NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT 20-TRAM-047-PEN

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Manuel Hernandez, d/b/a M. Hernandez Trucking (M. Hernandez Trucking) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on July 17, 2019, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2020 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on July 16, 2019. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: M. Hernandez Trucking has been assessed a \$1,400 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,400, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of M. Hernandez Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. M. Hernandez Trucking must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,400 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.A.R. 82-4-1b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Manuel Hernandez, d/b/a M. Hernandez Trucking (M. Hernandez Trucking) operates under USDOT number 1278129.
- 5. Manuel Hernandez attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on February 13, 2017, on behalf of M. Hernandez Trucking.
- 6. M. Hernandez Trucking is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls road materials.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on July 17, 2019, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of M. Hernandez Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On June 3, 2019, M. Hernandez Trucking required or permitted its driver, Manuel Hernandez to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle,

- a 2004 Kenworth, VIN ending in 59218, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2009 Travis semi-trailer, VIN ending in 06637, in interstate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Alva, Oklahoma. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated June 3, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, M. Hernandez Trucking did not have implemented an alcohol and controlled substance testing program for its CDL driver. The carrier's failure to establish an alcohol and controlled substances testing program for its CDL drivers that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$350.
- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, M. Hernandez Trucking had not paid its Uniform Carrier Registration (UCR) fees for 2019. The carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce and to pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set out in 49 C.F.R. 367.30, is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-30a, authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.
- c. On June 21, 2019, M. Hernandez Trucking required or permitted its driver, Manuel Hernandez, to operate a 2004 Kenworth, VIN ending in 059218, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2009 Travis semi-trailer, VIN ending in 06637, in interstate commerce from Alva, Oklahoma to Garden City,

Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated June 21, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. M. Hernandez Trucking failed to obtain an International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) permit or a fuel tax permit for Kansas upon its return to Kansas. The carrier's failure to obtain an IFTA permit or a fuel tax permit for Kansas is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 392.2, as authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,109. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

d. On June 24, 2019, M. Hernandez Trucking required or permitted its driver, Manuel Hernandez, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2004 Kenworth, VIN ending in 059218, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2009 Travis semi-trailer, VIN ending in 06637, in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Osbourne, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated June 24, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Manuel Hernandez came on duty at 6:00 a.m. and drove until 6:30 p.m. without taking a 30 minute break. The carrier's failure to provide "rest breaks" to its drivers if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeperberth period of at least 30 minutes is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and implemented by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds M. Hernandez Trucking committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,400 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from M. Hernandez Trucking be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that M. Hernandez Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over M. Hernandez Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1.
- 13. The Commission finds M. Hernandez Trucking committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor

Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Manuel Hernandez, d/b/a M. Hernandez Trucking, of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a \$1,400 civil penalty for four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. M. Hernandez Trucking is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order.
- D. M. Hernandez Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written

request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of M. Hernandez Trucking's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,400 civil penalty against M. Hernandez Trucking, and ordering a representative from M. Hernandez Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,400 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,400 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.
- H. Failure to pay the \$1,400 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of M. Hernandez Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease

and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the I. purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



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Part B Requirements and/or Recommendations

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES AND ALCOHOL BASIC PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Policies and Procedures

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: This carrier needs to have a controlled substance and alcohol testing program put in place and designate someone to over see all of the drug and alcohol testing requirements.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

- Develop a written company policy incorporating by reference all regulations regarding controlled substances and alcohol use, testing, training, and records retention for all employees.
- Develop a policy requiring drivers to submit copies of all citations for moving violations to carrier management within 24 hours
- Establish a process to ensure that drivers who are randomly tested can be immediately removed if they are found to be positive and that they do not return to safety-sensitive duties until they have complied with the "return-to-duty" process.
- Establish written policies and procedures that promote, verify, and enforce adherence to all controlled-substance and alcohol rules and regulations. Procedures should be tallored to company operations and should provide specific checks and guidelines for interacting with a consortium, if applicable.
- Establish a process to ensure that test results are properly safeguarded from unauthorized disclosure to prospective employers without specific written consent and from disclosure under any circumstances to insurance companies and other non qualified parties, in accordance with regulations.
- Develop a policy to ensure that all alcohol testing is conducted immediately before or after the period that
 employees are performing a safety-sensitive function. Drivers can be tested on their day off only for controlled
 substances. Once notified of their selection, drivers must proceed immediately to the testing facility. If a driver
 refuses to go, this should be considered as equivalent to a positive result.
- Consider developing a driver selection protocol that uses valid random-number-generator software on a monthly basis to select, by driver identification number, 5 to 8 percent of drivers for controlled-substance testing and 2 to 5 percent for alcohol testing. This will ensure selection of 50 percent of drivers for controlled-substances testing and 10 percent for alcohol testing per year, given fluctuations in the driver workforce over the course of the year.
- Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings, suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows controlled-substance and alcohol violations.

