**ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO CEASE TRANSACTING
THE BUSINESS OF AN ELECTRIC PUBLIC UTILITY**

The above captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and record, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. BACKGROUND

1. On September 19, 2017, Westar Energy, Inc. (Westar) filed an Application requesting to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in a portion of Section 5, Township 10 South, Range 10 East, in Pottawatomie County, Kansas. Westar is an electric public utility as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-104. A public hearing was neither requested nor held on Westar's Application.

2. Westar requests the Commission issue an Order granting it the authority to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in the following described territory to wit:

The Northeast ¼ of the Southwest ¼ of Section 5, Township 10 South, Range 10 East, in Pottawatomie County, Kansas, as detailed on the Map marked Exhibit A attached to the Application.

3. On October 9, 2017, the Commission Staff (Staff) submitted its Report and Recommendation dated September 27, 2017, recommending the Commission grant Westar's Application and its request to cease transacting business as an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above.

II. LEGAL STANDARDS AND DISCUSSION

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-131, the Commission has jurisdiction to grant a Certificate to any public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas. K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq., the Retail Electric Suppliers Act (RESA), requires the State of Kansas to be divided into electric service territories in which only one retail electric supplier is established for a given territory. Notwithstanding the mandated single electric provider service territories, RESA also provides that retail electric suppliers may enter into agreements to amend boundaries between their facilities. The agreements are subject to Commission approval, and if so approved, the Commission shall issue a certificate accordingly.¹

5. According to Staff, Westar, Bluestem Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Bluestem), and the City of Wamego, Kansas ("City" or "Wamego") propose exchanging approximately 40 acres of electric service territory located in Pottawatomie County, annexed to the City under Ordinance No. 1680. This annexed area is owned by USD 320 Wamego School District, and currently serves as a sports complex and bus compound. The annexed area is currently served by Westar; however, Westar and Bluestem have reached agreement to transfer the subject territory to the City. Staff notes that Bluestem's territory pertains only to a roadway within the annexed area, which is currently certificated to Bluestem. In addition to the filing of Westar's Application, Bluestem on August 21, 2017, filed a companion Application in Docket No. 18-BECE-081-CCS requesting to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in the

subject territory. Correspondingly, the City of Wamego, on August 24, 2017, filed an Application in Docket No. 18-WAME-096-COC, requesting a Certificate of Convenience and Authority (Certificate) to transact the business of an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above. Staff states that it has reviewed the Applications and determines that the legal descriptions and maps provided with the Applications are accurate and that the legal description is not in conflict with the Commission's Certificate records. Staff recommends the Commission grant the parties' Applications and find that the public convenience will be promoted by approval of this transaction.²

6. The Commission adopts Staff's analysis and recommendation of September 27, 2017, as stated in its Report and Recommendation, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference, and finds that Westar's Application should be granted, and that the public convenience and necessity will be promoted by issuing an Order authorizing Westar to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. The Application of Westar Energy, Inc., filed September 19, 2017, is hereby granted and Westar is authorized to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above.

B. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if service of this Order is by mail, from the date this Order was served, in which to petition the Commission for reconsideration of any issue or issues decided herein. K.S.A. 66-118b; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-529(a)(1).



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the above-captioned filings, City of Wamego (City), Westar Energy, Inc. (Westar) and Bluestem Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Bluestem) are proposing to exchange approximately 40 acres of electric territory, annexed to the City under Ordinance No. 1680. This annexed area is owned by USD 320 Wamego School District. This land is currently used by the school district to operate a sports complex and bus compound. This annexed area is currently served by Westar; however, the two electric suppliers have reached agreement to transfer the area to the City. Bluestem's Cease Application pertains only to a roadway in the annexed area, which is currently certificated to the Cooperative.

Staff recommends that the Commission grant these Applications and find that public convenience will be promoted by this transaction.

BACKGROUND:

On August 24, 2017, the City filed an Application for Certificate in Docket No. 18-WAME-096-COC. On August 21, 2017, Bluestem had already filed a Companion Application to Cease in Docket No. 18-BECE-081-CCS. Westar later filed its Companion to Cease on September 19, 2017, in Docket No. 18-WSEE-125-CCS.

The Commission has jurisdiction to grant a Certificate to any public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas.¹ K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq. the Retail Electric Suppliers Act (RESA) requires the State of Kansas to be divided into electric service territories in which only one retail electric supplier is established for a given territory. Notwithstanding the mandated single electric provider service territories, RESA also provides that retail electric suppliers can enter into agreements to amend boundaries between their facilities. The agreements are filed in the form of Certificates and, if approved by the Commission, Certificates to amend territory are issued.

In these Applications, the three electric suppliers have agreed that the City should provide service to the USD 320 sports complex and bus compound. This complex is currently served by Westar, but a planned expansion of this facility has made service from the City more economically feasible, due to the location of existing three-phase facilities. Westar has agreed to release the area being requested by the City. The Cease Application by Bluestem covers a roadway that is currently certificated to the cooperative.

ANALYSIS:

Staff has reviewed the Applications and determined that the legal descriptions and maps provided with the Applications are accurate. Staff has also confirmed that the legal descriptions are not in conflict with the Commission's Certificate records. The proposed revision to the affected territories' legal description is included as Attachment 1 to this Report and Recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission grant these Applications and find that public convenience will be promoted by this transaction.
