NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport (Double M Transport) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 14, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2019 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on August 7, 2018. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

Double M Transport has been assessed a \$1,750 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$1,750 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

DOUBLE M TRANSPORT IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

New Entrant motor carriers are eligible for a one-time, fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed motor carriers. You have to agree to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the reduction. A fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed may be available if:

- (1) within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier signs and submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel at the above address;
- (2) within thirty (30) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier submits to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future;
- (3) within thirty (30) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier sends an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance must be submitted to the undersigned Litigation Counsel shortly thereafter; and
- (4) within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier must submit to a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

If a carrier is approved for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment assessing the reduced penalty and setting out the terms and conditions stated above may be issued by the Commission. Payment of the reduced penalty of \$875 would be due within 30 days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport must file within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$1,750 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within 15 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming final and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced. If Double M Transport submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement as explained above, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment may be issued assessing the reduced penalty of \$875 and that payment would become due within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

Double M Transport has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:
- 1. Double M Transport has submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the Penalty Order this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel.
- 2. Double M Transport will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to become eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.
- 3. Double M Transport will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.
- 4. Double M Transport will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.
- Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport understands that if approved, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment will be issued by the Commission assessing a reduced penalty of \$875, and will set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, Double M Transport will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

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PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport (Double M Transport) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2829254.
- 5. Fidel Mendoza attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on December 14, 2015, on behalf of Double M Transport.
- 6. Double M Transport is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, grain, feed, hay, commodities dry bulk, and road materials.
- 7. Double M Transport is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on September 14, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a compliance review of the operations of Double M Transport. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified three (3) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On July 26, 2018, Double M Transport required or permitted its driver, Fidel Meza-Mendoza, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor

vehicle, a 2011 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 127449, GVWR 54,000 lbs., pulling a 2010 Timpte semi-trailer, VIN ending in 122945, GVWR 37,400 lbs., in interstate commerce from Aurora, Nebraska to Garden City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated July 26, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Double M Transport transported a load in excess of the gross weight of 85,500 pounds allowed in Kansas. The gross weight transported was 91,400 pounds. This is one example of six loads discovered by the special investigator. The carrier's failure to stay within the legal gross weight limit is a violation of 49 C.F.R 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 8-1909. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

b. On June 5, 2018, Double M Transport required or permitted its driver, Raudel Fernandez-Reyes, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2005 Kenworth, VIN ending in 086050, GVWR 54,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Tribune, Kansas to Denver, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated June 5, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Raudel Fernandez-Reyes traveled outside of the 150 air mile radius and failed to retain the bills of lading, scale tickets, fuel receipts or any other documents for this trip. The special investigator discovered 17 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to retain driver supporting documents relating to the

- record of duty status for a period of six (6) months is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 395.8(k)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.
- c. On July 9, 2018, Double M Transport required or permitted its driver, Ever Holguin, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1994 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 342248, GVWR 54,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Lyons, Kansas to Blaine, Nebraska. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated July 9, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Double M Transport did not have the inspector certification for Annual Inspector Eloy Duran who had completed the annual inspection on the 1994 Peterbilt on June 1, 2018. The carrier's failure to retain evidence of the inspector's qualifications to inspect the commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.19(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Double M Transport committed three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 10. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,750 for three (3) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 11. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement and Transportation Staff must approve the carrier's Corrective Action Plan (CAP).
- 12. Staff recommends Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.
- 13. Staff further recommends that a representative from Double M Transport attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.
- 14. Finally, Staff recommends that Double M Transport submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

15. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Double M Transport because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.

- 16. The Commission finds a penalty of \$1,750 should be assessed to Double M Transport for committing three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 17. The Commission finds Double M Transport is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Fidel V. Meza-Mendoza, d/b/a Double M Transport, of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a penalty of \$1,750 for three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$1,750 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.
- B. A representative from Double M Transport is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- C. Double M Transport must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described above, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. Double M Transport is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- E. If Double M Transport does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the penalty of \$1,750 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of Double M Transport's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- F. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Double M Transport's right to a hearing.
- G. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For

civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

Supporting documents are registration receipts, drivers records of duty status, bills of lading, shipping receipts, waybills, freight bills, run tickets or equivalent documents, fuel receipts, toll road receipts and any other document that would indicate compliance with the hours of service requirements.
- 4. Motor carriers must retain each supporting document generated or received in the normal course of business in the following categories for each of its drivers for every 24-hour period to verify on-duty not driving time in accordance with § 395.8(k):
 - (i) Each bill of lading, itinerary, schedule, or equivalent document that indicates the origin and destination of each trip;
 - (ii) Each dispatch record, trip record, or equivalent document;
 - (iii) Each expense receipt related to any on-duty not driving time;
 - (iv) Each electronic mobile communication record, reflecting communications transmitted through a fleet management system; and
 - (v) Each payroll record, settlement sheet, or equivalent document that indicates payment to a driver.
 - A supporting document must include each of the following data elements:
 - On the document or on another document that enables the carrier to link the document to the driver, the driver's name or personal identification number (PIN) or a unit (vehicle) number if the unit number can be associated with the driver operating the unit and the date, which must be the date at the location where the date is recorded. The location, which must include the name of the nearest city, town, or village to enable Federal, State, or local enforcement personnel to quickly determine a vehicle's location on a standard map or road atlas; and the time, which must be convertible to the local time at the location where it is recorded.