Seek Out Resources:

- You are encouraged to review your company's record at the following website: http://ai.fmcsa.dot.gov/SMS. You will need to use your PIN Number that has been provided by the FMCSA.
- Contact industry associations to get resources and ideas on safety improvement practices from other carriers in the industry.
- 2. Ensure that all drivers subject to pre-employment, random, reasonable cause, post accident, return to duty, and/or follow-up controlled substance testing are tested as required by 49 CFR Parts 40 and 382 of the FMCSR.
- DOT drug testing rules require that employers test for marijuana, cocaine, opiates, amphetamines, and phencyclidine (PCP).
- 4. Provide employees with a written controlled substance and alcohol testing policy that complies with all the requirements noted in Part 382.601(b). Also, ensure you maintain a certificate signed by the employee certifying they have received your company drug and alcohol testing policy.
- 5. Carriers are required to post accident controlled substance and alcohol test any driver who is involved in a fatality accident or an accident where their are injuries treat away from the scene and the carriers driver receives a citation or when one or more of the vehicles has disabling damage and has to be towed and the carriers driver receives a citation.

- 6. If you operate across state lines you are require to pay UCR fees. For UCR registration, log on to your KTRAN account and complete the process utilizing the UCR tab.
- Retain on file a properly completed & current copy of your form MCS-90 financial responsibility endorsement.
- 8. Carrier must maintain an accident register on file for three years after the date of each accident for every DOT recordable accident. The register must contain a copy of the accident report completed by law enforcement and your insurance loss forms.
- 9. If you or your drivers are involved in a recordable commercial motor vehicle accident, you must maintain an accident file for three years from the date of the accident. The accident register must contain the date, name of the nearest town where the accident occurred, drivers name and number of injuries or fatalities, hazardous materials spilled and copies of the accident reports completed by law enforcement and forms completed by the insurance company.
- 10. Each motor carrier shall maintain a driver qualification (DQ) file for each driver it employs. A driver's qualification file may be combined with his/her personnel file. The DQ file must include: driver's application for employment, a copy of the motor vehicle record received from each State within 30 days of the hire date, certificate of the driver's road test or a copy of the CDL license, copy of the annual motor vehicle record received from each State agency every 12 months, a note relating to the annual review of the driver's driving record, a list or certificate relating to violations of motor vehicle laws and ordinances, a copy of the medical examiner's certificate, a note relating to the verification of medical examiner being listing on the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners, and a Skill Performance Evaluation Certificate if applicable due to the drivers inability to pass the physical requirements for a medical certification.
- 11. As a motor carrier operating commercial motor vehicles having two axles and a gross weight exceeding 26,000 pounds or has three or more axles regardless of weight, or is used in combination when the weight of the combination exceeds 26,000 pounds or has a registered gross vehicle weight over 26,000 pounds are required to pay IFTA (International Fuel Tax Agreement).
- 12. Driving is not permitted if more than 8 hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeper-berth period of at least 30 minutes. Drivers must take 30 minutes off-duty or in the sleeper-berth to meet this requirement.
- 13. Maintain all completed CVSA roadside inspection forms on file for 12 months from the date of the inspection at the carrier's principal place of business.
- 14. •Understand Why Compliance Saves Time and Money: Compliance with FMCSRs will not only save lives, but also saves your business time and money. Tracking how much your business spends on non-compliance activities can help you understand the many benefits of compliance to your business and why safety is good business.

•Document and Follow Through on Action Plans: Document and follow through on action plans to ensure the actions you are taking are creating improvement in safety management and compliance.

•NOTICE: A pattern and/or repeated violations of the same or related acute or critical regulations (violations of the same Part in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations) will cause the maximum penalties allowed by law to be assessed under Section 222 of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 (MCSIA). A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.





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
