This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC (Skylar Mae) for violations of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted April 30, 2024, by a Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Skylar Mae has been assessed a \$2,950 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$2,950, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Skylar Mae to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Skylar Mae must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.¹

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$2,950 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. On April 30, 2024, a Commission Staff ("Staff") Special Investigator ("SI")completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC (Skylar Mae or Carrier). Skylar Mae is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 3795199.

2. On May 2, 2024, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation ("R&R"), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$2,950 to be issued to Skylar Mae based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigation, the SI identified eight (8) violation(s), accounting for six (6) count(s), of the Motor

Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carries a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²

3. Additionally, Staff recommends that Skylar Mae be required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

4. Staff further recommends Skylar Mae submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴

5. Finally, Staff recommends that Skylar Mae submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.⁵ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

6. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114b, and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or

procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

8. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. Skylar Mae is hereby assessed a \$2,950 civil penalty for eight (8) violation(s), accounting for six (6) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Skylar Mae is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

C. Skylar Mae is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed

information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

D. Skylar Mae is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.

E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Skylar Mae's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁶ For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁷

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$2,950 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$2,950 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$2,950 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of Skylar Mae's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁸ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC is a motor carrier (MC) possessing public for-hire operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling dumpsters. Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC operates under USDOT 3795199. On April 30, 2024, a Commission Staff ("Staff") Special Investigator (SI) completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit** 1 and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified eight (8) violations, accounting for six (6) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carries a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, Staff recommends penalty of \$2,950 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On April 30, 2024, a Commission Staff SI conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: Requires the MC to establish an alcohol and controlled substances testing program for its CDL drivers that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105. **Supporting Documents**: On April 8, 2024, Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC owner and sole driver, Malack Nyamweya, operated a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2013 Chevrolet Silverado 3500, VIN ending in 9151, GVWR 13,250 lbs., pulling a 2022 Texas Pride trailer, VIN ending in 6183, GVWR 25,999 lbs., in interstate commerce from Linwood, Kansas to Kansas City, Missouri. This transport is evidenced by a Mark II transfer station receipt, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**. The MC was unable to provide evidence that an alcohol and controlled substance testing program was in place at the time of this transport. **Violation**: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC failed to establish an alcohol and controlled substance testing program (**Exhibit 1, Page 3**). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

Count Two (2 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 396.17, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. **Intent of Law**: The MC shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the MC pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

Supporting Documents: This violation took place during the transportation described in Count One, above. Additionally, this violation is evidenced by an expired Annual Vehicle Inspection Label for the 2013 Chevrolet Silverado 3500, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**, and an expired Annual Vehicle Inspection Label for the 2022 Texas Pride trailer, attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**. A receipt for the annual inspection of the truck and trailer, obtained on April 11, 2024, is attached hereto as **Exhibit 5**. The periodic inspections for these units expired in March of 2024, prior to this transport (*see* Annual Vehicle Inspection Labels, attached as part of **Exhibit 3** and **Exhibit 4**). New periodic inspections were not completed until after the transport, on April 11, 2024.

<u>Violation</u>: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC operated commercial motor vehicles prior to obtaining a new periodic inspection (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). Two (2) violations discovered. **Recommendation**: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

Count Three (3 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.711, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. **Intent of Law**: The MC must be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse ("DACH"). **Supporting Documents**: This violation took place during the transportation described in Count One, above. Additionally, this violation is evidenced by screenshots of DACH searches showing the carrier was not registered in the DACH, attached hereto as **Exhibit 6** and **Exhibit 7**. The SI searched for the MC using the USDOT No. and carrier name which did not return a result.

Violation: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC failed to register in the FMSCA DACH (Exhibit 1, Page 3 to 4). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

Count Four (4 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 391.51(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: The MC must maintain a driver qualification file pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51. **Supporting Documents**: This violation took place during the transportation described in Count One, above. The MC could not produce a driver qualification file for the SI to review.

<u>Violation</u>: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC failed to maintain a driver qualification file (Exhibit 1, Page 4). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

Count Five (5 of 6)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 396.3(b)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall have records indicating the nature and due date of the inspections and maintenance operations to be performed on the commercial motor vehicles.

<u>Supporting Documents</u>: This violation took place during the transportation described in Count One, above. The MC could not provide the SI with required maintenance records on the Carrier's two commercial motor vehicles.

<u>Violation</u>: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC failed to maintain records indicating the nature and due date of inspections and maintenance operations (Exhibit 1, Page 4 to 5). Two (2) violations discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

Count Six (6 of 6)

Juris diction: 49 C.F.R. 396.19(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. **Intent of Law**: The MC shall use an inspector of a commercial motor vehicle(s) that has the qualifications and evidence of the qualifications as outlined in 49 C.F.R. 396.19.

Supporting Documents: This violation took place during the transportation described in Count One, above. The MC was unable to provide evidence of the qualifications of the inspector who conducted its periodic inspections.

<u>Violation</u>: Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC failed to maintain evidence of inspector's qualifications (Exhibit 1, Page 5). One (1) violation discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

Staff recommends the Commission find Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC committed eight (8) violations, accounting for six (6) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,950 for eight (8) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Skylar Mae Dumpster Rental LLC submit to one followup safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

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
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
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
