# **ORDER GRANTING CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND AUTHORITY**

The above captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and record, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

# I. BACKGROUND

1. On February 7, 2018, FreeState Electric Cooperative, Inc. (FreeState) filed an Application requesting a Certificate of Convenience and Authority (Certificate) to transact the business of an electric public utility in a portion of Jefferson County, Kansas. FreeState is an electric public utility as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-104. A public hearing was neither requested nor held on FreeState's Application.

2. FreeState requests that it be certificated as an electric public utility for the purpose

of providing electric public utility service in the following described territory to wit:

Territory lying South and West of the Delaware River in the North ½ of Section 12, Township 8 South, Range 17 East, in Jefferson County, Kansas, as detailed on the Map attached as Exhibit A to the Application.

3. On February 14, 2018, the Commission Staff (Staff) submitted its Report and Recommendation dated February 13, 2018, recommending the Commission grant FreeState's Application and issue the company a Certificate to transact the business of an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above.

#### **II. LEGAL STANDARDS AND DISCUSSION**

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-131, the Commission has jurisdiction to grant a Certificate to any public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas. K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq., the Retail Electric Suppliers Act (RESA), requires the State of Kansas to be divided into electric service territories in which only one retail electric supplier is established for a given territory. Notwithstanding the mandated single electric provider service territories, RESA also provides that retail electric suppliers may enter into agreements to amend boundaries between their facilities. The agreements are subject to Commission approval, and if so approved, the Commission shall issue a certificate accordingly.<sup>1</sup>

5. According to Staff, FreeState and Brown-Atchison Electric Cooperative Assn., Inc. (Brown-Atchison) propose a transfer of the electric service territory described in paragraph 2 above in order to accommodate the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism regarding new service for a marsh pump located in Brown-Atchison's certified area. Because of the geography, Brown-Atchison proposed that it release this certified area to FreeState and, subject to the Commission's approval. FreeState has agreed to provide service to the territory described in paragraph 2 above.<sup>2</sup> On February 5, 2018, Brown-Atchison filed a companion Application in Docket No. 18-BRAE-331-CCS requesting authority to cease transacting the business of an electric public utility in the subject territory. Staff indicates that it has reviewed the Applications

of both FreeState and Brown-Atchison determining that the legal descriptions and maps provided with the Applications are accurate. Staff also confirms that the legal descriptions provided by the parties are not in conflict with the Commission's Certificate records. Concluding, Staff determines that public convenience will be promoted by the requested territory exchange and recommends the Commission grant the Applications of both Free-State and Brown-Atchison.<sup>3</sup>

#### **III. FINDING AND CONCLUSION**

6. The Commission adopts Staff's analysis and recommendation of February 13, 2018, as stated in its Report and Recommendation, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference, and finds that Free-State's Application should be granted, and that public convenience and necessity will be promoted by issuing FreeState the requested Certificate.

# IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED AND CERTIFIED THAT:

A. The Application filed by FreeState Electric Cooperative, Inc. on February 7,
2018 is hereby granted and a Certificate of Convenience and Authority to transact the business of
an electric public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above is hereby granted.

B. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if service of this Order is by mail, from the date this Order was served, in which to petition the Commission for reconsideration of any issue or issues decided herein. K.S.A. 66-118b; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-529(a)(1).

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders, as it may deem necessary.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In Docket 18-BRAE-331-CCS, Brown-Atchison Electric Cooperative (Brown-Atchison) is seeking the approval of the Commission to cease operating as an electric utility in a portion of territory lying south and west of the Delaware River in Section 12, Township 8 South, Range 17 East, in Jefferson County. In Docket 18-FSEE-337-COC, FreeState Electric Cooperative (FreeState) is requesting a Certificate for that certified territory.

Staff recommends that the Commission grant these Applications and find that public convenience will be promoted by this transaction.



# **BACKGROUND:**

On February 5, 2018, Brown-Atchison filed an Application to Cease in Docket No. 18-BRAE-331-CCS. On February 7, 2018, FreeState filed a Companion Application for a Certificate in Docket No. 18-FSEE-337-COC.<sup>1</sup>

The Commission has jurisdiction to grant a Certificate to any public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas.<sup>2</sup> K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq. the Retail Electric Suppliers Act (RESA) requires the State of Kansas to be divided into electric service territories in which only one retail electric supplier is established for a given territory. Notwithstanding the mandated single electric provider service territories, RESA also provides that retail electric suppliers can enter into agreements to amend boundaries between their facilities. The agreements are filed in the form of Certificates and, if approved by the Commission, Certificates to amend territory are issued.

# ANALYSIS:

Brown-Atchison requests authority to cease in the territory lying south and west of the Delaware River in the North 1/2 of Section 12; Township 8 South; Range 17 East; Jefferson County, Kansas, as shown in Exhibit A in the Application Cease from Brown-Atchison.

Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism contacted Brown-Atchison regarding new service for a marsh pump located in their certified area. Because of the geography, Brown-Atchison proposed to release this certified area to FreeState, and FreeState has agreed to provide service in this electric certified territory.

Staff has reviewed the Applications and determined that the legal descriptions and maps provided with the Applications are accurate. Staff has also confirmed that the legal descriptions are not in conflict with the Commission's Certificate records.

# **<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>**

Staff recommends that the Commission grant these Applications and find that public convenience will be promoted by this transaction.
