NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT 18-TRAM-192-PEN

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. (Inman Irrigation Specialists) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 13, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Doug Handy. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

Inman Irrigation Specialists has been assessed a \$2,150 penalty. You have 30 days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$2,150 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

INMAN IRRIGATION SPECIALISTS IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

New Entrant motor carriers are eligible for a one-time, fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed motor carriers. You have to agree to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the reduction. A fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the attached Order may be available if:

(1) within 15 days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier signs and submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel at the above address;

(2) within 30 days from the date of the Penalty Order, the carrier submits to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future;

(3) within 30 days from the date of the Penalty Order, the carrier sends an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance must be submitted to the undersigned Litigation Counsel shortly thereafter; and

(4) within 18 months from the date of the Penalty Order, the carrier must submit to a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

If a carrier is approved for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment assessing the reduced penalty and setting out the terms and conditions stated above may be issued by the Commission. Payment of the reduced penalty of \$1,075 would be due within 30 days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. must file within 15 days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$2,150 within 30 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within 15 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming final and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced. If Inman Irrigation Specialists submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement as explained above, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment may be issued assessing the reduced penalty of \$1,075 and that payment would become due within 30 days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT

18-TRAM-192-PEN

Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. (Inman Irrigation Specialists) hereby submits this Reduced Penalty Agreement for approval of a fifty percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the Penalty Order dated November 16, 2017. Inman Irrigation Specialists has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:

1. Inman Irrigation Specialists has submitted, within 15 days from the date of the Penalty Order this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel.

2. Inman Irrigation Specialists will, within 30 days from the date of the Penalty Order, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to become eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.

3. Inman Irrigation Specialists will, within 30 days from the date of the Penalty Order, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.

4. Inman Irrigation Specialists will be available within 18 months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. understands that if approved, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment will be issued by the Commission assessing a reduced penalty of \$1,075, and set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, Inman Irrigation Specialists will have 30 days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the 2. Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. (Inman Irrigation Specialists) has private operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 953578.

5. Merle Mahoney attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on March 28, 2016, on behalf of Inman Irrigation Specialists.

6. Inman Irrigation Specialists is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls farm supplies and irrigation parts.

7. Inman Irrigation Specialists is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on September 13, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Doug Handy conducted a compliance review of the operations of Inman Irrigation Specialists. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On June 16, 2017, Inman Irrigation Specialists required or permitted its driver, Gary Regehr, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2012 Dodge, VIN ending in 129852, GVWR 14,000 lbs.,

pulling a 2012 PJ trailer, VIN ending in 1165553, GVWR 25,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Inman, Kansas to Assaria, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Mr. Regehr's Time Card and Job Ticket, dated June 16, 2016, copies of which are attached hereto as Attachment "B" and are hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Inman Irrigation Specialists did not have an alcohol/controlled substance testing program for its CDL drivers. The carrier's failure to establish an alcohol and controlled substances testing program for its CDL drivers that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Inman Irrigation Specialists failed to require its driver to complete a Daily Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR) on the commercial motor vehicle operated. The special investigator found 28 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to prepare a DVIR in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on each vehicle operated and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, the commercial motor vehicles operated were involved in a Level 1 roadside inspection (KSHP02191485) on January 23, 2017, and was cited for "Operating a CMV without proof of a periodic inspection." *See*, Driver/Vehicle Examination Report, dated January 23, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. The special investigator reviewed the vehicle maintenance records and discovered the commercial motor vehicles were not periodically inspected until August 10, 2017. The special investigator found three violations of this type. Inman Irrigation Specialists' failure to conduct periodic (annual) inspections on commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(c), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.
- d. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Inman Irrigation Specialists had not made an inquiry into the driver's motor vehicle record (MVR) within the last 12 months. The special investigator found two violations of this type. Inman Irrigation Specialists' failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Inman Irrigation Specialists committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

10. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,150 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

11. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel within 15 days of the date of this Penalty Order the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement and Transportation Staff must approve the carrier's Corrective Action Plan (CAP).

12. Staff recommends Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc. submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within 30 days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.

13. Staff further recommends that a representative from Inman Irrigation Specialists attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within 90 days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.

