NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Andres Joan Castaneda d/b/a AJC Transport (AJC Transport) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 23, 2022, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Erica Pargas & Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 28, 2022. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: AJC Transport has been assessed a \$1,100 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,100, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of AJC Transport to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. AJC Transport must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\(^1\)

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,100 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Andres Joan Castaneda d/b/a AJC Transport (AJC Transport or Carrier) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 3327154.
- Luis M. Castaneda attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on December 16, 2019, on behalf of AJC Transport.
- 6. AJC Transport is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls building materials, construction, grain, feed, hay and livestock.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 23, 2022, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Erica Pargas & Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of AJC Transport. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On November 15, 2021, AJC Transport required or permitted its driver,
 Andres J. Castaneda, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor
 vehicle, a 2012 Peterbilt truck tractor, VIN ending in 135548, GVWR

53,200 lbs., pulling a Wilson semi-trailer, VIN ending in 58049, GVWR of 75,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Hoxie, Kansas to Dodge City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSHP04500709, dated November 15, 2021, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, AJC Transport failed to obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The Special Investigators found two (2) instances of this type of violation. The Carrier's failure to conduct periodic (annual) inspections on commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(c), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$750.

b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, AJC Transport failed to maintain minimum records of inspection and maintenance on the commercial motor vehicle operated. The Carrier's failure to maintain the required records of vehicle inspection, maintenance, and repair on the commercial motor vehicles owned for 30 days is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.3(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Staff submitted a Report and Recommendation (R&R), dated August 25, 2022, attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. In its R&R, Staff made recommendation regarding the above-mentioned violations.
- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds AJC Transport committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 10. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,100 for two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 11. Staff further recommends that a representative from AJC Transport be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- 12. Staff further recommends AJC Transport submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

13. Finally, Staff recommends that AJC Transport submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 14. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over AJC Transport because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 15. The Commission finds AJC Transport committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Andres Joan Castaneda d/b/a AJC Transport, of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a \$1,100 civil penalty for two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. AJC Transport is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. AJC Transport is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of AJC Transport's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.²
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,100 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,100 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$1,100 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of AJC Transport's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.³ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

Require all drivers to prepare complete and accurate records of duty status for each day, and to submit them within 13 days. Maintain all duty status records on file, with all supporting documents, for at least 6 months.

8. Ensure that all drivers' logs are accurate.

Ensure that all drivers' records of duty status (logs) are accurate. Check them against "supporting documents" to verify accuracy. Prohibit falsification of logs by any driver. Review the rules on supporting documents. Take appropriate action against drivers who falsify logs.

9. Establish a maintenance records program for all vehicles.

Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed.

10. Review maintenance and inspection records for all lease vehicles.

Periodically review the maintenance and inspection records for all lease vehicles as required by Part 396 of the FMCSR. Keep a record to document these reviews and notify the vehicle owner of any violations detected.

In the Matter of the Investigation of Andres Joan Castaneda d/b/a AJC Transport of Garden City, Kansas Regarding the Violation of the Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations and the Commission's Authority to Impose Penalties, Sanctions

and/or the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Andres Joan Castaneda d/b/a AJC Transport (AJC Transport or Carrier) is a motor carrier possessing common operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling building materials, construction, grain, feed, hay and livestock. AJC Transport operates under USDOT 3327154. On August 23, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Erica Pargas & Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of AJC Transport. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, resulting in a recommended penalty of \$1,100.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On August 23, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Erica Pargas & Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of AJC Transport. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

Violation One (1 of 2)

On November 15, 2021, AJC Transport required or permitted its driver, Andres J. Castaneda, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2012 Peterbilt truck tractor, VIN ending in 135548, GVWR 53,200 lbs., pulling a Wilson semi-trailer, VIN ending in 58049, GVWR of 75,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Hoxie, Kansas to Dodge City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSHP04500709, dated November

15, 2021. At the time of this transportation, AJC Transport failed to obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The Special Investigators found two (2) instances of this type of violation. The Carrier's failure to conduct periodic (annual) inspections on commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(c), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$750.

Violation Two (2 of 2)

During the transportation described in Violation One, above, AJC Transport failed to maintain minimum records of inspection and maintenance on the commercial motor vehicle operated. The Carrier's failure to maintain the required records of vehicle inspection, maintenance, and repair on the commercial motor vehicles owned for 30 days is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.3(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$350.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find AJC Transport committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,100 for two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends that a representative from AJC Transport be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends AJC Transport submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that AJC Transport submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
