ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION FOR INTERIM ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed the pleadings and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- On December 15, 2016, in Docket No. 16-KCPE-446-TAR (16-446 Docket), the Commission approved continuation of Kansas City Power & Light's (KCP&L) current portfolio of DSM pilot programs through September 30, 2017.
- 2. On September 11, 2017, KCP&L filed its Application in 18-KCPE-124-TAR, requesting Commission approval to continue five (Low Income Weatherization, Home Energy Analyzer, Business Energy Analyzer, Building Operator Certification and Programmable Thermostat) of its six active pilot Demand-Side Management (DSM) programs for five additional years, with one minor modification. The Application also seeks to discontinue the Demand Response Incentive Rider program.
- 3. On September 11, 2017, the Joint Motion of KCP&L, Commission Staff, and the Citizen's Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) for Interim Order was filed, requesting the

Commission issue an interim order approving the continuation of the five programs beyond the September 30, 2017 end date, until further order of the Commission. The Joint Motion also requests approval to allow KCP&L to use their unspent DSM budget, of approximately \$450,000, to allow continuation of the five programs on an interim basis.

- On September 14, 2017, CURB filed their Petition to Intervene and a Motion for Protective Order and Discovery Order. No other parties have petitioned for intervention in this docket.
- On September 21, 2017, the Commission approved the Order Granting the
 Citizen's Utility Ratepayer Board's Petition to Intervene, Suspension Order, Protective Order and Discovery Order.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. The Joint Motion for Interim Order is granted and the programs set forth above will continue until further order of the Commission.
- B. The unspent DSM budget shall be used to fund the continuation of the programs until the Commission reaches a final decision on the Application.
- C. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if service of this order is by mail, in which to petition the Commission for reconsideration of any issue or issues decided herein.²
- D. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of issuing such further order, or orders, as it may deem necessary.
