**ORDER APPROVING REVISED INTRASTATE ACCESS TARIFFS FOR COLUMBUS
COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, LLC; LAHARPE TELEPHONE COMPANY, INC.;
PIONEER TELEPHONE ASSOCIATION, INC.; AND BLUE VALLEY TELE-
COMMUNICATIONS, INC.**

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and determination. Having examined its files and being fully advised of all matters of record, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. On July 12, 2012, the Commission issued an Order Opening Docket to address intrastate switched access rates for rural local exchange carriers (RLECs). K.S.A. 66-2005(c) provides, subject to Commission approval, RLECs shall adjust their intrastate switched access rates to be in parity with interstate switched access rate levels on March 1 of each odd-numbered year.

2. On April 10, 2013, the Commission directed the RLECs to file by April 25, 2013:¹ (1) revisions to their intrastate access rates and rate structure; (2) their Baseline and Eligible Recovery data utilizing the form provided by the FCC; and (3) their annual certification

that they are not seeking duplicative recovery in Kansas for any costs or revenues already being recovered as Eligible Recovery through ARCs or the CAF. The April 10, 2013 Order also directed the RLECs to file their revised intrastate access tariffs in this docket by May 31, 2013. The effective date for the rates reflected in those tariffs will be July 2, 2013.

3. On May 22, 2013, the Commission issued an Order Approving RLECs' Intrastate Access Rates and Revenues and a Net, Aggregate Reduction to the Kansas Universal Service Fund.²

4. On May 29, 2013, Blue Valley Tele-Communications, Inc. (Blue Valley) filed its proposed intrastate access tariff reflecting the intrastate originating and terminating access rates approved by the Commission in its May 22, 2013 Order. Blue Valley's tariff identified Pioneer Telephone Association, Inc. (Pioneer) as having separate company-specific rates and defined those rates.

5. On May 31, 2013, Columbus Communications Services, LLC (Columbus) and LaHarpe Telephone Company, Inc. (LaHarpe) filed their proposed intrastate access tariffs, in compliance with the Commission's Orders. The proposed intrastate access tariffs reflect the appropriate intrastate access rates approved by the Commission.

6. On June 18, 2013, Staff filed a Report and Recommendation (R&R) advising the Commission approve the revised intrastate access tariffs for Columbus, LaHarpe, Pioneer, and Blue Valley.

7. The Commission adopts the recommendations contained in Staff's R&R and approves the revised intrastate access tariffs for Columbus, LaHarpe, Pioneer, and Blue Valley. The approved tariffs are effective as of July 2, 2013.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED:

- A. The Commission approves the revised intrastate access tariffs for Columbus, LaHarpe, Pioneer, and Blue Valley.
- B. The approved tariffs will take effect on July 2, 2013.
- C. The Commission orders electronic service to be used in this proceeding, including this Order.
- D. The parties have 15 days from the date of electronic service of this Order to petition for Commission reconsideration.³
- E. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of entering such further orders as it may deem necessary.

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
