NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against C&K Livestock LLC for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 6, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

C&K Livestock has been assessed a \$1,250 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$1,250 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

C&K LIVESTOCK IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND IS ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

New Entrant motor carriers are eligible for a one-time, fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) originally assessed motor carriers. You have to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the fifty-percent (50%) reduction. A fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the attached Order is available if:

- (1) the carrier signs and submits within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel at the above address;
- (2) within 30 days from the date of the attached Penalty Order, the carrier submits to Transportation Staff an approved Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future;
- (3) within thirty (30) days from the date of the attached Penalty Order, the carrier sends an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance must be submitted to the undersigned Litigation Counsel shortly thereafter; and
- (4) within 18 months from the date of the attached Penalty Order, the carrier must be available for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

If a carrier is approved for the fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty, a Motion for Order Amending Penalty Assessment, along with the Reduced Penalty Agreement will be filed with the Commission. An Order Amending Penalty Assessment assessing the reduced penalty and setting out the terms and conditions stated above will be issued by the Commission shortly thereafter. Payment of the reduced penalty of \$625 would be due within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. C&K Livestock LLC must file within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and by mailing a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$1,250 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming a final Penalty Order and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced. If C&K Livestock submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement as explained above, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment may be issued assessing the reduced penalty of \$625 and that payment will become due within thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order.

REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT

18-TRAM-154-PEN

C&K Livestock LLC (C&K Livestock) hereby submits this Reduced Penalty Agreement to become eligible for a fifty percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the Penalty Order dated October 12, 2017. C&K Livestock has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:

- 1. C&K Livestock has submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the Penalty Order issued on October 12, 2017, this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel at the above address.
- 2. C&K Livestock will, within 30 days from the date of the Penalty Order dated October 12, 2017, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff before my company can be eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.
- 3. C&K Livestock will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order dated October 12, 2017, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.
- 4. C&K Livestock will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

C&K Livestock LLC understands that if approved, Transportation Litigation Counsel will file a Motion for Order Amending Penalty Assessment with this Agreement attached. The Order Amending Penalty Assessment will assess C&K Livestock a fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty of \$625, and set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, C&K Livestock will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. C&K Livestock LLC (C&K Livestock) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2482006.
- 5. Brian Cook attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on February 24, 2014, on behalf of C&K Livestock.
- 6. C&K Livestock is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, livestock, grain, feed and hay.
- 7. C&K Livestock is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on September 6, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a compliance review of the operations of C&K Livestock. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On June 14, 2017, C&K Livestock required or permitted its driver, Matthew Kuhlman, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 494442, GVWR over 33,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Terrell, Texas to Liberal, Kansas. This trip is

evidenced by Invoice No. 0489, dated June 14, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, C&K Livestock failed to require its driver to make a record of duty status. The special investigator found six (6) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its driver to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

b. On June 21, 2017, C&K Livestock required or permitted its driver, Matthew Kuhlman, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 494442, GVWR over 33,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Springfield, Missouri to Centralia, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Weekly Run Sheet Detail, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Driver Kuhlman submitted to C&K Livestock his Driver's Daily Logs, dated June 20 and June 21, 2017, copies of which are attached hereto as Attachment "D" and are hereby incorporated by reference. The Driver's Daily Log, dated June 20, 2017, shows the driver coming on duty at Cameron, Missouri at 9:30 p.m., driving three hours and fifteen minutes and going off duty on June 21, 2017, at Belleville, Kansas. Driver Kuhlman never showed his trip to Springfield, Missouri

from Cameron, Missouri to load and driving from Springfield, Missouri to Centralia, Kansas. Driver Kuhlman submitted false records of duty status. The special investigator found four (4) violations of this type. C&K Livestock's falsifying records of duty status is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find C&K Livestock committed two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 10. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,250 for two (2) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 11. Staff provides notice to the Commission that C&K Livestock LLC is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty if it submits to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the Reduced Penalty Agreement, which is attached to the Notice of Penalty Assessment.
- 12. Staff recommends C&K Livestock LLC submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within 30 days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in the this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in

the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.

- 13. Staff further recommends that C&K Livestock attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.
- 14. Finally, Staff recommends that C&K Livestock submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 15. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over C&K Livestock because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 16. The Commission finds a penalty of \$1,250 should be assessed to C&K Livestock for committing two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 17. The Commission finds C&K Livestock is a New Entrant motor carrier and is eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel, within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement, which states it will comply with the reduced penalty terms and obligations set out therein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. C&K Livestock LLC, of Norcatur, Kansas is hereby assessed a penalty of \$1,250 for two (2) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$1,250 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.
- B. C&K Livestock is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- C. C&K Livestock must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- D. C&K Livestock is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- E. If C&K Livestock does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the full penalty(s) of \$1,250 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, see K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the

Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of C&K Livestock's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

- F. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of C&K Livestock's right to a hearing.
- G. On October 12, 2017, this Order was mailed via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105743120. Service of this Order is deemed complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.
- H. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.

K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.





The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.




