ORDER DISMISSING PROTEST, CANCELLING EVIDENTIARY HEARING, AND CLOSING DOCKET

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On April 4, 2017, the Commission issued a *Penalty Order* to Seth Farmer (Operator) for failure to comply with K.A.R. 82-3-120.
 - 2. On April 26, 2017, the Operator timely filed its request for a hearing.
- 3. On June 29, 2017, the Commission issued a procedural schedule, which was subsequently amended several times. Ultimately, an evidentiary hearing was scheduled for December 14, 2017.
- 4. On September 29, 2017, Commission Conservation Staff (Staff) filed a Motion to Approve Stipulated Settlement Agreement, under which Agreement the Operator would stipulate to the violation as listed in the Commission's *Penalty Order* and would pay the penalty under an installment plan. The Commission took no action on Staff's Motion.
- 5. On November 8, 2017, Staff filed a Motion to Dismiss Protest, Cancel Evidentiary Hearing, and Close Docket (Motion to Dismiss). Staff stated that "[p]rior to Staff's September 29,

2017, motion, Operator renewed his license. Subsequent to the motion, Operator made all payments

due under the pending agreement. Therefore, Operator is now in full compliance with the Penalty

Order."3 Staff also stated that it "has discussed this matter with Operator, who has stated that he no

longer wishes to contest this matter. Staff proposed that it would file a motion to have the protest

dismissed and the docket closed, and Operator stated he was not opposed."4

6. The Commission accepts Staff's confirmation that the Operator is now in full

compliance with the Commission's *Penalty Order*, finds that no further proceedings are necessary,

and the evidentiary hearing shall be cancelled. The Commission finds that Operator's protest shall

be dismissed, and the docket shall be closed.

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

A. The Operator's protest is dismissed, the remaining procedural schedule, including

the December 14, 2017, evidentiary hearing, is cancelled, and the docket is closed.

B. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if mailed service, from the date

this Order was served in which to petition for reconsideration.⁵

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the

purpose of entering such further orders as it may deem necessary.
