ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION TO KANSAS MUNICIPAL ENERGY AGENCY AND ADMISSION OF HEATHER STARNES PRO HAC VICE

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This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas

(Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed the pleadings and record, the

Commission makes the following findings and conclusions:

1. On April 30, 2020, The Western Cooperative Electric Association, Inc. (Western)

filed an Application with the Commission for approval to update its Local Access Delivery Service

(LADS) tariff.¹

I. Intervention

2. On May 8, 2020, the Kansas Municipal Energy Agency (KMEA) petitioned to

intervene.²

3. KMEA stated that it has member cities who are served by Western's facilities.³ KMEA further stated its members will be affected by any Commission finding in this matter, and that its interest in this proceeding is not adequately represented by any other party.⁴

4. The Commission shall grant intervention if the petition: (1) is submitted in writing and properly served; (2) states facts demonstrating the petitioner's legal rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other legal interests may be substantially affected by the proceeding or that the petitioner qualifies as an intervenor under any provision of law; and (3) the interests of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings will not be impaired by allowing the intervention.⁵ The Commission has discretion to grant intervention at any time where intervention is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings. ⁶ At any time during a proceeding, the Commission may impose limitations on an intervenor's participation, which may include limiting an intervenor's participation to designated issues in which the intervenor has a particular interest demonstrated by the petition, limiting intervenor discovery, cross-examination and other procedures, and requiring intervenors to consolidate their participation in the proceedings.⁷

5. KMEA submitted its Petition to Intervene in writing, properly served it in accordance with K.S.A. 77-521(a)(1), and stated facts demonstrating its legal rights and interests may be substantially affected by this proceeding under K.S.A. 77-521(a)(2). The Commission finds that KMEA has member cities who are served by Prairie Land, and its intervention will not impair the interests of justice, nor will its participation impede the orderly and prompt conduct of

the proceedings, in accordance with K.S.A. 77-521(a)(3). Thus, the Commission finds that KMEA has met the requirements for intervention in K.S.A. 77-521 and K.A.R. 82-1-225, and therefore, should be granted intervention and full participation in all aspects of this docket.

II. Pro Hac Vice Motion

6. On May 8, 2020, Terry M. Jarret, an attorney in good standing and licensed to practice law in the State of Kansas, filed a Motion for Admission of Heather Starnes *Pro Hac Vice* as attorney on behalf of KMEA, under Kansas Supreme Court Rule 116.⁸ Mr. Jarrett stated he will sign all pleadings and other papers filed with the Commission and will be actively engaged in the case and present for all appearances, to the extent required by the Commission.⁹ The Motion included Ms. Starnes' Verified Application required by Rule 116.

7. The Applicant, Heather Starnes, verified she is in good standing and licensed to practice law in Missouri and Arkansas. The Applicant is not currently, nor has she ever been, the subject of public discipline, including but not limited to suspension or disbarment, in any jurisdiction. The Verified Application lists Ms. Starnes' address as 12 Perdido Circle, Little Rock, Arkansas 72211.¹⁰

8. The Commission finds Ms. Starnes has met the requirements of Supreme Court Rule 116 and shall be granted admission *pro hac vice* to appear on behalf of KMEA. KMEA and Ms. Starnes shall be added to the mailing list, with service of electronic notes, pleadings, testimony, orders, communications, and other documents directed to the following:

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THEREFORE, THE COMMISISON ORDERS:

- A. KMEA is granted intervention.
- B. Heather Starnes is granted admission *pro hac vice* on behalf of KMEA.
- C. This Order will be served by electronic mail, with a note that no hard copy of this

Order will follow. This Order is a procedural order and constitutes non-final agency action.¹¹

D. Parties have 15 days from the dates of electronic service of this Order in which to

petition the Commission for reconsideration.¹²

E. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties to enter further orders as it deems necessary.
