This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 18, 2010, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator David Ollenberger. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$2,400 penalty. You have twenty (20) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. <u>Checks or Money Orders should be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission</u>. Payments shall be mailed to the Fiscal Section of the Kansas <u>Corporation Commission</u>, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payments may be made by calling the Fiscal Office at 785-271-3351.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next 12 months and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 12 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THIS PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. <u>Requests for hearings must be made in writing, setting</u> forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Petitioner must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within twenty (20) days, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Penalty Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operations.

PENALTY ORDER

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The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, being duly advised in the premises, and after having examined its files and records, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, and amendments thereto, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, and 2. amendments thereto, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Lori Henderson, d/b/a Pallets Etc. (Pallets Etc.) obtained private operating authority from the Commission on June 30, 2009, and operates under KSMCID number 167233 and USDOT number 1906415.

5. Lori Henderson attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education/Instructional Meeting on June 29, 2009, on behalf of Pallets Etc..

6. Pallets Etc. is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, logs, poles, beams, lumber, and building materials.

III. STAFF'S STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 18, 2010, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator David Ollenberger conducted a compliance review of the operations of Pallets Etc. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Ollenberger identified five (5) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On August 14, 2010, Pallets Etc. required or permitted its driver, Anthony George, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Freightliner, VIN

pulling a 1989 Dorsey trailer, VIN in commerce on an intrastate trip from Topeka,

Kansas to Hoisington, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Mr. George's Driver's Daily Log dated August 14, 2010, Driver's Vehicle Inspection Report dated August 14, 2010, and Billing Invoice No. 2173, dated August 14, 2010, copies attached hereto as Attachment "B". At the time of this transportation, driver Anthony George was not enrolled in a random alcohol or controlled substance testing program due to Pallets Etc.'s failure to implement said program for its drivers. Pallets Etc.'s failure of to establish an alcohol and/or controlled substances program which complies with the procedures established in Title 49 C.F.R. 382.105 as adopted K.A.R. 82-4-3b is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

- b. During the trip described in paragraph a., above, Pallets Etc. failed to inquire into the driving record of Anthony George during the preceding 12 months and to maintain copies of motor vehicle records (MVR) in his driver qualification file. Pallets Etc.'s failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of Title 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c), as adopted by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,129 and K.A.R. 82-4-3g (2006. Staff recommends a fine of \$200.
- c. On August 18, 2010, Pallets Etc. required or permitted its driver, John George to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a F-350 Ford pickup, VIN

d. During the trip described in paragraph c., above, Pallets Etc. did not require its driver, John George, to make a record of duty status for the trip. This violation is evidenced by the Voluntary Statement of Julia Elias, dated August 18, 2010, a copy attached hereto as Attachment "D". Pallets Etc.'s failure to require its driver to record records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in Title 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a and authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine in the amount of \$500.

e. During the trip described in paragraph c., above, Pallets Etc. failed to require its driver, John George, to prepare a driver's Daily Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR) on the commercial vehicles operated. Pallets Etc.'s failure to require its driver to prepare a DVIR in writing for each day a commercial motor vehicle is operated and to maintain copies of the reports for three months from the date the report is written is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$200.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Pallets Etc. committed five (5) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,400 for five (5) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that Pallets Etc. be required to attend a Commissionsponsored safety seminar within the next twelve (12) months and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at <u>http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Pallets Etc. submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next twelve (12) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Pallets Etc. because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds Pallets Etc. committed five (5) violations of Kansas law that govern motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

14. Pallets Etc. is hereby assessed a \$2,400 penalty for five (5) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

15. Pallets Etc. is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next twelve (12) months and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance.

16. Pallets Etc. shall submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next twelve (12) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Lori Henderson, d/b/a Pallets Etc., of Topeka, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$2,400 civil penalty for five (5) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Pallets Etc. is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next twelve (12) months and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, Pallets Etc. is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next twelve (12) months.

C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 77-529 and K.S.A. 66-118b, and amendments</u> thereto, any party may request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's <u>Executive Director, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen</u> (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by mail, service is complete upon mailing and three (3) days shall be added to the above time frame. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. <u>Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver</u> of Pallets Etc.'s right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$2,400 civil penalty against Pallets Etc., and ordering Pallets Etc. to attend a Commissionsponsored safety seminar within the next twelve (12) months and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within twelve (12) months from the date of service of this Order.

D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. A corporation shall not be permitted to enter an appearance, except by its attorney.

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in twenty (20) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Fiscal Section of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding.*

F. Failure to pay the \$2,400 civil penalty within twenty (20) days of the issuance of this Penalty Order, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in

revocation of Pallets Etc.'s motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders as it may deem necessary.

Part B Requirements and/or Recommendations

- Driver qualification files must contain application for employment, a driving record (MVR), Medical certificate, photo copy of a current drivers license for CDL drivers, and a actual road test certificate for non-CDL drivers, previous employment checks, drivers certification of violations, and a annual review.
- Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed. Identify each vehicle by year, make, tire size, and serial number.
- 3. As a carrier you must make a copy of the roadside inspection, return it to the state that issued it, after all defects have been corrected and keep a copy of it for twelve months.
- 4. Vehicles greater than 10,001 gvwr and less than 26,001 gvwr are required records of duty status, and have a 150 mile radius exemption of log books, but only if the company is documenting the hours worked each day by showing the starting times, ending times, and total hours worked. Vehicles greater than 26,001 gvwr and require a CDL to operate must complete records of duty status (logs). They have a 100 mile radius exemption if the company is documenting the starting times, the ending times, and the total hours worked each day. If the company is documenting the hours then the drivers do not need the regular log book, when stayoing in the prospective radiuses.

CDL driver are limited to 12 hour work days and no overnite travel. The non CDL drivers are basically limited to a 14 hour day. Both scenarios are limited to the 60/70 hour limitations in any 7 or 8 day period.

- 5. Driver daily inspections reports are required each day the vehicle is operated. The inspection must cover parking (hand) brake, steering mechanism, lighting devices, reflectors, tires, horn, windshield wipers, rear vision mirrors, wheels and rims, and energency equipment. This documented post trip inspection is to be completed and the end of drivers shift.
- 6. When vehicle or combination of vehicles are greater than 26,001 GVWR, and a CDL license is required to operate such vehicle you must be in a alcohol/controlled substance testing program.
- 7. You must obtain a copy of yor driving record (MVR) each 12 months, and review it annually by completing the annual review.
- Once every 12 months the carrier must review the driving record of each driver to satisfy the driver meets the requirements for safe driving.
- 9. Drivers certification of violations or list of violations must be completed within thirty days of employment and every 12 months there after.
- 10. The driver certification of violations must be completed within thirty days of employment, and then every 12 months there after. This document is then compared to the MVR and the annual review is then completed.
- Within the next fifteen days, send a letter of response outlining the corrective actions taken to remedy noncompliance, to the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 SW Arrowhead Road. Topeka, KS 66604-4027 Attention Gary Devenport
- 12. Require all drivers to prepare a written inspection report for each day a vehicle is operated. Ensure that each report is signed by the driver, certified, and reviewed if defects are reported.
- 13. This report contains citations of regulations that are deemed serious in nature and could result in penalties against your company and/or your drivers.
