Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on June 27, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator(s) Gregory Askren. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

Hoppe's Trucking has been assessed a \$500 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$500 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

HOPPE'S TRUCKING IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND IS ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

New Entrant motor carriers are eligible for a one-time, fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed motor carriers in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$500 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming a final Penalty Order and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced. If Hoppe's Trucking submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement as explained above, an Amended Penalty order may be issued assessing the reduced penalty of \$250 and that payment will become due within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Amended Penalty Order.

I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff before my company can be eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.
- 3. Hoppe's Trucking will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order dated July 13, 2017, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.
- 4. Hoppe's Trucking will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

Jerry W. Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking understands that if approved, Transportation Litigation Counsel will file a Motion for Amended Penalty Order with this Agreement attached to the motion. The Amended Penalty Order will assess Hoppe's Trucking a fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty of \$250, and set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Amended Penalty Order is issued by the Commission, Hoppe's Trucking will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Amended Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Jerry W. Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking (Hoppe's Trucking) has common operating authority from the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2060348.
- 5. Hoppe's Trucking is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, metal, sheets, coils, rolls, logs, poles, beams, lumber, building materials, machinery, large objects, oil field equipment, grain, feed, hay, and construction.
- 6. Hoppe's Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on June 27, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator(s) Gregory Askren conducted a compliance review of the operations of Hoppe's Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On July 26, 2016, Hoppe's Trucking required or permitted its driver, Jerry
 W. Hoppe, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2001
 Freightliner, VIN ending in 07074, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2006
 REIT trailer, VIN ending in 015006, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in intrastate
 commerce from Hudson, Kansas to Cimarron, Kansas. This trip is

evidenced by Detailed Crash Report No. KS2016E12706, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Hoppe's Trucking failed to require driver Jerry W. Hoppe to be medically examined and certified as physically fit to operate a commercial motor vehicle. The carrier's failure to confirm that its drivers are medically examined and certified prior to requiring or permitting the operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintaining documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.41(a)(1)(i), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

b. On February 23, 2017, Hoppe's Trucking required or permitted its driver, Jerry W. Hoppe, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2001 Freightliner, VIN ending in 88251, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2006 REIT trailer, VIN ending in 015006, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Casper, Wyoming to Glasco, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated February 23, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Hoppe's Trucking failed to maintain copies of its driver's motor vehicle record in his driver qualification file. The special investigator found two (2) violations of this type. Hoppe's Trucking's failure to maintain a copy of the motor vehicle record received from each State in the driver qualification file is a

violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.51(b)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Hoppe's Trucking committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$500 for two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Jerry W. Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty if it submits to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the Reduced Penalty Agreement, which is attached to the Notice of Penalty Assessment.
- 11. Staff recommends Jerry W. Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within 30 days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in the this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.

- 12. Staff further recommends that Hoppe's Trucking attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.
- 13. Finally, Staff recommends that Hoppe's Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 14. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Hoppe's Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 15. The Commission finds a penalty of \$500 should be assessed to Hoppe's Trucking for committing two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 16. The Commission finds Hoppe's Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel, within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement, which states it will comply with the reduced penalty terms and obligations set out therein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Jerry W. Hoppe, d/b/a Hoppe's Trucking, of Glasco, Kansas is hereby assessed a penalty of \$500 for two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety

Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$500 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

- B. Hoppe's Trucking is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- C. Hoppe's Trucking must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- D. Hoppe's Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- E. If Hoppe's Trucking does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the full penalty(s) of \$500 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, see K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of Hoppe's Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and

desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

- F. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. On July 13, 2017, this Order was mailed via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105740365. Service of this Order is deemed complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Hoppe's Trucking's right to a hearing.
- G. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

- NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years. The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). 2. FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials indents. Motor carriers currently have the ability to preview how the

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improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS metodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry blases: (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i e , carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA inteventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview my be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

- Enhance the recruitment process to identify and attract qualified applicants for the position of safety director and driver, using outside resources such as industry affiliations, recruiters, and consultants for employee searches and referrals.

- Develop a system of preventive maintenance for compliant, safe, and efficient fleet operations, including a schedule for periodic maintenance, inspection, and recordkeeping. This system should be attuned to manufacturer recommendations, the carrier's own experience, and regulatory requirements.
- Develop a procedure ensuring that vehicle defects that impact safety and/or safety compliance are reported, repaired, and certified before the vehicle is operated
- Develop procedures to ensure that management is notified of vehicle defects through the use of Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) and other communication channels, such as driver call-in and e-mail from mechanics.
- Develop a policy ensuring that drivers are qualified to complete thorough and timely Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) by the end of the day of the trip and prior to a subsequent assignment

- Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply
 with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings,
 suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify
 consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows vehicle maintenance violations.
