STAFF RESPONSE TO KRSI COMMENTS

COMES NOW the Staff of the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Staff and Commission, respectively) and for its response to the Comments of KRSI to Staff Report and Objection to Recommendations filed November 6, 2010, shows the Commission as follows:

1. On August 10, 2006, the Commission issued its Order Opening Docket in this docket. In that Order, the Commission stated that the purpose of this docket was to conduct a financial and operational audit of KRSI "to ensure the costs recovered through the KUSF are reasonable." The Commission concluded that such an audit was necessary since the Commission had, almost ten years earlier, determined that dual party relay service and the telecommunications equipment program should be funded through the KUSF and since K.S.A. 66-2008(c) requires the Commission to periodically review the KUSF to ensure the funds it provides to qualified telecommunications public utilities, telecommunications carriers and wireless telecommunications service providers are cost-based. Since KRSI's operations are funded through the KUSF, the Commission concluded that it should also examine KRSI's

operations to determine that these costs are reasonable and appropriate.² And since KTIA has contracted to manage the KRSI and TAP with management fees being recovered through the KUSF, the Commission determined it was also appropriate to examine KTIA's records, as well.

- 2. On October 25, 2010, Staff filed its report and recommendation. The main thrust of Staff's recommendation was that the Commission should consider issuing requests for proposals (RFPs) so that the management of KRSI is performed by an entity that has been awarded management through a competitive bidding process. Staff firmly believes that a competitively-bid RFP is the best way the Commission has to ensure that the KUSF funds used to provide KRSI services are cost-based. In addition, Staff wishes to be clear that KTIA is welcome to bid in the RFP process. Staff made other recommendations with respect to KRSI and the TAP, but the recommendation with respect to the development and letting of an RFP is paramount.
- 3. On November 5, 2010, KRSI filed its response to Staff's report and recommendation, addressing areas in Staff's report and recommendation that it found lacking or otherwise deficient. Staff, however, stands by the recommendations it made to the Commission that issuing an RFP to select an independent 3rd party to administer KRSI is a prudent way to use KUSF funds and ensure such funds provide only that needed to effectively administer the program.

WHEREFORE Staff requests the Commission consider its report and recommendation and for such other and further relief as the Commission deems just and proper.
