ORDER APPROVING SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The Commission rules as follows:

- 1. On February 6, 2025, the Commission issued a Penalty Order against Operator, assessing a \$5,000 penalty and directing Operator to comply with K.A.R. 82-3-407 at five wells. On May 20, 2025, the Commission issued another Penalty Order against Operator in a different docket, assessing a \$2,000 penalty and directing Operator to comply with K.A.R. 82-3-407 at two additional wells. Operator timely requested hearings, and the dockets were thereafter consolidated.
- 2. On September 25, 2025, Commission Staff filed a Motion to Approve Settlement Agreement. In pertinent part, Operator admits to six violations of K.A.R. 82-3-407 and shall pay a reduced penalty of \$6,000.
- 3. The law encourages settlement. The Commission finds the Settlement Agreement constitutes a fair and reasonable resolution of this proceeding. The Settlement Agreement is attached to this Order and made part of this Order.

- A. Staff's motion to approve the attached Settlement Agreement is granted; the Settlement Agreement is approved.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Settlement Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by and between the Staff of the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Staff and Commission, respectively) and Operator (collectively referred to herein as the Parties). If the Commission does not approve this Agreement by a signed order, then this Agreement shall not be binding on either party. The effective date of this Agreement will be the date the Commission enters an order approving or amending the terms of the Agreement.

I. BACKGROUND

1. On February 6, 2025, the Commission issued a Penalty Order against Operator in Docket 25-CONS-3249-CPEN (Docket 25-3249) for five violations of K.A.R. 82-3-407. The Commission found that Operator failed to conduct current and successful mechanical integrity tests (MITs) on five wells in Labette County, Kansas. The Penalty Order assessed a \$5,000 penalty and ordered Operator to perform successful MITs on the wells or plug the wells. Operator timely filed a request for hearing in the docket on February 20, 2025.



- 2. On May 20, 2025, the Commission issued a Penalty Order against Operator in Docket 25-CONS-3376-CPEN (Docket 25-3376) for two violations of K.A.R. 82-3-407. The Commission found that Operator failed to conduct current and successful MITs on two wells in Labette County, Kansas. The Penalty Order assessed a \$2,000 penalty and ordered Operator to perform successful MITs on the wells or plug the wells. Operator timely filed a request for hearing in the docket on June 18, 2025.
- 3. On June 26, 2025, the Presiding Officer issued an order consolidating Dockets 25-3249 and 25-3376.¹
- 4. Subsequent to the issuance of the Penalty Orders, Operator performed successful MITs on the seven wells at issue in the consolidated dockets.
- 5. The Parties discussed resolution of the remaining issues in the consolidated dockets, and reached a settlement in this matter. As part of the settlement, Staff agreed to reduce the terms to writing and submit the same for Commission approval. The terms of the settlement are set forth below.

II. TERMS OF THE SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

- 6. The Parties agree that the Commission has jurisdiction and authority over this matter. The Parties also agree that adoption of this Agreement is in the public interest and that the Commission should approve the terms as set forth below.
 - 7. Operator stipulates that it committed six violations of K.A.R. 82-3-407.
- 8. Confusion existed as to the location of one well, the Spradling #31 B, at issue in the Penalty Order in Docket 25-3376. As Operator performed successful MITs on all seven wells,

including the Spradling #31 B, the Parties agree to seek Commission approval to reduce the penalty amount in the consolidated dockets to \$6,000.

- 9. Operator agrees to pay a reduced penalty of \$6,000, which shall be due thirty days after this Agreement has been approved by the Commission.
- 10. Staff agrees that upon approval by the Commission, and barring default proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520, this Agreement shall constitute a final resolution of these consolidated dockets.
- 11. Failure to pay the penalty by the deadline will result in suspension of Operator's license. Operator agrees and understands that if its license is suspended for the failure to meet the above deadline, the license shall remain suspended until the penalty has been paid in full.
- 12. Operator agrees to waive its right to appeal the Commission's order approving this Agreement, any penalties assessed under this Agreement, and any suspension of Operator's license implemented by Staff due to Operator's failure to comply with this Agreement.
