NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Ronald A. Weber d/b/a Weber Farms Trucking178 SW 10th Ave (Weber Farms) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on July 21, 2022, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Doug Handy. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 28, 2022. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Weber Farms has been assessed a \$2,200 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$2,200, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Weber Farms to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Weber Farms must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.¹

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$2,200 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Ronald A. Weber d/b/a Weber Farms Trucking (Weber Farms or Carrier) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 329128.
- 5. Ronald A. Weber attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on June 2, 2022, on behalf of Weber Farms.
- 6. Weber Farms is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, machinery, large objects, grain, feed, hay, commodities dry bulk and farm supplies.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on July 21, 2022, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Doug Handy conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of Weber Farms. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On March 24, 2022, Weber Farms required or permitted its driver, Robert Burnett, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2007 Freightliner Truck, VIN ending in 83007, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2018 Wilson Trailer, VIN ending in 69460, GVWR 62,000 lbs., in

intrastate commerce from Nickerson, Kansas to Great Bend, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a time record for March 2022, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Weber Farms had not obtained a pre-employment alcohol/controlled substance test with a negative result on driver Robert Burnett. A negative result was not obtained until April 27, 2022. The Special Investigator discovered two (2) instances of this violation. Weber Farm's failure to require its driver to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result within 30 days of his employment and prior to requiring or permitting him to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

b. On March 3, 2022, Weber Farms required or permitted its driver, Laura R. Schmitt, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Freightliner Truck, VIN ending in 035005, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2019 Wilson Trailer, VIN 19799, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Chester, Nebraska to Great Bend, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSHP93531035, dated March 3 2022, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Weber Farms failed to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in

interstate commerce and pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. The Carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 367.60, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.

- c. During the transportation described in paragraph b., above, Weber Farms failed to be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse. The Carrier's failure to be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.711, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- d. During the transportation described in paragraph b., above, Weber Farms failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The special investigator discovered three (3) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- e. During the transportation described in paragraph b., above, Weber Farms failed to require its driver, Ms. Schmitt, to be medically examined and

certified in the preceding twenty-four (24) months. The Carrier's failure to require its drivers to be medically examined and certified in the preceding twenty-four (24) months is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.45(b)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

f. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Weber Farms was operating in intrastate commerce without first obtaining Commission authority to operate. The carrier's commercial operations of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Staff submitted a Report and Recommendation (R&R), dated August 3, 2022, attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. In its R&R, Staff made recommendation regarding the above-mentioned violations.
- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Weber Farms committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 10. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,200 for six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

- 11. Staff further recommends Weber Farms submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- 12. Finally, Staff recommends that Weber Farms submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 13. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Weber Farms because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 14. The Commission finds Weber Farms committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Ronald A. Weber d/b/a Weber Farms Trucking, of Saint John, KS is hereby assessed a \$2,200 civil penalty for six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information

explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- C. Weber Farms is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Weber Farms's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- E. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.²
- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$2,200 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$2,200 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking

Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

G. Failure to pay the \$2,200 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of Weber Farms's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.³ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

- 2. Evaluate personnel who are monitoring drivers against performance standards related to controlled-substance and alcohol regulations and company policies to ensure that they are applying standards fairly, consistently, and equitably, and are documenting evaluations.

Implement an effective process for monitoring and documenting all drivers' job functions, training, qualifications, renewal dates, disclosed medical conditions, and operational restrictions, including those of drivers on a waiver program or with impairments that may be satisfied by a Skill Performance Evaluation certificate, to ensure that assignments are covered by qualified drivers.



Penalties, Sanctions and/or the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Ronald A. Weber d/b/a Weber Farms Trucking178 SW 10th Ave (Weber Farms or Carrier) is a motor carrier possessing common operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling general freight, machinery, large objects, grain, feed, hay, commodities dry bulk and farm supplies. Weber Farms operates under USDOT 329128. On July 21, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Doug Handy conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of Weber Farms. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, resulting in a recommended penalty of \$2,200.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On July 21, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Doug Handy conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of Weber Farms. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

Violation One (1 of 6)

On March 24, 2022, Weber Farms required or permitted its driver, Robert Burnett, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2007 Freightliner Truck, VIN ending in 83007, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2018 Wilson Trailer, VIN ending in 69460, GVWR 62,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Nickerson, Kansas to Great Bend, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a time record for March 2022. At the time of this transportation, Weber Farms had not obtained a pre-employment alcohol/controlled substance test with a negative result on driver Robert

Burnett. A negative result was not obtained until April 27, 2022. The Special Investigator discovered two (2) instances of this violation. Weber Farm's failure to require its driver to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result within 30 days of his employment and prior to requiring or permitting him to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

Violation Two (2 of 6)

On March 3, 2022, Weber Farms required or permitted its driver, Laura R. Schmitt, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Freightliner Truck, VIN ending in 035005, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2019 Wilson Trailer, VIN 19799, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Chester, Nebraska to Great Bend, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSHP93531035, dated March 3 2022. At the time of this transportation, Weber Farms failed to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. The Carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 367.60, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.

Violation Three (3 of 6)

During the transportation described in Violation Two, above, Weber Farms failed to be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse. The Carrier's failure to be enrolled in the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.711, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Violation Four (4 of 6)

During the transportation described in Violation Two, above, Weber Farms failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The special investigator discovered three (3) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Violation Five (5 of 6)

During the transportation described in Violation Two, above, Weber Farms failed to require its driver, Ms. Schmitt, to be medically examined and certified in the preceding twenty-four (24) months. The Carrier's failure to require its drivers to be medically examined and certified in the preceding twenty-four (24) months is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.45(b)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Violation Six (6 of 6)

During the transportation described in Violation One, above, Weber Farms was operating in intrastate commerce without first obtaining Commission authority to operate. The carrier's commercial operations of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission

authority is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find Weber Farms committed six (6) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,200 for six (6) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Weber Farms submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Weber Farms submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
