This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Jones & Buck Development LLC (Jones & Buck Development) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 24, 2023, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Jared Smith. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** Jones & Buck Development has been assessed a \$500 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. The attached Order requires a representative of Jones & Buck Development to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. Jones & Buck Development must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/</a>, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\(^1\)

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:</u> Failure to pay the penalty of \$500 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

# **PENALTY ORDER**

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On August 24, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Jared Smith, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Jones & Buck Development LLC (Jones & Buck Development or Carrier). Jones & Buck Development is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 1408498.
- 2. On October 9, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$500 to be issued to Jones & Buck Development based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SI Jared Smith identified three (3) violation(s), accounting for one (1)

count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.<sup>2</sup>

- 3. Additionally, Staff recommends that Jones & Buck Development be required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commissionsponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.<sup>3</sup> A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars be found the Commission's website can on at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 4. Staff further recommends Jones & Buck Development submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.<sup>4</sup>
- 5. Finally, Staff recommends that Jones & Buck Development submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.<sup>5</sup> Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 6. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in

Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 8. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

## IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. Jones & Buck Development LLC, of Sedan, KS is hereby assessed a \$500 civil penalty for three (3) violation(s), accounting for one (1) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Jones & Buck Development is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information

explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. Jones & Buck Development is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/</a>, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Jones & Buck Development's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.<sup>6</sup>
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$500 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$500 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory

Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$500 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of Jones & Buck Development's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.<sup>7</sup> Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Jones & Buck Development LLC is a motor carrier (MC) possessing private operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling oilfield equipment. Jones & Buck Development LLC operates under USDOT 1408498. On August 24, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Jared Smith completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Jones & Buck Development LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified three (3) violation(s), accounting for one (1) specific count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, staff recommends penalty of \$500 be issued to the MC.

## **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:**

On August 24, 2023, Commission Staff SI Jared Smith conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Jones & Buck Development LLC. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is detailed below.

# Count One (1 of 1)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 382.701(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must conduct an annual inquiry into its drivers with the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH).

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> On July 31, 2023 Jones & Buck Development LLC required or permitted its driver, Eric Darnall, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2002 Sterling, VIN ending in 4945, GVWR 54,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Sedan, Kansas to Peru, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by a Driver's Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR), attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**, and a driver's time sheet, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**. A copy of the MC's DACH search history is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**. The most recent annual queries for the MC's drivers had been conducted in December of 2021.

<u>Violation:</u> Jones & Buck Development LLC failed to conduct annual inquires in the DACH (Exhibit 1, Page 3). Three (3) violations were discovered.

**Recommendation:** Staff recommends a fine of \$500.


# **RECOMMENDATION:**

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find Jones & Buck Development LLC committed Three (3) violation(s) accounting for one (1) specific counts of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$500 for Three (3) violation(s) of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Jones & Buck Development LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Jones & Buck Development LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration s (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier s currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

You are encouraged to review your company's SMS results and take action to make the roads safer for everyone. Your public safety records are available at the following website: http://ai.fmcsa.dot.gov/sms. Also visit https://portal.fmcsa.dot.gov which provides real time data and the opportunity to review you safety data. You will need to use your PIN number that has been provided by FMCSA. Registration and access is free.

# 4. Clearinghouse Annual Query

The KCC requires that you prepare a corrective action plan, addressing the measures taken to correct all the violations identified within this report. Submit this letter within 30 days outlining the carrier s updated changes to their policies and procedures regarding all listed violations. Explain in detail how, as a carrier representative, you will rectify these deficiencies and prevent their reoccurrence going forward. Include any supporting documentation and evidence as indicated in the recommendations above, (example: vehicle inspections performed, proof of drug and alcohol testing in place, etc.) necessary to prove that corrective action has been taken. 




