, of Dodge City, KS is hereby assessed a \$6,900 civil penalty for forty-one (41) violation(s), accounting for six (6) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. American Diesel is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information

explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. American Diesel is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of American Diesel's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁶
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$6,900 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$6,900 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking

Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$6,900 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of American Diesel's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

American Diesel LLC is a motor carrier (MC) possessing pubic for-hire operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling grain, feed, hay and meat. American Diesel LLC operates under USDOT 3097576. On October 18, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigators (SIs) Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of American Diesel LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SIs identified forty one (41) violations, accounting for six (6) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SIs, staff recommends penalty of \$6,900 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On October 18, 2023, Commission Staff SIs Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of American Diesel LLC. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: No MC or driver may make a false report in connection with a duty status. Supporting Documents: On April 5, 2023, American Diesel LLC required or permitted its driver, Adan Antonio Mendez Ramirez, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2004 Kenworth, VIN ending in 7212, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Yellville, Arkansas to Dodge City, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by driver, Adan Antonio Mendez's ELD log and Trip Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2. During this transport, Mr. Ramirez hauled a load of bone meal. After eight hours of driving Mr. Ramirez was required to take a thirty minute break. Mr. Ramirez continued to drive while "off-duty" or on "break" traveling from McCune, Kansas to Cherryvale, Kansas. The relevant ELD entries are highlighted in Exhibit 2.

<u>Violation:</u> American Diesel LLC was found to be in violation of allowing driver Adan Antonio Mendez to falsify the drivers hours of service (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 4 to 5**). Thirty-two (32) violations were discovered.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Staff deems violations alleging fraud to be intentional and therefore recommends an enhanced fine of \$5,000.

Count Two (2 of 6)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 396.17, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the MC pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

Supporting Documents: On August 8, 2023, American Diesel LLC required or permitted its driver, Pedro Guilloty Rodriguez, to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2014 Peterbilt truck, VIN ending in 5063, GVWR 51,200 lbs., pulling a 2016 Wilson straight trailer, VIN ending in 1479, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Miami, Oklahoma to Cimarron, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Driver Vehicle Examination Report (DVER) No. KSHP03132102, attached hereto as Exhibit 3. The MC could not produce an annual inspections that were not correctly filled out for the CMVs operated in this transport. A copy of the annual inspections are attached hereto as Exhibit 4. For the Annual Inspection on the 2014 Peterbilt truck, the inspector checked off as "OK" the "Motorcoach Seats." This unit is truck tractor and not a bus. The annual inspection on the Wilson trailer completed by the inspector also had several errors. The inspector checked off as "OK" the "Low Pressure Air Warning Device" and "Vacuum Systems" despite that

fact this vehicle is a trailer. Additionally the inspector listed as "N/A" the "Torque, Radius or Tracking Component" which should have been inspected.

<u>Violation:</u> American Diesel LLC operated a CMV without an annual inspection (Exhibit 1, Page 5). Five (5) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

Count Three (3 of 6)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must require its driver to submit to a pre-employment controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result prior to requiring or permitting the driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle.

Supporting Documents: On August 1, 2023, American Diesel LLC required or permitted its driver, Pedro Guilloty Rodriguez, to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2014 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 5063, GVWR 51,200 lbs., in interstate commerce from Miami, Oklahoma to Cimarron, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by driver Pedro Guilloty Rodriguez's ELD log, attached hereto as Exhibit 5. The MC did not obtain a negative pre-employment test for this driver until August 3, 2023, two days after this transport.

<u>Violation:</u> American Diesel LLC allowed a driver to operate a CMV prior to obtaining a negative pre-employment test (Exhibit 1, Page 5 to 6). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Four (4 of 6)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 382.601(d), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must obtain a certificate of receipt indicating the driver received the MC's written controlled substance and alcohol policy and educational material distributed pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 382.601(b).

<u>Supporting Documents:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in Count Three, above. The policy provided to the SIs by the MC did not meet the statutory requirements.

<u>Violation:</u> American Diesel LLC failed to provide a Drug & Alcohol Policy that meets all the requirements of 382.601(b) 1-12 (**Exhibit 1, Page 6**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Five (5 of 6)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 382.701(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: The MC must conduct an annual inquiry into its drivers with the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: On November 30, 2022, American Diesel LLC required or permitted its driver, Cruz Perez Hernandez, to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2004 Freightliner, VIN ending in 0895, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2018 Wilson straight trailer, VIN ending in 4899, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Catoosa, Oklahoma to Montezuma, Kansas. This

transport is evidenced by DVER No. OKW600170598 attached hereto as **Exhibit 6**. A copy of the MC's DACH search history is attached hereto as **Exhibit 7**. The MC did not conduct an annual query of Mr. Hernandez until September 19, 2023.

<u>Violation:</u> American Diesel LLC failed to conduct an annual query in the DACH on driver, Cruz Perez Hernandez (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 6**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$150.

Count Six (6 of 6)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> K.S.A. 8-2,134(c), K.S.A 8-2,125, *et. seq.*, and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must not allow its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle if the driver has been a resident of Kansas for over thirty days and has not obtained a valid, Class A commercial driver's license (CDL) issued by the state of Kansas.

<u>Supporting Documents:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. Adan Antonio Mendez Ramirez's employment Application, attached hereto **Exhibit 8**, wherein Mr. Ramirez states he had lived in Dodge City for four years and seven months. Although, Mr. Ramirez had resided in Kansas for over four years, but had failed to obtain a Kansas issued CDL. Mr. Ramirez was operating using a CDL issued by the state of New Mexico, a copy of which his attached hereto as **Exhibit 9**.

<u>Violation</u>: American Diesel LLC's driver, Adan Antonio Mendez failed to obtain a Kansas CDL within 30 days of residing in the State of Kansas (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 7**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find American Diesel LLC committed forty one (41) violations accounting for six (6) specific counts of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$6,900 for forty one (41) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends American Diesel LLC require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends American Diesel LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this

order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that American Diesel LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

Ensure that drivers are qualified by querying applicants, checking with previous employers and references, and obtaining necessary documents regarding driver fitness, such as those pertaining to previous violations, Commercial Driver's License (CDL), medical qualifications, operational qualifications from training, and relevant experience.

Review and evaluate gaps in employment, frequent job changes, incomplete applications, within-company applications and reassignments, operational limitations such as those pertaining to long-combination vehicles (LCVs) and HAZMAT, physical impairments, and controlled-substance and alcohol involvement.
- 4. Check the Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) to ensure that drivers have the proper class of license and "P" or "S" endorsement, and to see if the applicable endorsement on the license has a specific restriction, such as an air-brake restriction.

12. 150-mile exemption terms must be met.
