IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$1,000 penalty. Arrowhead Road</u>, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the <u>docket number of this proceeding</u>. <u>Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card</u> <u>information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124</u>, using the KCC's credit card payment form <u>found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf</u>.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. <u>A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting</u> forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas <u>66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order</u>. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1. 1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the 2. Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Nick Breck, d/b/a SD Transportation (SD Transportation) obtained common operating authority from the Commission on November 22, 2016, and operates under KSMCID number 170664 and USDOT number 2282523.

5. Nick Breck attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on October 7, 2014, on behalf of SD Transportation.

6. SD Transportation is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight and RTU Lennox.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on December 8, 2016, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigators Wade Patterson and Jared Smith conducted a compliance review of the operations of SD Transportation. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Patterson and Mr. Smith identified one (1) violation of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

> a. On November 2, 2016, SD Transportation required or permitted its driver, Branden Johnson, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2016 Ford F350, VIN ending in 58401, GVWR 14,000 lbs., pulling a 1984 homemade trailer, VIN ending in 42229MO, GVWR 12,000 lbs. in

interstate commerce from Shawnee, Kansas to Mountain Home, Arkansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated November 2, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, SD Transportation failed to preserve driver's records of duty status supporting documents for six (6) months. The carrier failed to retain fuel receipts, toll receipts, and lodging receipts. The special investigators found 60 violations of this type. SD Transportation's failure to retain driver supporting documents for the record of duty status for a period of six (6) months is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 395.8(k)(1), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3 and authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find SD Transportation committed one (1) violation of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,000 for one (1) violation of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that SD Transportation be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with

written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that SD Transportation submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over SD Transportation because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds SD Transportation committed one (1) violation of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Nick Breck, d/b/a SD Transportation, of Lenexa, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for one (1) violation of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. SD Transportation is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance.
Further, SD Transportation is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.

C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the

specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of SD Transportation's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,000 civil penalty against SD Transportation, and ordering SD Transportation to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.

F. Failure to pay the \$1,000 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of SD Transportation's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

• Ensure that drivers are responsible for informing the carrier when they are sick, keeping accurate Records of Duty Status (RODS), and planning their route so that it can be completed efficiently within Hours-of-Service (HOS) rules.

• Define and document roles and responsibilities of drivers and dispatchers as they pertain to Hours-of-Service (HOS) policies and procedures.
