## NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on July 31, 2015, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Gary Goeller. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

#### IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed an \$800 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

#### IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

1. Duenec

You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 77-542.

## **IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:**

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

## PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

## I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

#### II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Jose E. Orellana, d/b/a J & R Towing (J & R Towing) obtained common and private operating authority from the Commission on August 31, 2015, and operates under KSMCID number 168509 and USDOT number 2190349.
- 5. Jose E. Orellana attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on August 3, 2015, on behalf of J & R Towing.
- 6. J & R Towing is a common and private motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, motor vehicles, and driveaway/towaway.

## III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on July 31, 2015, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Gary Goeller conducted a compliance review of the operations of J & R Towing. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Goeller identified three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On July 29, 2015, J & R Towing required or permitted its driver, Jose E. Orellana, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 International, in intrastate commerce from Wichita, Kansas to Haysville, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KS00UH000510, dated July 29, 2015, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, J & R Towing failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor

vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The last MVR was dated November 18, 2011. J & R Towing's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, J & R Towing failed to require its driver complete a driver's daily inspection report on the commercial motor vehicle operated. J & R Towing's failure to require each of its drivers to prepare a DVIR in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on each vehicle operated and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$200.
- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, J & R Towing did not have current Kansas Corporation Commission for-hire motor carrier operating authority to operate from point-to-point in the state of Kansas. J & R Towing's commercial operation of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h and authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

## IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find J & R Towing committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$800 for three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that J & R Towing be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety\_meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that J & R Towing submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

## V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over J & R Towing because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds J & R Towing committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

## THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Jose E. Orellana, d/b/a J & R Towing, of Haysville, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$800 civil penalty for three (3) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. J & R Towing is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, J & R Towing is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of J & R Towing's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$800 civil penalty against J & R Towing, and ordering J & R Towing to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.
- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c);

K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may

appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and

amendments thereto.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30)

days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas

Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover,

or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the

Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road,

Topeka, Kansas 66604. The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this

proceeding.

F. Failure to pay the \$800 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this

Penalty Order, see K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may

result in suspension of J & R Towing's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.

Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the

issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies

available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the

purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN:

Carrier owner Jose E Orellana is a owner/operator minor maintenance he performs himself and has documents to reflect other service done outside of his own shop. Carrier needs to put a system in place for daily inspections instead of relying on the annual inspections for continued safe operations.

#### BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Roles and Responsibilities.

- Define and document responsibilities of managers, supervisors, drivers, dispatchers, mechanics, and technicians as related to vehicle inspection, repair, and maintenance policies, including the monitoring and documentation of defects and repairs.
- Define and document roles and responsibilities of mechanics and technicians for differentiating between safety-related defects and other defects and for taking unsafe vehicles Out-of-Service (OOS).
- Empower the person who is in charge of fixing trucks with the authority to complete tasks, such as the
  purchasing of new parts when needed.
- Define and document roles and responsibilities for checking daily completion of Driver Vehicle Inspection Records (DVIRs) and certifying repair before the next assignment.
- Define and document dispatcher responsibilities for planning, scheduling, monitoring, and adjusting fleet operations in accordance with repair and maintenance requirements.
- Define driver responsibilities for informing managers, supervisors, and mechanics/technicians of safety-related defects and repair requirements prior to vehicle operation, including those resulting from vehicle Out-of-Service (OOS) orders.

- 5. DRIVER FITNESS BASIC PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Qualification and Hiring

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN:

Carrier owner Jose E Orellana is a owner operator that has a basic understanding of the FMCSR's but does forget to complete yearly requirements for driver files. Needs to put a system in place for reminders to complete annual MVR's and driver certification of violations and annual review forms.

#### BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Qualification and Hiring.

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## Part B Requirements and/or Recommendations

 Ensure that Motor Vehicle Records (MVRs) from States issuing Commercial Driver's Licenses (CDLs) are reviewed for driver-fitness-related violations of all prospective drivers for the last three years.

• Ensure that drivers are qualified by querying applicants, checking with previous employers and references, and obtaining necessary documents regarding driver fitness, such as those pertaining to previous violations, Commercial Driver's License (CDL), medical qualifications, operational qualifications from training, and relevant experience.

• Review and evaluate gaps in employment, frequent job changes, incomplete applications, within-company applications and reassignments, operational limitations such as those pertaining to long-combination vehicles (LCVs) and HAZMAT, physical impairments, and controlled-substance and alcohol involvement.

Require that drivers fill out the long form for the medical card and be examined by the carrier's preferred doctor
to ensure that their medical qualifications are accurate.

• Ensure that the employment application captures all information required by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), such as whether the driver can handle the physical requirements of the job.

• Enhance the recruitment process to identify and attract qualified applicants for the positions of safety director, dispatcher, and driver by using outside resources such as industry affiliations, recruiters, and consultants for employee searches and referrals.

A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.
- NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's
  employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver
  worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS).
