This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on November 30, 2016, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators Michael Heenan and Jared Smith. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$3,200 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. <u>Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation</u> <u>Commission</u>. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation <u>Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road</u>, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the <u>docket number of this proceeding</u>. <u>Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124</u>, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. <u>A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting</u> forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1. 1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the 2. Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Ace Transports LLC (Ace Transports) obtained private operating authority from the Commission on September 13, 2016, and operates under KSMCID number 169479 and USDOT number 2365172.

5. Glenna Edwards attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on March 11, 2013, on behalf of Ace Transports.

6. Ace Transports is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, logs, poles, beams, lumber, building materials, machinery, and large objects.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on November 30, 2016, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigators Michael Heenan and Jared Smith conducted a compliance review of the operations of Ace Transports. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Heenan and Mr. Smith identified seven (7) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

> a. On December 23, 2015, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, Christopher Collins, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2012 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221582, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Cherryvale, Kansas to Johnstown, Colorado.

This trip is evidenced by Crash – Detail View Report #C02015001756, dated December 23, 2015, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of the compliance review, the special investigators were not provided post-accident testing results for the driver of this trip. Ace Transports' failure to test its driver for alcohol and controlled substances as soon as practicable following a recordable accident is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.303(a) and (b), as authorized by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and as adopted by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

b. On September 15, 2016, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, Jess N. Hall, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221356, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Salina, Kansas to Fort Collins, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. COPF04400856, dated September 15, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, drivers Jess Hall and Daniel Allen were not listed in the consortium testing pool. Five former drivers were still listed in the testing pool. Ace Transports' failure to ensure that each driver selected for random alcohol and controlled substance testing has an equal chance of being selected each time selections are made is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.305(i)(2), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Ace Transports had not designated a supervisor to undergo reasonable suspicion training for alcohol and controlled substances. The carrier received this same violation in compliance review conducted on April 22, 2015. The carrier's inability to produce documentation of this training and its failure to have a designated person to attend 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and an additional 60 minutes of training on controlled substances use is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.603 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$200.
- d. On January 22, 2016, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, Tyler Edwards, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2012 Kenworth, VIN ending in 301205, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Cherryvale, Kansas to Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. This trip is evidenced by Crash Detail View Report # OK0XB0000416, dated January 22, 2016, a copy which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Ace Transports failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The carrier was cited for this same violation in a compliance review conducted in April 22, 2015. Ace Transports' failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the

MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$200.

- e. On September 15, 2016, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, James Weber, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2011 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221582, GVWR 60,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Aurora, Colorado to Cherryvale, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Logs, dated September 15-16, 2016, copies of which are attached hereto as Attachment "E" and are hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver James Weber drove beyond the 14th hour after coming on duty. The special investigators found four (4) violations of this type. Ace Transports' failure to require its driver to cease driving at the 14th hour is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(2) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3 and authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- f. During the transportation described in paragraph e., above, driver James Weber drove after more than 11 hours. See Driver's Daily Log attached hereto as Attachment "E". The special investigators found three (3) violations of this type. Ace Transports' failure to require its driver, to take 10 consecutive hours off duty after driving 11 hours is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(i) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3 and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

g. On October 26, 2016, Ace Transports driver Christopher Lewis' log book showed him as off duty from October 27, 2016 through October 31, 2016. *See*, Driver's Daily Log, dated October 27-31, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "F" and is hereby incorporated by reference. However, credit card receipts show Christopher Lewis making purchases during this time period. *See*, Transaction Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "G" and is hereby incorporated by reference. The special investigators found two (2) violations of this type. Ace Transports' falsifying records of duty status is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Ace Transports committed seven (7) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,200 for seven (7) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that Ace Transports be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

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11. Finally, Staff recommends that Ace Transports submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Ace Transports because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds Ace Transports committed seven (7) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Ace Transports LLC, of Cherryvale, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$3,200 civil penalty for seven (7) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Ace Transports is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, Ace Transports is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.

C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Ace Transports's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$3,200 civil penalty against Ace Transports, and ordering Ace Transports to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.

F. Failure to pay the \$3,200 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Ace Transports's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.
