PETITION TO INTERVENE OF THE KANSAS MUNICIPAL ENERGY AGENCY

Pursuant to K.S.A. §77-521 and K.A.R. §82-1-225, the Kansas Municipal Energy Agency (KMEA) hereby petitions the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for an order granting KMEA's intervention in the above-captioned matter. In support thereof, KMEA states the following:

1. KMEA is a quasi-municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Kansas,¹ with its principal place of business at 6300 West 95th Street, Overland Park, Kansas 66212. KMEA is authorized to plan, finance, and construct projects for the purchase, sale, generation, and transmission of electricity for purposes of securing an adequate, economical, and reliable supply of electricity and energy for its municipal electric utility membership. KMEA's membership includes more than 88 member cities across the State.

2. On August 11, 2025, Sunflower Electric Power Corporation (Sunflower) and Prairie Land Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Prairie Land) (collectively, Joint Applicants) filed an application seeking Commission approval for the "[c]ontinuation of Prairie Land's respective individual 34.5kV Formula-Based Rates ("34.5kV FBR(s)"), as originally approved in Docket No.

16- MKEE-023-TAR (“023 Docket”) and approved for renewal in Docket No. 21-SEPE-049-TAR (“21-049 Docket”), without any substantive changes” (Joint Application).²

3. Certain of KMEA member-cities take service under Prairie Land’s Local Access Distribution Service (LADS) tariff. KMEA has participated in Prairie Land’s previous annual 34.5kV FBR dockets and seeks intervention in this proceeding to continue protecting the interests of its member-cities.

4. K.S.A. §77-521 provides, in part, that petitions for intervention shall be granted if “the petition states facts demonstrating that the petitioner's legal rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other legal interests may be substantially affected by the proceeding or that the petitioner qualifies as an intervener under any provision of law... and... the presiding officer determines that the interests of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings will not be impaired by allowing the intervention.”³ Further, the Commission has discretion to allow intervention “at any time upon determining that the intervention sought is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings.”⁴

5. KMEA will or may be bound by any order issued by this Commission and may be substantially affected by the outcome of this proceeding or portions thereof. Further, KMEA’s interests herein are not adequately represented by any other party to this proceeding.
