Re: Squirrel Sand formation at the Vesecky #1-91, Vesecki # 1-61 and Vesecky #3-71 wells in Douglas County Kansas

To whom it may concern,


I am writing today to object to the input of produced, resupply, and supply well water into the above referenced wells.

I base this on the following:

- 1- The recent revelation that there is linkage between injection well activity and seismic activity. This may very well be a function of the volume of fluids and the pressure under which they are being injected. This should be evaluated and resolved before any additional injection processes occur.
- 2- There is evidence that groundwater contamination can occur with this process.
- 3- There is evidence that air pollution occurs during this process.
- 4- There is no full disclosure of the chemicals used in the hydraulic fracturing process and, therefore, it is unknown what chemicals and other by-products may be in the injection fluids.
- 5- As the emerging water shortage issue comes more clearly into focus, the amount of water used and then discarded through the hydraulic fracturing process accelerates the depletion of this critically important resource.

In summary, I object to these specific projects due to the harm it will cause to both the environment and the residents in the area.
