FINAL ORDER

On March 24, 2024, Operator and Commission Staff jointly motioned for a Final Order in this matter. In lieu of an evidentiary hearing, Operator and Staff have agreed to allow all submitted prefiled testimony into the formal record without objection and to waive cross-examination. The joint motion is granted, and based upon the written record, the Commission rules as follows:

- 1. On October 19, 2023, the Commission issued an order denying Operator's July 18, 2023, license renewal application, on the grounds that Operator's license was suspended for noncompliance with the Commission-approved compliance agreement in Docket 17-CONS-3474-CMSC.² Under K.S.A. 55-155, an applicant must demonstrate to the Commission's satisfaction that it complies with all Commission rules and regulations, orders, and enforcement agreements.³
- 2. The Docket 17-3474 compliance agreement, signed by both parties, and approved by the Commission on February 9, 2017, acknowledged that 75 wells for which Operator was responsible were out of compliance with K.A.R. 82-3-111, and provided deadlines for bringing the wells into compliance.⁴

- 3. The Docket 17-3474 compliance agreement was modified on December 30, 2019, November 17, 2020, and October 12, 2023; the present iteration addresses 46 wells, to be brought into compliance at a rate of two wells per calendar quarter, with a final deadline of June 30, 2026.⁵ The most recent modification merely added wells to the agreement, thus extending the final deadline.⁶ The compliance agreement provides that failure to meet a given compliance deadline results in license suspension until the requisite number of wells is brought into compliance.⁷
- 4. Commission records indicate Operator's license has been continuously suspended for non-compliance with the compliance agreement since January 2023.⁸ As of December 31, 2022, Operator was obligated to have brought a total of 18 of the subject wells into compliance with K.A.R. 82-3-111; as described above, the number increased by 2 wells every calendar quarter thereafter.⁹
- 5. Staff's pre-filed testimony and Commission records indicate Operator remains behind in meeting its obligations under the compliance agreement. ¹⁰ Operator does not dispute it has not met its obligations under the compliance agreement. Indeed, in its February 8, 2024, pre-filed testimony, Operator says only 22 wells were in compliance as of October 12, 2023 (24 wells were required to be in compliance by September 30, 2023). Operator says it plugged two more wells after October 12, 2023, but acknowledges those two wells are not part of the agreement as it currently stands. ¹¹
- 6. Under these facts, Operator has not demonstrated to the Commission's satisfaction that Operator complies with all Commission rules and regulations, orders, and enforcement agreements; Operator is clearly not in compliance. Thus, under K.S.A. 55-155, Operator's license renewal application must be denied.
