
REQUIRED FILINGS OF COLUMBUS COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, LLC

<u>Category:</u>	<u>Comments</u>
Residential Lines	Retail residential lines located in a "high-cost" area as determined by the Commission (Order No. 10, Docket 99-GIMT-326-GIT).
Business Lines	Retail single-line and multi-line business lines located in a "high-cost" area as determined by the Commission. (Order No. 10, Docket No. 99-GIMT-326-GIT).
Company-Official Lines	Lines do not produce end-user revenues, are not subject to KUSF assessment, and do not qualify for KUSF support. (Order Determining Assessment for the KUSF Starting March 1, 2001, Docket No. 01-GIMT-235-GIT, Jan. 19, 2001; Order Determining Remaining Issue, Jan. 17, 2002).
Key Lines, PBX, Centrex, Hunt Lines	All Key Lines and Lines terminating in a Centrex, PBX, or Hunt Group are assessable lines. These lines do not qualify for KUSF support. (Order Addressing Synchronization of Counting Single-Line Business Lines, Docket No. 99-GIMT-326-GIT, July 22, 2002).
Concession Lines	Concession Lines are assessed the KUSF percentage rate on revenues billed. For local rate rebalancing purposes, include concession lines as if they are billed at the normal monthly rate. (Docket No. 01-GIMT-235-GIT, Jan. 19, 2001 Order Determining Assessment for the KUSF Starting March 1, 2001; Jan. 17, 2002 Order Determining Remaining Issue).
Payphones	All coin lines, including access lines to the company's own payphones or payphones owed by other providers. (Docket 01-GIMT-235-GIT).
Primary Rate Interface (PRI) Arrangements	Consist of 24 channels (23 B channels plus one D channel for signaling) & generally used by large businesses in a PBX-type setting and therefore, treated like PBX, Centrex, and other Hunt Group Settings. (Docket 09-GIMT-272-GIT). Count each arrangement as 5 lines. (Order Setting the Kansas Universal Service Fund Assessment Rate for Year Fourteen and Canceling January 20, 2009 Technical Hearing, Docket No. 10-GIMT-188-GIT, Jan. 13, 2010).
Other Lines	May include: one-way (Internet, Fire, alarm), Kansas non-jurisdictional, or other lines. Please describe lines reported in this category. Lines that do not provide 2-way voice grade service or that are not subject to the KCC's jurisdiction are not eligible for KUSF support or subject to the KUSF assessment.
