This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Gregory W Joslin d/b/a Peru Auto Wrecking (Peru Auto Wrecking) for violations of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted February 27, 2024, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Mike Heenan. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Peru Auto Wrecking has been assessed a \$1,800 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,800, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Peru Auto Wrecking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Peru Auto Wrecking must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\frac{1}{2}

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:</u> Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,800 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On February 27, 2024, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Mike Heenan completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Gregory W Joslin d/b/a Peru Auto Wrecking (Peru Auto Wrecking or Carrier). Peru Auto Wrecking is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 1689657.
- 2. On March 21, 2024, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation ("R&R"), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$1,800 to be issued to Peru Auto Wrecking based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SI Mike Heenan identified five (5) violation(s), accounting for five

- (5) count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²
- 3. Additionally, Staff recommends that Peru Auto Wrecking be required to have a representative responsibility for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 4. Staff further recommends Peru Auto Wrecking submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴
- 5. Finally, Staff recommends that Peru Auto Wrecking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.⁵ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 6. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in

Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 8. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. Gregory W Joslin d/b/a Peru Auto Wrecking of Peru, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$1,800 civil penalty for five (5) violation(s), accounting for five (5) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Peru Auto Wrecking is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Peru Auto Wrecking is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this

order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. Peru Auto Wrecking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Peru Auto Wrecking's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁶
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,800 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,800 must be made

through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$1,800 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of Peru Auto Wrecking's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁷ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Gregory W Joslin is a motor carrier (MC) operating as a public for-hire and private carrier, primarily hauling motor vehicles. Gregory W Joslin operates under USDOT 1689657. On February 27, 2024, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Mike Heenan completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Gregory W Joslin. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified five (5) violations accounting for five (5) specific counts of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carries a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, staff recommends penalty of \$1,800 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On February 27, 2024, Commission Staff SI Mike Heenan conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Gregory W Joslin. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 5)

<u>Juris diction</u>: K.S.A. 8-142 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must obtain a proper commercial registration for its commercial motor vehicle.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: On December 6, 2023, Gregory W Joslin required or permitted its driver, Gregory W. Joslin, to operate a commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2000 GMC Rollback, VIN ending in 1101, GVWR 24,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce within Peru, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by BOL #430987, attached here to as **Exhibit 2**. The carrier provided an expired Kansas Registration from 2022, attached here to as **Exhibit 3**. The MC could not provide current registration for the vehicle involved in this transportation.

<u>Violation</u>: Gregory W Joslin operated a commercial motor vehicle on this date with no valid Kansas Registration on his only listed vehicle. KS#696550 had been expired since 2022 (**Exhibit 1, Page 3**). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

Count Two (2 of 5)

Juris diction: 49 C.F.R. 390.19 T (a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

Intent of Law: The MC must file Form MCS-150 and/or Form MCS150B.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The carrier's inactivated MICMIS profile attached to as **Exhibit 4**. The MC had been inactivated as of November 5, 2009 for failure to update its MCS-150 form with the FMCSA since September 19, 2007.

<u>Violation</u>: Gregory W Joslin operated a commercial motor vehicle without filing a Form MCS-150 or MCS150B (Exhibit 1, Page 3). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$200.

Count Three (3 of 5)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 391.51(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A.66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must maintain a driver qualification file pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51. <u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The MC was unable to provide any driver file information that is required to be included in a driver qualification file.

<u>Violation</u>: Gregory W Joslin operated a commercial motor vehicle on this date without having a valid Driver Qualification file on himself (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3 to 4**). One (1) violation discovered. **Recommendation**: Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

Count Four (4 of 5)

Juris diction: K.S.A. 66-1330 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must obtain proper Kansas Corporation Commission authority to operate as a Wrecker before conducting intrastate commercial operations

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The MC's KTRAN Profile Page is attached to as **Exhibit 5**. The KTRAN Profile Page states the MC does not possess KCC authority.

<u>Violation</u>: Gregory W Joslin operated a commercial motor vehicle on this date without having valid Kansas Corporation Commission for hire authority (Wrecker) (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 4**). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

Count Five (5 of 5)

<u>Juris diction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 396.17(c), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the MC pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above. The MC could not provide an annual inspection for the vehicle involved in this transport. <u>Violation</u>: Gregory W Joslin operated a commercial motor vehicle that had not had a valid period annual inspection (Exhibit 1, Page 4). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find Gregory W Joslin committed five (5) violations, accounting for five (5) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.


Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,800 for five (5) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Gregory W Joslin require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends Gregory W Joslin submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed

information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Gregory W Joslin submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.




