CERTIFICATE

NOW, the above-captioned matter comes on for consideration and determination by the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. On December 16, 2014, Leavenworth-Jefferson Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Applicant") filed an Application seeking a Certificate of Convenience and Authority to provide electric service to a portion of Leavenworth County, Kansas as required by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-131. Applicant is an electric public utility as defined by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 66-104. A public hearing was neither requested nor held on this Application.

2. Specifically, Applicant requests a Certificate in the territory described as follows:

LEAVENWORTH COUNTY

A tract of land described as the Northwest ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 1, Township 8 South, Range 21 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit A and Exhibit B in the application.

A tract of land described as the East ½ of the Northwest ¼ of the Southwest ¼ of Section 2, Township 8 South, Range 21 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit C and Exhibit D in the application.

A tract of land described as the South  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$ ; and the South  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11, Township 11 South, Range 21 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit E and Exhibit F in the application.

A tract of land beginning at a point approximately 757 feet East of the Southwest section corner of Section 15; thence North 394 feet; thence East approximately 1094 feet to the centerline of New Lawrence Road; thence Southwesterly along center of road 425 feet; thence West 950 feet to the point of beginning, all in the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 15, Township 9 South, Range 22 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit G and Exhibit H in the application.

A tract of land described as the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 31, Township 8 South, Range 22 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit I and Exhibit J in the application.

A tract of land described as the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 32, Township 7 South, Range 21 East, in Leavenworth County, Kansas, as detailed on the maps marked Exhibit K and Exhibit L in the application.

3. The territory described in Finding No. 2 above is currently served by Westar Energy, Inc. Pursuant to Docket No. 15-WSEE-237-CCS, Westar Energy, Inc. requests permission to cease operating as an electric public utility in that territory.

4. On May 20, 2015, Staff filed a Motion for Waiver of 180-day deadline pursuant to K.S.A. 66-131, noting all parties agreed to an extension of the deadline for Commission decision.

5. On June 2, 2015, the Commission issued an order granting Staff's motion and extending the deadline for decision in the Application until July 23, 2015.

6. Public convenience will be promoted by allowing Applicant to provide electric service in the territory described in Finding No. 2 above. The Application, therefore, should be granted and a Certificate issued to Applicant in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-131.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION CONSIDERED AND CERTIFIED:

A) The Application filed herein is granted and Leavenworth-Jefferson Electric Cooperative, Inc. is permitted to transact the business of an electric public utility in the territory described in Finding No. 2 herein.



**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

These filings by Westar Energy, Inc. (Westar) and Leavenworth-Jefferson Electric Cooperative, Inc. (LJEC) were filed to cover 13 customers being served by LJEC in Westar's service area and one customer being served by Westar in LJEC's service area. Staff determined that notice should be provided to these customers and notice was provided by LJEC and Westar to each of their affected customers. Staff is recommending that the Applications be granted.

**BACKGROUND:**

On December 5, 2014, Westar filed 15-WSEE-237-CCS, 15-WSEE-238-COC, and 15-WSEE-239-CCS. On December 17, 2014, LJEC filed companion filings in 15-LVJE- 256-CCS, 15-LVJE-257-COC, and 15-LVJE-258-COC. These filings would exchange certain electric territories of Westar and LJEC located in portions of Atchison, Jackson, Jefferson and Leavenworth Counties.

**ANALYSIS:**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-131, the Commission has jurisdiction to grant a certificate to a public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas. K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq. the Retail Electric Suppliers Act (RESA) requires each and every retail electric supplier to obtain a certificate from the Commission.

The statutory standard of review in this matter is whether the "public convenience will be promoted by the transaction of said business and permitting said applicants to transact the business of a common carrier or public utility in this state." K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-131. Further, single electric certification shall be the standard in Kansas under K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq.

In addition, 66-1,175 states:

Notwithstanding the exclusive right of retail electric suppliers to provide service within the certified territories established pursuant to this act, a retail electric supplier may enter into an agreement with another retail electric supplier for the establishment of boundaries between territories other than the boundaries established pursuant to this act or providing electric service to electric consuming facilities as between such retail electric suppliers. Any agreement entered into pursuant to this section shall be subject to approval by the corporation commission. If so approved, the commission shall issue certificates accordingly.

The above-captioned filings were filed as the result of meetings between LJEC and Westar. The meetings resulted in LJEC and Westar reviewing their mapping systems to determine if each company may have inadvertently built into the other's electric territory. As a result of the review, 16 locations were discovered where LJEC had existing electric facilities serving accounts located in Westar's certificated area, however, there are only 13 customers because three of the customers each have two separate accounts. Also, one instance was discovered where Westar had constructed facilities serving a customer in LJEC's territory.

Territory matters are handled on a case by case basis. Often the location and capacities of the two electric suppliers' existing electric facilities dictate the customers need for and desire of service from a particular electric supplier. The number of accounts/customers being served by LJEC in Westar's territory and the extensive time-frame of their connections has prompted Staff's decision to request customer notice in this case. After agreement by the parties, each utility developed a notice letter to customers, approved by Staff, which was mailed to the applicable accounts.

After providing all affected customers with notice<sup>1</sup> and opportunity to provide comment, Staff received contact from one of LJEC's noticed customers. This customer elected to continue receiving service from LJEC. Staff recommends that the Commission find that public convenience will be promoted by the granting of this Application.

Pursuant to an Order Granting Waiver of Deadline, the Commission action date is July 23, 2015.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff is recommending that the six applications of Leavenworth-Jefferson and Westar, as captioned above, be granted.
