## ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION FOR THE CITIZENS' UTILITY RATEPAYER BOARD

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings and conclusions:

- 1. On July 16, 2010, Westar Energy, Inc. and Kansas Gas and Electric Company (Westar) filed a tariff revision seeking approval from the Commission of an energy-efficiency rider to permit recovery of costs associated with Westar's energy-efficiency programs. The energy-efficiency rider was filed in compliance with the Commission's Order in Docket No. 08-GIMX-441-GIE, and Westar notes that it is designed to recover costs associated with Commission-approved energy-efficiency and demand-response programs deferred, but not recovered, from the inception of the individual programs through June 30, 2010.
- 2. On July 21, 2010, the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) filed a Petition to Intervene seeking a Commission Order permitting CURB leave to intervene as a party in this matter. In its petition, CURB states that it has discretion, under K.S.A. 66-1223 et seq., to

intervene and represent the interests of Kansas residential and small commercial ratepayers in any utility proceeding before the Commission. Petition to Intervene, July 21, 2010, ¶ 2 (Petition, ¶ 2). CURB claims that the rates paid and service received by the customers it represents will or may be affected by a Commission order or activity in this proceeding. Petition, ¶ 4.

- 3. The Commission has broad discretion to grant a petition for intervention if it is in the interests of justice, if the intervention will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceeding, and if the party has stated facts demonstrating its legal rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other legal interests may be substantially affected by the proceeding. K.S.A. 77-521(a)(3); K.A.R. 82-1-225. At any time during a proceeding, the Commission may impose limitations on an intervener's participation. K.S.A. 77-521(c).
- 4. The Commission finds and concludes that CURB has met the requirements of K.A.R. 82-1-225 and should be granted intervention. CURB will be added to the mailing list, service of pleadings, communications, and correspondence should be delivered to counsel of record, as follows:
