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## **SUSPENSION ORDER**

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings and conclusions:

## I. Background

1. On April 26, 2017, Western Cooperative Electric Association, Inc. (Western) filed with the Commission an Application requesting approval to update its Local Access Delivery Service (LADS) tariff.<sup>1</sup> The Application was filed pursuant to Western's 34.5kV Formula-Based Rate Plan (34.5kV FBR Plan), approved in Docket No. 16-MKEE-023-TAR.<sup>2</sup>

## II. Suspension Order

2. A full investigation of the Application, which may result in a hearing, is deemed necessary and proper. Absent suspension, the Commission and its Staff are without sufficient time to fully review, consider, and analyze whether approval of the Application will result in just and reasonable rates.

3. The Commission finds and concludes suspension of the effectiveness of the Application and deferral of its effective date are required to allow sufficient time for a full investigation of this matter. The effectiveness of the Application is hereby suspended for a period of 240 days from the date it was filed, April 26, 2017, until Friday, December 22, 2017, pursuant to K.S.A. 66-117(c).<sup>3</sup> A final order may be issued before such date in accordance with the 34.5kV FBR Plan Protocols. This Suspension Order does not alter the previously-approved 34.5kV FBR Plan Protocol deadlines.<sup>4</sup>

## THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- A. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-117(c), the Application in the above-captioned docket shall be suspended, and the effective date deferred, until December 22, 2017.
- B. Parties have 15 days, plus three days if service is by mail, from the date of service of this Order to petition the Commission for reconsideration or request a hearing, as provided in K.S.A. 77-542.
- C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.
