ORDER ON OPERATOR'S APPEAL OF DEFAULT ORDER

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On August 9, 2018, the Commission issued a *Penalty Order*, finding that Patrick Development Corporation (Operator) committed one violation of K.A.R. 82-3-409.
 - 2. On August 16, 2018, the Operator requested a hearing.
- 3. On September 6, 2018, the Commission issued its Order Designating Prehearing Officer and Setting Prehearing Conference, scheduling a Prehearing Conference for October 11, $2018.^{2}$
- 4. On October 11, 2018, a Prehearing Conference was held. Staff appeared at the Prehearing Conference, but the Operator did not.
- 5. On October 19, 2018, Staff filed a Motion for Default Order (Motion for Default), stating that "Staff believes Operator was properly noticed and afforded the opportunity to attend and

participate in the October 11, 2018, prehearing conference, but failed to do so. Therefore, Staff requests that a default order be issued against Operator."³

6. On October 30, 2018, the Commission issued a *Default Order* granting Staff's Motion for Default Order.⁴ The *Default Order* stated that "any party may file a written motion requesting that this Default Order be vacated and stating the grounds relied upon, within seven calendar days after service of this Order, with three additional days added to account for service by mail."⁵

7. On October 30, 2018, the Operator filed "Patrick Development Corporation to Appeal the Default Order." The Operator stated he wished to appeal the Default Order due to "serious health problems" and an error in the U3C computer program. The Operator stated:

I don't mean to be contentious but I sent it in as N-3 mistakenly with all of the correct information for PDC #3 and KOLAR as it had when the program changed and I made dozens of mistakes did kick back to me a N-3 as being a mistake.

So I resubmitted it as N-3, KOLAR never mentioned that N-3 should have been written as PDC-#3, it took N-3 as being correct so along with all of the other U3C Reports after so many rejections due to filing mistakes, it should have been kicked back to me and I would have written the correct title as PDC #3 instead of N-3.

All of the information for N-3 is correct as it applies to PDC-#3, so since KOLAR did not kick back it to me as it did all of the other mistakes that I had made, KOLAR told me that it had been submitted correctly. The only disagreement is that it should have been called PDC-#3 instead of N-3.8

8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520(c), and based upon the Operator's prima facie allegations in its Appeal of Default Order, the Commission vacates its October 30, 2018 *Default Order*. The Commission finds that a new Prehearing Conference shall be scheduled.
