ORDER DIRECTING WESTAR TO SUBMIT BUDGETS

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This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and determination. Having reviewed the pleadings and record, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. On May 7, 2015, Westar Energy, Inc. and Kansas Gas and Electric Company (Westar) filed its Application for approval of interim budgets for its two current energy efficiency programs – the WattSaver program and Energy Efficiency Demand Response (EEDR) program while it conducts the evaluation, measurement and verification process (EM&V) for those two programs.¹

2. On June 2, 2015, the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) was granted intervention.²

3. On September 1, 2015, Westar filed its Evaluation, Measurement and Verification.

4. On September 2, 2015, Commission Staff (Staff) filed its Report and Recommendation and Motion for Order requesting Westar submit budgets for all of its energy

efficiency programs.³ Staff believes Westar has five energy efficiency programs currently in effect⁴ and that Westar should file a budget for each of those programs.⁵ Westar has only submitted budgets for three of its programs: WattSaver, EEDR, and Energy Efficiency Education.⁶ While Westar has submitted budgets for those three programs, Staff contends that the budgets are not sufficient as they lack the level of detail required by the 08-GIMX-441-GIV Docket (08-441 Docket).⁷

5. On September 2, 2015, CURB filed its Response to Staff's Report and Recommendation; Motion for Order, echoing Staff's request to require Westar to submit detailed budgets in compliance with the 08-441 Docket.⁸

6. In the 08-441 Docket, the Commission established guidelines for the Content of Energy Efficiency Program Applications. Specifically, the Commission required a five-year program budget, including: (1) Administrative Costs; (2) Incentives (if any); (3) Marketing; and (4) Evaluations.⁹

7. Staff's Report and Recommendation contends that Westar's submitted budgets do not contain any breakdown of costs specifically related to the items identified in the 08-441 Docket.¹⁰ Instead, Westar simply provides a lump sum amount for three of its five energy efficiency programs.¹¹ Absent the information required by the 08-441 Docket, Staff claims it

lacks the necessary detail to adequately evaluate how money would be spent under Westar's energy efficiency programs or whether interim approval should be granted.¹²

8. Westar did not respond to Staff's Report and Recommendation or CURB's Response to Staff's Report and Recommendation.

9. The Commission concludes that the budgets submitted by Westar do not meet the standards established in the 08-441 Docket and are not detailed enough to allow Staff to adequately evaluate the energy efficiency programs' merits. Westar is ordered to submit budgets for all five of its current energy efficiency programs. The budget submissions should include breakdowns of costs associated with (1) Administrative Costs; (2) Incentives (if any); (3) Marketing; and (4) Evaluations. Westar's budgets are due by October 15, 2015.

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

A. Westar shall submit budgets that conform to the guidelines outlined in the 08-441 Docket by October 15, 2015.

B. Electronic service shall be used in this proceeding, including this Order.

C. The parties have 15 days from the date of electronic service of this Order to petition for reconsideration.¹³

D. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders as it deems necessary.