14. Finally, Staff recommends that Inman Irrigation Specialists submit to one followup safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

15. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Inman Irrigation Specialists because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.

16. The Commission finds a penalty of \$2,150 should be assessed to Inman Irrigation Specialists for committing four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

17. The Commission finds Inman Irrigation Specialists is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed herein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Inman Irrigation Specialists, Inc., of Inman, Kansas is hereby assessed a penalty of \$2,150 for four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$2,150 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

B. A representative from Inman Irrigation Specialists is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within 90 days from the date of this Order, and provide

proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

C. Inman Irrigation Specialists must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within 30 days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described above, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

D. Inman Irrigation Specialists is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

E. If Inman Irrigation Specialists does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the penalty of 2,150 within 30 days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of Inman Irrigation Specialists' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

F. On November 16, 2017, this Order was mailed via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105742871. Service of this Order is deemed complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.

G. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within 15 days from the date of service of this

Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Inman Irrigation Specialists' right to a hearing.

H. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in Investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials Incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN- Inman Irrigation Specialist, Inc. failed to implement an alcohol/controlled substance testing program

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

• Develop a written company policy incorporating by reference all regulations regarding controlled substances and alcohol use, testing, training, and records retention for all employees

• Develop a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all citations for moving violations to carrier management within 24 hours.

• Establish a process to ensure that drivers who are randomly tested can be immediately removed if they are found to be positive and that they do not return to safety-sensitive duties until they have complied with the "return-to-duty" process.

• Establish written policies and procedures that promote, verify, and enforce adherence to all controlled-substance and alcohol rules and regulations. Procedures should be tailored to company operations and should provide specific checks and guldelines for interacting with a consortium, if applicable.

Establish a process to ensure that test results are properly safeguarded from unauthorized disclosure to
prospective employers without specific written consent and from disclosure under any circumstances to insurance
companies and other nonqualified partles, in accordance with regulations.

Develop a policy to ensure that all alcohol testing is conducted immediately before or after the period that
employees are performing a safety-sensitive function. Drivers can be tested on their day off only for controlled
substances. Once notified of their selection, drivers must proceed immediately to the testing facility. If a driver
refuses to go, this should be considered as equivalent to a positive result.

• Consider developing a driver selection protocol that uses valid random-number-generator software on a monthly basis to select, by driver identification number, 5 to 8 percent of drivers for controlled-substance testing and 2 to 5 percent for alcohol testing. This will ensure selection of 50 percent of drivers for controlled-substances testing and 10 percent for alcohol testing per year, given fluctuations in the driver workforce over the course of the year.

• Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written wamings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows controlled-substance and alcohol violations.

• Develop a policy for the periodic review (at least twice per year) of driver qualification files. The motor carrier should not rely on third-party sources, such as insurance agencies. The procedure should include controls to ensure that documents requiring renewals are in place, to remind drivers of expiration dates on medical certificates, so they can schedule another physical examination in advance, and to prevent falsification of documents related to driver qualification.

• Establish a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all vehicle and roadside inspections and moving violations to carrier management within 24 hours, and to notify management of suspended or revoked Commercial Driver's Licenses (CDLs) immediately following notification of suspension/revocation.

Develop a policy for document retention and recordkeeping, including documents that are to be in the possession

address how to deal with issues such as sick leave, vacation, training, suspension, and termination.

 Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows Driver Fitness Violations.

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

 Develop a system of preventive maintenance for compliant, safe, and efficient fleet operations, including a schedule for periodic maintenance, inspection, and recordkeeping. This system should be attuned to manufacturer recommendations, the carrier's own experience, and regulatory requirements.

 Develop a procedure ensuring that vehicle defects that impact safety and/or safety compliance are reported, repaired, and certified before the vehicle is operated.

 Develop procedures to ensure that management is notified of vehicle defects through the use of Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) and other communication channels, such as driver call-in and e-mail from mechanics.
 Develop a policy ensuring that drivers are qualified to complete thorough and timely Driver Vehicle Inspection

Records (DVIRs) by the end of the day of the trip and prior to a subsequent assignment.

Establish a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all roadside inspections to carrier management within 24
hours.

 Develop policies and procedures requiring drivers to immediately notify appropriate management of any roadside vehicle Out-of-Service (OOS) order.

• Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows vehicle maintenance violations.
