NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Huber Sand, Inc. (Huber Sand) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on June 26-27, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Huber Sand has been assessed a \$3,100 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$3,100, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Huber Sand to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Huber Sand must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$3,100 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Huber Sand, Inc. (Huber Sand) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 838870.
- 5. Huber Sand operates in interstate and intrastate commerce, owns 14 truck tractors and 16 trailers, and employs eight (8) CDL drivers.
- 6. Huber Sand is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls sand, gravel and riad material.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on June 26-27, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a compliance review of the operations of Huber Sand. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On April 12, 2018, Huber Sand required or permitted its driver, Marlon Randall Elliott, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a
 2013 Freightliner, VIN ending in 0168, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in intrastate

commerce from US Highway 50 near Garden City, Kansas to its principle place of business in Garden City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number KSHP05120176, dated April 12, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. Driver Marlon Randall Elliott was chosen for a random controlled substance test during the fourth quarter of 2017 and Huber Sand failed to advise Mr. Elliott to obtain the test. Mr. Elliott was never tested during the fourth quarter of 2017. Huber Sand's failure to conduct a controlled substance test on its randomly selected driver during the selection period is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.305(i)(3), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

b. On March 19, 2018, Huber Sand required or permitted its driver, Ramiro J. Galeana-Espino, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2013 Freightliner, VIN ending in 0075, GVWR 52,350 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Liberal, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated March 19, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Huber Sand had failed to provide its CDL drivers with its written policy on alcohol and controlled substance testing. The carrier's failure to provide alcohol and controlled substance use educational materials that complies with 49 C.F.R. 382.601(b) to each of its CDL drivers subsequent to hiring or testing and

- having the driver sign an acknowledgement page to retain in the driver's qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.601(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- c. On April 25, 2018, Huber Sand required or permitted its driver, Ramiro J. Galeana-Espino, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1996 Freightliner, VIN ending in 89954, GVWR 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Liberal, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated April 25, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. Huber Sand hired driver Ramiro J. Galeana-Espino on February 27, 2018, and did not obtain a motor vehicle record on him within 30 days of employment. The carrier's failure to obtain MVRs on its drivers within 30 days of employment and maintain the MVRs in the driver qualification files pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51 is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.23(a)(1) and (b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.
- d. On May 17, 2018, Huber Sand required or permitted its driver, Billie Joe Blevins, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2013 Freightliner, VIN ending in 0079, GVWR 52,350 lbs., in interstate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Rusk, Texas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated May 17, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "E" and is hereby incorporated by

reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Billie Joe Blevins drove more than 11 hours following his last 10 hours off duty. Mr. Blevins drove a total of 13.25 hours on May 17, 2018. The special investigator discovered four (4) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to cease driving after the 11th hour during the 14-hour consecutive hours of driving time after coming on duty following 10 consecutive hours off duty is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(i), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

- e. During the transportation described in paragraph d., above, driver Billie Joe Blevins was on duty from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. without taking a 30 minute rest break. The special investigator discovered 10 violations of this type. Huber Sand's failure to provide "rest breaks" to its drivers if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeper-berth period of at least 30 minutes is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and implemented by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- f. On May 14, 2018, Huber Sand required or permitted its driver, Jose Elias Matute-Garcia to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2013 Freightliner, VIN ending in 0084, GVWR 52,350 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Greeley County, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Delivery Receipt Numbers 106823, 106793, and 106811, all dated May 14, 2018, copies of which are attached hereto as

Attachment "F" and are hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Jose Elias Matute-Garcia submitted a record of duty status showing "off duty 36 hr." *See*, Driver's Daily Log, dated May 14, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "G" and is hereby incorporated by reference. The Delivery Receipts (Attachment "F") indicated Mr. Matute-Garcia as the driver on May 14, 2018. Mr. Matute-Garcia submitted a false record of duty status. The special investigator discovered two (2) violations of this type. Huber Sand's falsifying records of duty status is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Huber Sand committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,100 for six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Huber Sand be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates

and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Huber Sand submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Huber Sand because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Huber Sand committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Huber Sand, Inc., of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a \$3,100 civil penalty for six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Huber Sand is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Huber Sand is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.

- D. On August 21, 2018, this Penalty Order was mailed to Huber Sand via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105745582. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Huber Sand's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$3,100 civil penalty against Huber Sand, and ordering a representative from Huber Sand to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil

penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the

corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$3,100 is due

in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$3,100 must be made

through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system

located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the

penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$3,100 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of

service of this Penalty Order, see K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions

of this Order, may result in suspension of Huber Sand's motor carrier operating authority without

further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not

limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist

orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the

purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.
